2	Dakota Century Code, relating to early childhood education provider grants; to amend and						
3	reenact section 15.1-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to early childhood						
4	education program approval; to provide an appropriation; and to provide an effective date.

6	SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-37-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is						
7	amended and reenacted as follows:						
8	15.1-37-01. Early childhood education program - Approval.						
9	1.	Any	person or school district operating an early childhood education program may				
10		request approval of the program from the superintendent of public instruction. The					
11		superintendent shall approve an early childhood education program if the program:					
12		a.	Is taught by individuals who are licensed to teach in early childhood education by				
13			the education standards and practices board or approved to teach in early				
14			childhood education by the education standards and practices board;				
15		b.	Follows a developmentally appropriate curriculumeducational standards				
16			approved by the superintendent of public instruction;				
17		C.	Is in compliance with all municipal and state health, fire, and safety requirements;

19		d.	Limits its enrollment to children who have reached the age of four before August				
20			first in the year of enrollment.				
21	2.	2. In determining the state aid payments to which a school district is entitled, the

1	<b>SECTION 2.</b> A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created							
2	and enacted as follows:

The 12 department of commerce shall standardize the notification required by this 13 subdivision. 14 If a provider fails to meet the notification requirements of this subsection, the <u>b.</u> 15 department of commerce shall reduce the amount of the provider's next grant 16 payment by fifty percent. If a provider fails to meet the notification requirements 17 of this section a second time, the department of commerce shall determine that 18 the provider is ineligible to participate in the grant program for a period of one 19 year. 20 SECTION 4. A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 21 and enacted as follows: 22 Acceptance of children into program - Requirements - Limitations. 23 If a provider is unable to accommodate all children seeking placement in the provider's 24 program, the provider shall accept children in accordance with a chronologically-based 25 application process or a lottery-based application process, under which children of all 26 learning abilities are equally eligible. 27 The number of children accepted into a program may be limited by considerations 28 regarding space, safety, and availability of personnel.

**SECTION 5.** A new section to chapter 15.1-37 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

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## 1 <u>Data collection - Requirements.</u>

The superintendent of public instruction, with the advice and consent of the department of commerce, shall implement a uniform system for the accounting, budgeting, and reporting of data by any early childhood education provider to whom or to which grants are distributed in accordance with section 3 of this Act. Grants may be withheld or forfeited, in whole or in part, if information required in accordance with this section is not submitted at the time or in the manner requested by the superintendent.

## SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION.

- There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$6,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of commerce for the purpose of providing early childhood education grants, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
- 2. If the amount appropriated in this section is insufficient to provide grants to all eligible providers, the department of commerce shall award the grants on a chronological basis in accordance with the date on which a completed application is received.
- SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 3 and 4through 5 of this Act become effective on July 1, 2016.
