- A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 23-34-01 of the North Dakota Century Code,
 relating to medical peer review records.
 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:
- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-34-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 5 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 **23-34-01. Definitions.**
- 7 As used in this chapter:
- 8 1. "Health care organization" means:
- 9 a. A hospital;
- b. A hospital medical staff;
- 11 c. A clinic;
- d. A long-term or extended care facility;
- e. An ambulatory surgery center;
- f. An emergency medical services unit;
- 15 g. A physician;
- h. A group of physicians operating a clinic or outpatient care facility;
- i. A pharmacist;
- 18 <u>i. A pharmacy:</u>
- 4. An association or organization, whether domestic or foreign, of medical institutions or medical professionals;
- 21 <u>j.l.</u> A nonprofit corporation, whether domestic or foreign, that owns, operates, or is established by any entity set forth in subdivisions a through i;
- 23 k.m. Any combination of entities set forth in subdivisions a through j; or
- 24 <u>I.n.</u> Any federally designated state peer review organization.

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- d. Provide to other affiliated or nonaffiliated peer review organizations information
 that is originally generated within the peer review organization for the purposes of
 professional peer review;
 e. Identify or analyze trends in medical error, using among other things a
 standardized incident reporting system; and
- f. Provide quality assurance.
