1 A BILL for an Act providing an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the legislative branch

2 of state government; to provide for applications, transfers, and cancellation of unexpended

3 appropriations; to amend and reenact sections 54-03-20, 54-35-06, and 54-35-10 of the North

4 Dakota Century Code, relating to legislative compensation and expenditures; to provide for a

5 <u>legislative management study;</u> to provide an effective date; and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from the insurance
regulatory trust fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the legislative branch of state government
for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that branch, for the fiscal period beginning with the
effective date of this Act and ending June 30, 2017, as follows:

2017-19 biennium. The legislative council shall report to the appropriations committees of the
sixty-fifth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning
July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.

13 SECTION 4. TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-05, the director of the office of 14 management and budget and the state treasurer shall make transfers of funds between line 15 items of appropriations for the legislative management and legislative council as may be 16 requested by the chairman of the legislative management or the director of the legislative 17 council upon the finding by the chairman or the director that the nature of studies and duties 18 assigned to the legislative management or legislative council requires the transfers in properly 19 carrying on the legislative management's and legislative council's functions and duties. The 20 director of the office of management and budget and the state treasurer shall similarly make 21 transfers of funds between the line items for the sixty-fourth and sixty-fifth legislative 22 assemblies, upon request by the chairman of the legislative management or the director of the 23 legislative council upon the finding by the chairman or director that the transfers are required for 24 the legislative assembly to carry on its functions and duties. 25 SECTION 5. APPLICATION, TRANSFER AUTHORITY, AND CANCELLATION OF 26 **UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATIONS.** Sections 54-16-04 and 54-44.1-11 do not apply to 27 chapter 32 of the 2013 Session Laws. The director of the office of management and budget and 28 the state treasurer shall make transfers of funds between the line items and the agencies of the

29 legislative branch within section 1 of that chapter as requested by the chairman of the legislative

- 30 management or the director of the legislative council. The office of management and budget
- 31 shall cancel unexpended appropriations for the legislative assembly and legislative council

- 1 enacted prior to the 2013-15 biennium as directed by the chairman of the legislative
- 2 management or the director of the legislative council.
- 3 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 54-03-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 4 amended and reenacted as follows:

- Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive as compensation for
 services the sum of one hundred sixty-sevenseventy-two dollars for each calendar day
 during any organizational, special, or regular legislative session and for each day that
 member attends a meeting of a legislative committee between the organizational
 session and the regular session as authorized by legislative rule.
- 12 2. а. Each member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive reimbursement for 13 lodging, which may not exceed per calendar month the amount established under 14 this subdivision by the director of the office of management and budget for 15 lodging in state and which may not exceed the rate provided in section 44-08-04 16 for each calendar day during the period of any organizational, special, or regular 17 session. On August first of each even-numbered year, the director of the office of 18 management and budget shall set the maximum monthly reimbursement for the 19 subsequent two-year period at an amount equal to thirty times seventy percent of 20 the daily lodging reimbursement in effect on that date as provided under 21 subdivision d of subsection 2 of section 44-08-04.
- 22 b. Notwithstanding subdivision a:
 - (1) A member of the legislative assembly may elect to be reimbursed for less than the amount to which the legislator is entitled under this subsection by claiming the lesser amount on a voucher submitted with the receipt required by section 44-08-04.
- 27 (2) The legislative management may establish guidelines that may result in a
 28 reduced maximum reimbursement for a single dwelling in which two or more
 29 legislators share lodging and the total rent for that dwelling exceeds the
 30 amount to which a legislator is entitled under subdivision a.

Members of the legislative assembly who receive reimbursement for lodging are 2 also entitled to reimbursement for travel for not to exceed one round trip taken 3 during any calendar week, or portion of a week, the legislative assembly is in 4 session, between their residences and the place of meeting of the legislative 5 assembly, at the rate provided for state employees with the additional limitation 6 that reimbursement for travel by common carrier may be only at the cost of coach 7 fare and may not exceed one and one-half times the amount the member would 8 be entitled to receive as mileage reimbursement for travel by motor vehicle. 9 b. A member of the legislative assembly who does not receive reimbursement for 10 lodging and whose place of residence in the legislative district that the member 11 represents is not within the city of Bismarck is entitled to reimbursement at the
- rate provided for state employees for necessary travel for not to exceed one
 round trip taken per day between the residence and the place of meeting of the
 legislative assembly when it is in session and may receive reimbursement for
 lodging at the place of meeting of the legislative assembly as provided in section
 44-08-04 for each calendar day for which round trip travel reimbursement is not
 claimed, provided that the total reimbursement may not exceed the maximum
 monthly reimbursement allowed under subdivision a of subsection 2.
- The amount to which each legislator is entitled must be paid following the
 organizational session in December and following each month during a regular or
 special session.
- If during a special session, the legislative assembly adjourns for more than three days,
 a member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive compensation during those
 days only while in attendance at a standing committee if the legislator is a member of
 that committee, a majority or minority leader, or a legislator who is not on that
 committee but who has the approval of a majority or minority leader to attend.
- A day, or portion of a day, spent in traveling to or returning from an organizational,
 special, or regular session or a legislative committee meeting must be included as a
 calendar day during a legislative session or as a day of a legislative committee
 meeting for the purposes of this section.

1	7.	a. In addition, each member is entitled to receive during the term for which the
2		member was elected, as compensation for the execution of public duties during
3		the biennium, the sum of four hundred sixty-seveneighty-one dollars a month,
4		paid monthly.
5		b. If a member dies or resigns from office during the member's term, the member
6		may be paid only the allowances provided for in this section for the period for
7		which the member was actually a member.
8		c. The majority and minority leaders of the house and senate and the chairman of
9		the legislative management, if the chairman is not a majority or minority leader,
10		are each entitled to receive as compensation, in addition to any other
11		compensation or expense reimbursement provided by law, the sum of three
12		hundred thirty-fiveforty-five dollars per month during the biennium for their
13		execution of public duties.

13	The	legislative management shall select a chairman and a vice chairman from its own
14	member	s and may prescribe its own rules of procedure. The legislative management may
15	appoint	a secretary who need not be a member, and shall appoint a director who must be in
16	charge o	of the legislative council and who must be paid such salary as the legislative
17	manage	ment may determine. The director may employ such persons and obtain the assistance
18	of such	research agencies as determined necessary. The director may use available funds for
19	<u>salary a</u>	djustments to assist with staff recruitment, retention, and recognition of exceptional
20	performa	ance. The legislative management and the legislative council may accept and use any
21	funds m	ade available through the terms of any agreement made with any agency whatsoever
22	for the a	ccomplishment of the purpose of this chapter. Expenditures of funds made available by
23	legislativ	e appropriation must be made in accordance with rules or motions duly approved by
24	the legis	lative management.
25	SEC	TION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
26	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
27	54-3	5-10. Compensation of members and leadership.
28	1.	The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
29		the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
30		attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
31		of one hundred sixty-sevenseventy-two dollars per day and must also be paid for

1		expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official
2		duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
3	2.	In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
4		legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
5		spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
6		and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
7		receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
8		management or of the committee which the person chairs.
9	SEC	TION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
10	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
11	54-3	5-10. Compensation of members and leadership.
12	1.	The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
13		the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
14		attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
15		of one hundred seventy-twoseventy-seven dollars per day and must also be paid for
16		expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official
17		duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
18	2.	In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
19		legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
20		spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
21		and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
22		receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
23		management or of the committee which the person chairs.
24	SEC	TION 11. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - FINANCING STATE
25	CONST	RUCTION PROJECTS. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall
26	conside	r studying the use of bonding to finance state building, road, and water construction
27	projects	. If conducted, the study must include consideration of the effect that financing state
28	construc	tion projects with existing oil revenue has had on both the construction industry and the
29	oil and g	as industry. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations,
30	together	with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth
31	legislativ	/e assembly.

- 3 **SECTION 13. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
