- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 4-01 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the environmental impact litigation fund; to provide for a continuing
- 3 appropriation; and to provide for a transfer and appropriation.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 4-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is created 6 and enacted as follows: 7 **Environmental impact litigation advisory committee.** 8 1. The environmental impact litigation advisory committee consists of: 9 The commissioner of agriculture, who shall serve as the chairman; a. 10 The governor or the governor's designee; b. 11 The attorney general; <u>C.</u> 12 -The majority leader of the house of representatives, or the leader's designee; d. 13 <u>e.d.</u> The majority leader of the senate, or the leader's designee; 14 e. One individual appointed by the North Dakota stockmen's association 15 f. One individual appointed by the North Dakota corn utilization council growers 16 association; 17 One individual appointed by the North Dakota soybean council growers g. 18 association; 19 <u>h.</u> One individual appointed by the North Dakota wheat commission; 20 One individual appointed by the North Dakota grain growers association; <u>i.</u> 21 One individual appointed by the lignite energy council; and Ĺ. 22 One individual appointed by the North Dakota petroleum council. <u>k.</u>

6	<u>1.</u>	The environmental impact litigation fund consists of:		
7		<u>a.</u>	Any moneys appropriated or transferred for the purposes set forth in this section;

9		<u>b.</u>	Any gifts, grants, and donations forwarded to the agriculture commissioner for the	
10			purposes of this section.	
11	<u>2.</u>	All moneys in the environmental impact litigation fund are appropriated on a continuing		
12	I	<u>bas</u>	sis to the agriculture commissioner for any expenses incurred in the consideration	
13		of, the pursuit of, or the participation in administrative or judicial matters, including		
14		litigation pertaining to:		
15		<u>a.</u>	Exempt and nonexempt activities governed by section 404 of the Clean Water	
16			Act [33 U.S.C. 1344] or by regulations implementing section 404 of the Clean	
17			Water Act; and	
18		<u>b.</u>	Any potential detriment to the state or to industries operating within the state as a	
19			result of governmental interpretations pertaining to the Endangered Species Act	
20			of 1973 [16 U.S.C. 1531, et seq.] or any regulations implementing the	
21			Endangered Species Act.	
22	<u>3.</u>	<u>For</u>	purposes of this section, "expenses" include consulting fees, research costs,	
23		<u>exp</u>	pert witnesses, attorney fees, and travel costs.	
24	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION AND TRANSFER - ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT			
25	LITIGAT	ΓΙΟΝ	FUND. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the	
26	state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000,000, or so much of the sum as			
27	may be necessary, which sum the office of management and budget shall transfer to the			
28	environmental impact litigation fund, for the purpose of funding environmental impact litigation			
29	and related activities, during the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.			
30	The office of management and budget shall transfer funds under this section at the time and in			
31	the amount directed by the agriculture commissioner.
