- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to creation of a health information hub office in the information
- 3 technology department and a health information hub executive committee; to provide a
- 4 continuing appropriation; and to provide an appropriation.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-59 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 8 Health information hub office - Health information hub executive committee -
- 9 Continuing appropriation.

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- 1. The health information hub office is created in the information technology department. The health information hub executive committee shall make recommendations to the health information hub office for implementing a statewide health information hub that is consistent with emerging national standards for the purpose of facilitating access to and analyzing data to improve health care quality, patient safety, and the overall efficiency of health care and public health services.
 - The health information hub executive committee consists of the state health officer or <u>2.</u> the state health officer's designee; the executive director of the department of human services or the executive director's designee; the university system chancellor or the chancellor's designee; the dean of the university of North Dakota school of medicine and health sciences or the dean's designee; the director of the Indian affairs commission or the director's designee; the health information technology director or the director's designee; the chairman of the house human services standing committee and the chairman of the senate human services standing committee or if either or both are unwilling or unable to serve, the chairman of the legislative

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- 1 management shall appoint a replacement who is a member of the same legislative 2 chamber as the individual being replaced plus one additional member from each 3 chamber; a member representing the health council; and individuals appointed by the 4 governor to represent a broad range of public and private health information 5 technology stakeholders. Committee members appointed by the governor serve at the 6 pleasure of the governor. A member of the committee who is not an ex officio member, 7 designee of an ex officio member, state employee, or legislator is entitled to mileage 8 and expenses as provided by law for state officers and employees, to be paid by the 9 health information hub office. A committee member who is an ex officio member, 10 designee of an ex officio member, state employee, or legislator is entitled to receive 11 that member's regular salary and is entitled to receive mileage and expenses, to be 12 paid by the employing agency. 13 The health information hub executive committee shall collaborate with stakeholders to 3.
 - 3. The health information hub executive committee shall collaborate with stakeholders to develop, implement, and operate a statewide health information hub. The committee shall:
 - a. Create a strategic and operational plan;
 - b. Design, develop, and implement a process to identify, facilitate access to,
 analyze, and distribute health information;
 - c. Ensure privacy and security of protected health information; and
 - d. Ensure compliance with state and federal laws and regulations regarding health information.
 - 4. The health information hub executive committee shall set policy relating to and shall recommend to the department and the department shall adopt rules relating to the access to and the collection, storage, and sharing of information and the systems necessary to perform those functions, subject to applicable federal and state privacy laws and interagency agreements and restrictions relating to confidential information required to conform to applicable federal and state privacy laws. The health information hub executive committee shall provide operational oversight for information sharing activities, make recommendations for, and provide oversight of information sharing budgets. The committee may authorize studies to benefit and improve the overall efficiency of health care and public health services.

- The health information hub office, in collaboration with the health information hub
 executive committee, may solicit and receive moneys from public and private sources
 and these funds are appropriated on a continuing basis for the design, development,
 implementation, and operation of the health information hub.
 - 6. The health information hub office shall provide staffing and support services for the committee and may contract with and employ personnel necessary for the administration of this section.
 - 7. Any individually identifiable health information, as defined under the federal Health
 Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 [Pub. L. 104-191], submitted to,
 stored in, or transmitted by the health information hub under this chapter and any such
 data or record in the possession of the health information hub office is confidential.

 Any other information relating to patients, individuals, or individually identifiable
 demographic information contained in the data hub or in the possession of the health
 information hub office is an exempt record.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,900,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the information technology department to defray the costs of the health information hub office and the health information hub executive committee, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.
