- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 39-31-03 and sections
- 2 39-31-04, 39-31-06, 39-31-11, 39-31-12, 39-31-13, and 39-31-14 of the North Dakota Century
- 3 Code, relating to common household goods carriers; and to repeal sections 39-31-05, 39-31-07,
- 4 39-31-08, 39-31-09, and 39-31-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to common
- 5 household goods carriers.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 7 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 39-31-03 of the North Dakota Century
- 8 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- The carrier has obtained the certificate or a household goods carrier permit required by
 this chapter; and
- 11 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-31-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 12 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 13 **39-31-04.** Regulation of common household goods carriers by the department.
- 14 The department may regulate common motor carriers of household goods except for
- 15 transportation provided wholly within a city in this state or within a distance beyond the
- 16 corporate limits of a city as determined by the department and:
- 17 1. May require the filing of tariffs and schedules; and
- 18 2. Shall supervise the relations between common household goods carriers and the
- 19 public to comply with the provisions of this chapter.
- 20 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 39-31-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is

21 amended and reenacted as follows:

1	39-31-06. Household goods carrier - Certificate of public convenience
2	TemporaryHousehold goods carrier permit - Application.
3	NoA common household goods carrier may not operate within this state without having
4	obtained from the department a certificate of public convenience and necessityhousehold goods
5	carrier permit. An application must be upon the form prescribed by the department. The
6	application must contain a financial statementproof of registration with the secretary of state,
7	and either proof of workers compensation insurance coverage or an affidavit of nonemployment.
8	The department shall deny issuing a household goods carrier permit if the applicant submits an
9	incomplete application.
10	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 39-31-11 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	amended and reenacted as follows:
12	39-31-11. Certificates - Permits - Duration - Transfer.
13	Certificates and Household goods carrier permits issued to carriers by the department
14	under this chapter remain in force subject to this chapter. Those certificates or permits are
15	transferable only upon approval by the department, after notice to and opportunity for comment-
16	by all interested parties.
17	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 39-31-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is
18	amended and reenacted as follows:
19	39-31-12. Fees - Household goods carrier.
20	Every household goods carrier operating in this state, when applying for a certificate of
21	public convenience and necessity orhousehold goods carrier permit, shall pay a fee of one
22	hundred dollars. The nonrefundable fee for an application for transfer of a certificate of public-
23	convenience and necessityhousehold goods carrier permit is one hundred dollars. The annual
24	filling fee for maintaining a household goods carrier permit is thirty-five dollars.
25	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 39-31-13 of the North Dakota Century Code is
26	amended and reenacted as follows:
27	39-31-13. Regulations furnished to holder of certificate or permit.
28	The department shall mail each holder of a certificate or household goods carrier permit
29	under this chapter the rules the department adopts to implement this chapter.
30	SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 39-31-14 of the North Dakota Century Code is
31	amended and reenacted as follows:

1 **39-31-14**. Insurance required of carrier - Liability of insurer.

2 The department, before granting a certificatehousehold goods carrier permit to any common 3 motor carrier, shall require the owner or operator to procure public liability insurance. The 4 conditions of the liability insurance must guarantee the payment of any loss or damage to 5 property or on account of the death or injury to any person resulting from the negligence of the 6 carrier. The carrier shall file the insurance policy with the department and the policy must be 7 kept in full force. The carrier must provide proof the policy is in full effect annually in a form 8 prescribed by the department. Upon failure of a carrier to maintain insurance required by this 9 section, the department shall cancel the certificate permit. A certificate permit of any company 10 authorized to write liability or property damage insurance in the state, in a form approved by the 11 department and certifying that there is in effect a liability insurance policy required by this 12 section, may be filed instead of the policy. 13 SECTION 8. REPEAL. Sections 39-31-05, 39-31-07, 39-31-08, 39-31-09, and 39-31-10 of

14 the North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
