- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state department
- 2 of health; and to amend and reenact section 43-29.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 3 relating to selection criteria for the veterinarian loan repayment program: to provide a statement
- 4 of legislative intent; and to provide for legislative management studies.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state department of health, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, as follows:

30 2017-19 biennium. The state department of health shall report to the appropriations committees

1	of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium		
2	beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.		
3	SECTION 3. ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND PROTECTION FUND. The estimated		
4	income line item included in section 1 of this Act includes \$250,000, or so much of the sum as		
5	may be necessary, to be made available to the state department of health from the environment		
6	and rangeland protection fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30,		
7	2017. This amount includes \$50,000 for a grant to the North Dakota stockmen's association		
8	environmental services program.		
9	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-29.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
10	amended and reenacted as follows:		
11	43-29.1-03. Veterinarian selection criteria - Eligibility for loan repayment.		
12	1.	In e	stablishing the criteria regarding eligibility for loan repayment funds under this
13		cha	pter, the state health council shall consider the applicant's:
14		a.	Training in food animal veterinary medicine, ability, willingness to engage in food
15			animal veterinary medicine, and the extent to which such services are needed in
16			a selected community;
17		b.	Commitment to serve in a community that is in need of a veterinarian;
18		C.	Compatibility with a selected community;
19		d.	Date of availability for service to the selected community; and
20		e.	Competence and professional conduct.
21	2.	An a	applicant selected to receive loan repayment funds under this chapter must:
22		a.	Have Must have graduated from an accredited college of veterinary medicine; and
23		b.	BeMust be licensed to practice veterinary medicine in this state; and
24		<u>C.</u>	Must be employed full-time in the private practice of veterinary medicine.
25	3.	A se	elected applicant shall contract to provide full-time veterinary medicine services for
26		two	, three, or four years in one or more selected communities.
27	SEC	CTIOI	N 5. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - DIVISION OF FOOD AND LODGING LICENSE
28	FEES. I	t is th	e intent of the sixty-fourth legislative assembly that the division of food and lodging
29	of the state department of health, based on risk and pursuant to audit recommendations, adjust		
30	division	of foo	od and lodging license fees to generate up to \$150,000 of additional special fund
31	revenue. The state department of health shall use the additional special fund revenue as		

1 appropriated in section 1 of this Act to fund a portion of the costs related to additional full-time 2 equivalent inspection positions in the division of food and lodging. 3 SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - UNIVERSITY OF NORTH DAKOTA 4 FORENSIC PATHOLOGY CENTER. During the 2015-16 interim, the legislative management 5 shall consider studying the feasibility and desirability of the university of North Dakota acquiring 6 the building that houses the university of North Dakota forensic pathology center. The legislative 7 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation 8 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly. 9 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - WASTE MANAGEMENT. During the 10 2015-16 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying onsite sewage disposal in 11 the state, including areas of the state lacking environmental programs to address onsite sewage 12 disposal, lack of uniform standards for disposal, regulation authority, and the impact of onsite 13 sewage disposal and waste management on industry and the public. The legislative 14 management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any legislation 15 required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-fifth legislative assembly.
