- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 4.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 2 to beekeeping; to amend and reenact section 4.1-08-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to the submission of assessments by beekeepers; to repeal chapter 4-12.2 of the North
- 4 Dakota Century Code, relating to beekeeping; and to provide a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 4.1-08-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 4.1-08-03. Submission of assessments Civil penalty.
- Each beekeeper shall submit the assessment required by section 4.1-08-02 to the
 commissioner at the same time the beekeeper submits the license application required
 by section 4-12.2-044.1-16-02.
- If a beekeeper fails to submit the assessment as required by this section, the
 commissioner may impose a penalty equal to five percent of the amount due, plus
 interest at the rate of six percent per annum from the due date.
- SECTION 2. Chapter 4.1-16 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 17 **4.1-16-01. Definitions.**
- 18 <u>In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:</u>
- 19 <u>1. "Apiary" means the site at which one or more colonies of bees are kept.</u>
- 20 <u>"Bee" means a honey-producing insect of the genus Apis, including all stages of its</u>
 21 life.
- 3. "Beekeeper" means a person who by virtue of ownership or a lease is responsible for
 the maintenance of bees located in or placed in this state.

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1. A beekeeper shall identify each apiary for which the beekeeper is responsible by:

- 1 Affixing a three-digit identification number, assigned by the agriculture 2 commissioner, to the uppermost box of a hive that is visible upon approach to the 3 apiary's main entrance, provided each digit is at least three inches [7.62] centimeters] high, one-half inch [1.27 centimeters] wide, and weather-resistant; 4 5 and 6 <u>b.</u> Displaying the beekeeper's name and phone number in a location that is visible 7 upon approach to the apiary's main entrance, provided the numbers and letters 8 used are at least one and one-half inches [3.81 centimeters] high and 9 weather-resistant. 10 Any apiary that is not identified, as required by this section, may be subject to seizure 11 by the commissioner. 12 4.1-16-10. Unidentified apiary - Notice - Seizure. 13 If the agriculture commissioner determines that an apiary is not identified, as required 14 by section 4.1-16-09, and if after making a reasonable effort the commissioner fails to 15 identify the beekeeper responsible for the apiary, the commissioner shall publish in the 16 official newspaper of the county in which the apiary is located, a notice indicating that 17 at a time certain, all of the colonies, the hives, including their content, and all 18 beekeeping equipment present at the apiary, will be seized and sold at auction or 19 destroyed, unless the beekeeper or other responsible person appears to claim the 20 property and pay for any costs incurred by the commissioner under this section. 21 <u>2.</u> A seizure under this section may not occur until at least the sixth day after the date of 22 the published notice. 23 4.1-16-11. Confiscation and disposal. 24 Except as provided for in section 4.1-16-10, the agriculture commissioner or a law 25 enforcement officer may confiscate bees, hives, or beekeeping equipment, being transported or 26 maintained in violation of this chapter. Any bees, hives, or beekeeping equipment, confiscated 27 under this section, must be disposed of pursuant to a court order or an administrative order 28 issued by the commissioner. 29 4.1-16-12. Agriculture commissioner - Powers.
- 30 The agriculture commissioner may:

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Assist farmers in identifying beekeepers who provide pollination services; and

16	<u>1.</u>	a. If the agriculture commissioner determines that a quarantine of this state or any				
17		portion thereof may be necessary to eradicate or control the spread of disease,				
18		insects, or pests, within the apicultural industry, the commissioner shall schedule				
19		a public hearing on the matter and provide notice of the hearing by publishing its				
20		time, place, and date in the official newspaper of each county having land within				
21		the proposed quarantine area.				
22		b. If after the hearing the commissioner orders the imposition of a quarantine, the				
23		order must include the date by which or the circumstances under which the				
24		commissioner shall lift the quarantine order.				
25	<u>2.</u>	If the commissioner determines that the imposition of an emergency quarantine is				
26		necessary to eradicate or control the spread of disease, insects, or pests, within the				
27		apicultural industry, the commissioner may impose such an order for a period not				
28		exceeding fourteen days. Within the fourteen-day period, the commissioner shall hold				
29		a public hearing as provided for in subsection 1 and determine whether a quarantine				
30		order under subsection 1 should be imposed.				

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- Following the establishment of a quarantine, the movement of any colonies, hives, or
 other beekeeping equipment, described in the quarantine order, is subject to the order.
- 3 <u>4.</u> For purposes of this section, "insects" include Africanized honeybees.
- 4 <u>4.1-16-16. Service of process.</u>
- 5 If neither the beekeeper nor the beekeeper's registered agent can be located for the
- 6 purpose of serving process, in connection with a violation of this chapter or rules adopted to
- 7 implement this chapter, the agriculture commissioner becomes the statutory agent for service of
- 8 process and any service upon the commissioner is deemed to be complete.
- 9 **4.1-16-17. Penalties.**
- 10 <u>1. A person violating this chapter is guilty of a class A misdemeanor.</u>
- 11 2. In addition to criminal sanctions that may be imposed pursuant to subsection 1, a
- 12 <u>person found to have violated this chapter or rules adopted under this chapter is</u>
- subject to a civil penalty not to exceed five thousand dollars per violation. The civil
- penalty may be adjudicated by a court or by the agriculture commissioner through an
- administrative hearing pursuant to chapter 28-32.
- 16 <u>3. The commissioner may maintain a civil action in the name of the state against any</u>
- 17 <u>person violating this chapter.</u>
- 18 <u>4.</u> The violation of any condition of licensure, as set forth in section 4.1-16-02, is deemed
- 19 <u>to be a violation of this chapter.</u>
- 20 <u>4.1-16-18. Beekeeping Agricultural practice.</u>
- 21 <u>Beekeeping is deemed to be an agricultural practice.</u>
- **SECTION 3. REPEAL.** Chapter 4-12.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
