- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to an enhanced operator's license.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 39-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
and enacted as follows:

## 6 Enhanced operator's license - Fee.

7 For an additional fee of sixty-five dollars, the director shall issue enhanced features upon

8 request on any operator's license, permit, or nondriver photo identification. These enhanced

9 <u>features must allow for approval by the secretary of the United States department of homeland</u>

10 security for the purpose of entering the United States. The features must denote citizenship and

11 identity and contain technology and security features approved by the secretary of the United

12 <u>States department of homeland security. The department may not issue a license, permit, or</u>

13 identification with enhanced features to an individual who is under sixteen years of age, is not a

14 resident of this state, or is not a citizen of the United States. The applicant for enhanced

15 <u>features must present to the department satisfactory proof of the applicant's full legal name</u>,

16 <u>United States citizenship, identity, date of birth, social security number, residence address, and</u>

17 photographic identity document. The operator's license, permit, or identification with enhanced

18 <u>features must include reasonable security measures to prevent counterfeiting and to protect</u>

19 against unauthorized disclosure of personal information regarding an applicant which is

20 contained in the license, permit, or identification. The enhanced features may include radio

21 <u>frequency identification technology that is limited to a randomly assigned number, which must</u>

22 <u>be encrypted if agreed to by the United States department of homeland security and which does</u>

23 not include biometric data or any information other than the citizenship status of the applicant.

24 An applicant must sign an acknowledgment of understanding of the radio frequency\_

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- 1 identification technology and its use for the sole purpose of verifying United States citizenship
- 2 <u>before being issued an enhanced license, permit, or identification.</u>
