- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state department
- 2 of health; and to amend and reenact section 43-29.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code,

3 relating to selection criteria for the veterinarian loan repayment program.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 6 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 7 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 8 other income, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 9 state department of health, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017, 10 as follows:

16	of the sixty-fifth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium					
17	beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017.					
18	SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general					
19	fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$675,378, or so much of the					
20	sum as may be necessary, to the state department of health for the purpose of funding					
21	additional full-time equivalent positions in the environmental health division of the department,					
22	for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30, 2017. The state department of					
23	health is authorized four full-time equivalent positions in the environmental health division.					
24	SECTION 4. ENVIRONMENT AND RANGELAND	PROTECTION FUND. The	e estimated			
25	income line item included in section 1 of this Act included	es \$250,000, or so much o	f the sum as			
26	may be necessary, to be made available to the state department of health from the environment					
27	and rangeland protection fund, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2015, and ending June 30,					
28	2017. This amount includes \$50,000 for a grant to the	North Dakota stockmen's a	ssociation			
29	environmental services program.					
30	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 43-29.1-03 of	the North Dakota Century	Code is			
31	amended and reenacted as follows:

2	1.	In establishing the criteria regarding eligibility for loan repayment funds under this		
3		chapter, the state health council shall consider the applicant's:		
4		a.	Training in food animal veterinary medicine, ability, willingness to engage in food	
5			animal veterinary medicine, and the extent to which such services are needed in	
6			a selected community;	
7		b.	Commitment to serve in a community that is in need of a veterinarian;	
8		C.	Compatibility with a selected community;	
9		d.	Date of availability for service to the selected community; and	
10		e.	Competence and professional conduct.	
11	2.	An a	applicant selected to receive loan repayment funds under this chapter must:	
12		a.	HaveMust have graduated from an accredited college of veterinary medicine; and	
13		b.	BeMust be licensed to practice veterinary medicine in this state; and	
14		<u>C.</u>	Must be employed full-time in the private practice of veterinary medicine.	
15	3.	A se	lected applicant shall contract to provide full-time veterinary medicine services for	
16		two,	three, or four years in one or more selected communities.
