- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the demonstration of proficiency in civics as a condition of high school
- 3 graduation.

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4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15.1-21 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
6 and enacted as follows:

7 High school graduation requirement - Civics test.

- For purposes of this section, "civics test" means the one hundred questions that, as of
 January 1, 2015, officers of the United States citizenship and immigration services use
- 10 <u>as the basis for selecting the questions posed to applicants for naturalization, in order</u>
- 11 that the applicants can demonstrate a knowledge and understanding of the
- 12 <u>fundamentals of United States history and the principles and form of United States</u>
- 13 government, as required by 8 U.S.C. 1423.
- 142. a.If a student is enrolled in the twelfth grade during the 2016-17 school year, that15student must, as a condition of receiving a high school diploma, correctly answer16at least sixty percent of the guestions on the civics test.
- 17 <u>b.</u> Before any other student may be awarded a high school diploma, that student
 18 <u>must correctly answer at least seventy percent of the questions on the civics test.</u>
- 19 <u>3.</u> <u>a.</u> <u>The requirement set forth in this section applies to each student who is:</u>
 - (1) Enrolled in a public school district;
 - (2) Enrolled in a nonpublic school;
 - (3) Enrolled in the center for distance education;
- 23 (4) <u>Receiving home education if the student is to be issued a high school</u>
 24 <u>diploma in accordance with subsection 1 of section 15.1-23-17; or</u>

1		(5) Pursuing a general equivalency diploma.
2		b. A student may be exempted from the requirement of this section by the
3		provisions of the student's individualized education program plan.
4	<u>4.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall, upon request, provide to the person
5		administering the civics test the correct answer or acceptable answers to each
6		question.
7	<u>5.</u>	A student may take the test, in whole or in part, at any time after enrolling in grade
8		seven and may repeat the test, or any portion thereof, as often as necessary to
9		demonstrate proficiency.
10	<u>6.</u>	Neither the superintendent of public instruction nor a school district may impose or
11		collect any fees or charges in connection with this section.
12	<u>7.</u>	This section is applicable to any student who graduates from high school during or
13		after the 2016-17 school year.
