HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3056

1 A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Management to study projections on the
2 number of low-income individuals in the state over the next 10 years and the desirability and
3 feasibility of developing and expanding asset-building ~~programs~~opportunities for those
4 individuals.

5 **WHEREAS**, North Dakota ranks first in job creation and has the lowest unemployment rate
6 in the nation for the sixth consecutive year while also having a 12 percent average annual
7 economic growth rate; and

8 **WHEREAS**, the average adjusted gross income for individuals for 2013 rose to \$71,538,
9 but poverty rates were 11.6 percent for individuals and 7 percent for families; and

10 **WHEREAS**, nearly 9 percent of North Dakota households were food insecure at some time
11 during 2013, with 3.1 percent of households having very low food security; and

12 **WHEREAS**, North Dakota's population has grown to an all time high of 739,482 residents
13 over the past decade, and although the average age has declined, the over age 65 population
14 is estimated to grow an additional 18 percent in the next decade; and

15 **WHEREAS**, 10.6 percent of North Dakotans have a disability, which may impact their level
16 of employment, and Social Security comprises the sole source or majority of income for
17 61 percent of individuals over the age of 65;

18 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF**
19 **NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:**

20 That the Legislative Management study projections on the number of low-income
21 individuals in the state over the next 10 years ~~and~~, the desirability and feasibility of developing
22 and expanding asset-building ~~programs~~opportunities for those individuals, ways to encourage
23 and improve financial literacy among the people of this state, and ways in which the private
24 sector can assist people in improving their financial stability; and
