- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 39-04 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to patriotic number plates; to amend and reenact subdivision j of
- 3 subsection 2 of section 39-04-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to disabled veteran
- 4 motor vehicle registration; and to provide a contingent effective date.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 39-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
7 and enacted as follows:

8	<u>Pat</u>	Patriotic number plates.		
9	<u>1.</u>	The director shall issue patriotic plates under this section upon receiving:		
10		<u>a.</u>	Payment of all other fees required under this chapter for registration of a motor	
11			vehicle;	
12		<u>b.</u>	Payment of an initial fee of twenty-five dollars of which twenty dollars is deposited	
13			in the highway tax distribution fund and five dollars is deposited in the veterans'	
14			postwar trust fund; and	
15		<u>C.</u>	Payment of an annual surcharge of ten dollars which is deposited in the veterans'	
16			postwar trust fund.	
17	<u>2.</u>	The department shall collect the initial fees and the annual surcharges under this		
18		<u>sec</u>	tion. Deposits in the postwar trust fund under this section must be added to the	
19		prin	cipal of the fund. Investment of the fund is the responsibility of the state treasurer	
20		<u>whc</u>	shall have full authority to invest the fund only in the same manner as the state	
21		inve	estment board is authorized to make investments.	
22	<u>3.</u>	Pati	riotic plates must include a flag of the United States decal plate, bald eagle decal	
23		<u>plat</u>	e, or boony stomper decal plate.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subdivision j of subsection 2 of section 39-04-18 of the North
 Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

3 j. Motor vehicles not exceeding twenty-six thousand pounds [11793.40 kilograms] registered gross weight owned and operated by a disabled veteran under the 4 5 provisions of Public Law 79-663 [38 U.S.C. 3901], a disabled veteran who has a 6 one hundred percent service-connected disability as determined by the 7 department of veterans' affairs, or a disabled veteran who has an extra-schedular 8 rating to include individual unemployability that brings the veteran's total disability 9 rating to one hundred percent as determined by the department of veterans' 10 affairs is entitled to display <u>either</u> a distinctive license plate or a standard plate 11 that does not identify the veteran as a veteran or disabled veteran which is 12 issued by the department. This exemption applies to no more than two such 13 motor vehicles owned by a disabled veteran at any one time. A surviving spouse 14 of a disabled veteran who has not remarried and who is receiving department of 15 veterans' affairs dependency and indemnity compensation retains the exemption 16 of the deceased veteran who qualified under this subdivision for one vehicle. 17 SECTION 3. CONTINGENT EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act is effective on the date the 18 director of the department of transportation certifies to the secretary of state that the new motor 19 vehicle registration software for the department is installed and functioning and not earlier than 20 January 1, 2016.
