4 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 5 of section 43-05-01 of the North Dakota Century

- 5 Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 "Podiatric medicine" means the profession of the health services concerned with the 5. 7 diagnosis and treatment of conditions affecting the human foot and ankle including 8 local manifestations of systemic conditions by all appropriate systems and means and 9 includes the prescribing or administering of drugs or medications necessary or helpful 10 to that profession.: 11 The medical and surgical treatment and diagnosis of ailments of the human foot, <u>a.</u> 12 ankle, and other related soft tissue structures below the tibial tuberosity that 13 govern the functions of the foot and ankle. Podiatrists may treat and diagnose 14 conditions of the foot and ankle by any medically accepted system or method 15 necessary; 16 The amputation of the toes, parts of the foot, or foot in its entirety, indicated as b. 17 medically necessary; 18 The use of such preparations, medicines, and drugs as may be necessary for the <u>C.</u> 19 treatment of such ailments; 20 d. The performance of history and physical examinations upon admitting patients to 21 facilities where they are recognized with requisite credentials and privileges; 22 That podiatrists may function as assistant surgeons in nonpodiatric procedures; <u>e</u>. 23 and

1	<u>f.</u>	That podiatric medical residents working under a temporary permit may fully
2		participate in rotations and assist and perform treatments and diagnosis beyond
3		the foot and ankle, under appropriate supervision within an approved residency
4		program as part of their medical surgical training.
