- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide for the creation of a task force on substance exposed newborns;
- 2 and to provide for a report to the legislative management.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

## 4 SECTION 1. TASK FORCE ON SUBSTANCE EXPOSED NEWBORNS - MEMBERSHIP -

5 DUTIES - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.

- 6 1. The task force on substance exposed newborns is created for the purpose of
- 7 researching the impact of substance abuse and neonatal withdrawal syndrome,
- 8 evaluating effective strategies for treatment and prevention, and providing policy
  9 recommendations.
- 10 2. The task force consists of the following members:
- 11 a. The attorney general, or the attorney general's designee;
- b. The executive director of the department of human services, or the executive
  director's designee;
- 14 c. A member of the senate, appointed by the legislative management;
- 15 d. A member of the house of representatives, appointed by the legislative
  16 management;
- e. A state's attorney, appointed by the North Dakota association of counties;
- 18 f. A representative of the North Dakota medical association;
- 19 g. A representative of an addiction and recovery association, appointed by the
  20 attorney general;
- 21 h. A representative of the North Dakota chapter of the march of dimes;
- i. A representative of prevent child abuse North Dakota;
- j. The executive director of the Indian affairs commission, or the executive director's designee;

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1		k.	Three enrolled tribal members representing tribes located in the state, appointed
2			by the Indian affairs commission;
3		I.	A representative of the department of human services with expertise in early
4			intervention and Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act,
5			appointed by the executive director of the department of human services;
6		m.	A representative of law enforcement, appointed by the attorney general;
7		n.	A representative of the foster care community, appointed by the executive
8			director of the department of human services;
9		0.	A county social services director, appointed by the executive director of the
10			department of human services;
11		p.	A neonatologist, appointed by the North Dakota academy of pediatrics; and
12		q.	A neonatal intensive care unit nurse, appointed by the state board of nursing.
13	3.	The	attorney general, or the attorney general's designee, shall serve as the chairman
14		of th	e task force. The task force shall meet at least quarterly. Additional meetings may
15		be h	eld at the discretion of the chairman.
16	4.	The	task force may request appropriate staff services from the department of human
17		serv	ices.
18	5.	The	members of the task force who are not state employees or members of the
19		legis	slative assembly are entitled to mileage and expenses as provided by law for state
20		offic	ers and employees. Unless otherwise provided in this subsection, the expenses of
21		appo	pinted members are to be paid by the department of human services. A state
22		emp	loyee who is a member of the task force is entitled to receive that employee's
23		regu	lar salary and is entitled to mileage and expenses, to be paid by the employing
24		ager	ncy. The members of the task force who are members of the legislative assembly
25		are e	entitled to compensation from the legislative council for attendance at task force
26		mee	tings at the rate provided for members of the legislative assembly for attendance
27		at in	terim committee meetings and are entitled to reimbursement for expenses
28		incu	rred in attending the meetings in the amounts provided by law for other state
29		offic	ers.
30	6.	The	task force shall:

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1		a.	Collect and organize data concerning the nature and extent of neonatal
2			withdrawal syndrome from substance abuse in this state;
3		b.	Collect and organize data concerning the costs associated with treating
4			expectant mothers and newborns suffering from withdrawal substance abuse;
5		C.	Identify available federal, state, and local programs that provide services to
6			mothers who abuse drugs or alcohol and newborns who have neonatal
7			withdrawal syndrome and evaluate those programs and services to determine if
8			gaps in programs or ineffective policies exist; and
9		d.	Evaluate methods to increase public awareness of the dangers associated with
10			substance abuse, particularly to women, expectant mothers, and newborns.
11	7.	Bef	ore July 1, 2016, the task force shall report its findings and recommendations and
12		any	proposed legislation necessary to implement the recommendations to the
13		legi	slative management.
