- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact sections 43-41-15, 43-41-16, 43-41-17, 43-41-18,
- 2 43-41-19, 43-41-20, 43-41-21, and 43-41-22 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the
- 3 regulation of social work; to amend and reenact sections 43-41-01, 43-41-02, 43-41-03,
- 4 43-41-04, 43-41-07, 43-41-08, 43-41-09, 43-41-10, 43-41-12, and 43-14-14 of the North Dakota
- 5 Century Code, relating to the regulation of social work; to repeal section 43-41-05 of the North
- 6 Dakota Century Code, relating to private practice of social work; and to provide a penalty.

7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-41-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is

9 amended and reenacted as follows:

10 **43-41-01**. **Definitions**.

- 11 In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:
- 1. <u>"Approved clinical supervisor" means a licensed clinical social worker who has met the</u>
 gualifications to be a clinical supervisor for licensure as determined by the board.
- 14 <u>2.</u> "Approved provider of continuing education" means a person approved by the board to
 15 <u>conduct educational programs.</u>
- 16 3. "Approved social work program" means a school of social work or a social work
 17 educational program approved by the board.
- 18 <u>4. "Approved supervisor" means an approved clinical supervisor or licensed social</u>
 19 worker who has met the qualifications to be a supervisor as determined by the board.
- 20 <u>"Baccalaureate social worker" means an individual duly licensed to practice</u>
- 21 <u>baccalaureate social work.</u>
- 22 <u>6.5.</u> "Board" means the North Dakota board of social work examiners.
- 23 2. "College or university" means an institution of higher education whose social work 24 program has been accredited by an accrediting body approved by the board.

1	3.	"Licensed certified social worker" means an individual who has a doctorate or master's-
2		degree in social work from a college or university and who has fulfilled the
3		requirements for licensure.
4	4.	"Licensed independent clinical social worker" means an individual who has a doctorate
5		or master's degree in social work from a college or university and who has fulfilled the
6		requirements for licensure or has been registered by the board for third-party
7		reimbursement before August 1, 1997.
8	5.	"Licensed social worker" means an individual who has a baccalaureate degree in-
9	1	social work from a college or university and who has fulfilled the requirements for-
10		licensure.
11	<u> </u>	"Case management" means a method to plan, provide, evaluate, and monitor services
12		from a variety of resources on behalf of and in collaboration with a client.
13	<u>8.6.</u>	"Client" means the individual, couple, family, group, organization, or community that
14		seeks or receives social work services from an individual social worker or an
15		organization regardless of whether the social worker or organization bills or accepts or
16	1	requests the payment of fees for the services.
17	<u>9.7.</u>	"Clinical social worker" means an individual duly licensed to practice clinical social
18	1	work under this chapter.
19	<u> 10.8.</u>	"Clinical supervision for licensure" means an interactional professional relationship
20	1	between an approved clinical supervisor and a social worker which provides
21		evaluation and direction over the supervisee's practice of clinical social work in
22		preparation for the social worker's licensure as a clinical social worker in accordance
23		with the requirements adopted by the board and promotes continued development of
24		the social worker's knowledge, skills, and abilities to engage in the practice of clinical
25	I	social work in an ethical and competent manner.
26	<u>11.9.</u>	"Continuing education" means education and training oriented to maintain, improve, or
27	I	enhance competent social work practice.
28	<u>12.10.</u>	"Continuing education contact hour" means a fifty-minute clock hour of instruction, not
29	I	including breaks or meals.
30	<u> 13.11.</u>	"Consultation" means an advisory professional relationship between a social worker
31		and an individual with particular expertise, with the social worker legally and ethically

1		maintaining responsibility for all judgments and decisions regarding service to the
2		<u>client.</u>
3	<u> 14.12.</u>	"ConvictionConvicted" means conviction of a crime by a court of competent jurisdiction
4		and includes a finding or verdict of guilt, regardless of whether the adjudication of guilt
5		is withheld or not entered on admission of guilt, a no contest plea, a plea of nolo
6		contendere, or a guilty plea.
7	<u> 15.13.</u>	"Counseling" means a method used by a social worker to assist an individual, couple,
8		family, or group in learning how to solve problems and make decisions about personal,
9	1	health, social, educational, vocational, financial, and other interpersonal concerns.
10	<u>16.14.</u>	"Electronic social work services" means the use of a computer, including the internet,
11		social media, online chat, text, and electronic mail, or other electronic means, such as
12		a wireless communications device, landline telephone, or video technology, to provide
13		information to the public, deliver social work services to a client, communicate with a
14		client, manage confidential information and case records, store and access
15	1	information about clients, and arrange payment for professional services.
16	<u> 17.15.</u>	"Examination" means a standardized test or examination of social work knowledge,
17	1	skills, and abilities approved by the board.
18	<u> 18.16.</u>	"Felony" means a criminal act as defined by this state or any other state or by
19	1	definition under federal law.
20	<u>19.17.</u>	"Final adverse action" means any action taken or order entered by the board, whether
21		through a consent agreement, as the result of a contested hearing, issued through a
22		letter of reprimand, admonition, or warning, or other action against a licensee,
23		applicant, or individual which is public information under applicable law and which
24		impacts the licensure status, or record, practice status or record, or other related
25		practice privileges. The term includes denial of a licensure application, denial of a
26		licensure renewal application, and surrender of licensure. A board action or order is a
27		final adverse action regardless of any pending appeal. To the extent applicable, a final
28		adverse action is intended to encompass any action that requires reporting to state or
29	1	federal authorities, including the national practitioner data bank.
30	20. 18.	"Licensee" means an individual duly licensed or registered under this chapter.

1 21.19. "Master's social worker" means an individual duly licensed to practice master's social 2 work. 3 6.22.20. "Private practice of social work" means the independent practice of social work by a 4 qualified individual licensee within that licensee's scope of practice as described in 5 sections 43-41-15, 43-41-16, or 43-41-17, and who is self-employed on a full-time or 6 part-time basis and is responsible for that independent practice. Consultation services 7 provided to an organization or an agency are not considered to be the private practice 8 of social work. 9 "Social work practice" consists of the professional application of social work values, 7. 10 principles, and techniques in helping people obtain tangible services; counseling; 11 psychotherapy with individuals, families, and groups; helping communities or groups to-12 improve social and health services; providing social casework; directly supervising-13 programs providing social work services; social work education; social work research; 14 or any combination of these. The practice of social work requires knowledge of human-15 development and behavior, of social, economic, and cultural institutions, and the 16 interaction of all these factors. 17 23.21. "Program of continuing education" means an educational program offered by an 18 approved provider of continuing education. 19 24.22. "Psychotherapy" means the use of treatment methods utilizing a specialized, formal 20 interaction between a clinical social worker and an individual, couple, family, or group 21 in which a therapeutic relationship is established, maintained, and sustained to 22 understand unconscious processes; intrapersonal, interpersonal, and psychosocial 23 dynamics; and the assessment, diagnosis, and treatment of mental, emotional, and 24 behavioral disorders, conditions, and addictions. 25 "Supervision for licensure" means the professional relationship between a supervisee 25. 26 and an approved supervisor who provides oversight, direction, and evaluation over the 27 services provided by the supervisee and promotes continued development of the 28 supervisee's knowledge, skills, and abilities to provide social work services in an 29 ethical and competent manner.

4	SEC	TION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-41-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
5	amende	d and reenacted as follows:
6	43-4	1-02. Social work practice - Exceptions.
7	1.	Nothing in this chapter may be construed to prevent any person from doing work
8		within the standards and ethics of that person's profession and calling, provided that
9		the person does not present to the public, by title or description of services, that the
10		person is engaging in social work practice.
11	2.	Nothing in this chapter may be construed to prevent students who are enrolled in
12		programs of study leading to social work degrees from interning with a licensed
13		baccalaureate social worker, a licensed certified master's social worker, or a licensed
14		independent clinical social worker.
15	3.	Nothing in this chapter prevents the employment of, or volunteering by, individuals in
16		nonprofit agencies or community organizations provided these persons do not hold
17		themselves out to the public as being social workers.
18	4.	Nothing in this chapter prevents the employment of social work designees by
19		hospitals, basic care facilities, or skilled nursing facilities, provided these individuals
20		work under the direction of a social worker or social work consultant licensed under
21		this chapter and that the board be notified of the name of the designee's employer and
22		the name of the licensee who is providing direction or consultation to the designees.
23		The board may adopt requirements by rule for licensees providing direction or
24		consultation to designees under this section.
25	5.	This chapter does not require public or appointed officials or administrators, acting in
26		that capacity, or any other social or human service administrators who do not hold
27		themselves out to the public as social workers, by title or description of services, to be
28		licensed under this chapter.
29	6.	This chapter does not prevent individuals with master's or doctoral degrees in the field
30		of counseling with specialization in mental health from serving as counselors or

1		therapists in mental health in state institutions or regional human service centers, if
2		they do not hold themselves out to the public as social workers.
3	<u>7.</u>	In response to a disaster or emergency declared by the governor or other appropriate
4		authority, an individual licensed and in good standing to practice social work in another
5		jurisdiction who is providing social work services within the scope of practice
6		designated by the license and whose professional licenses in all other disciplines are
7		current and in good standing may, upon prior written notice to the board and without
8		otherwise applying for a license, provide services in this state for the time the
9		emergency or disaster declaration is effective. An individual exercising rights under
10		this section is deemed to have submitted to the jurisdiction of the applicable board or
11		state agency and to be bound by the laws of this state in addition to other applicable
12		laws by virtue of licensure status in other states. An individual who has at any time
13		surrendered any professional license under threat of administrative disciplinary
14		sanction or in response to administrative investigation or has any professional license
15		under suspension or revocation or agency order restricting or limiting practice
16		privilege, with the exception of an expired or lapsed license due to voluntary
17		nonrenewal of the license, may not practice under this section.

27		practice of clinical social work meets or exceeds the minimum supervisory

5	<u>9.</u>	ShallMay inspect any licensee at all reasonable hours for the purpose of determining if
6		any provisions of the laws governing the practice of social work are being violated.
7		The board, its officers, inspectors, and representatives shall cooperate with all
8		agencies charged with the enforcement of the laws of the United States, of this state,
9		and of all other states relating to the practice of social work.
10	<u>10.</u>	Shall recover its costs in the following circumstances:
11		a. If an order is issued in resolution of a disciplinary proceeding before the board,
12		the board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found as
13		a result of the proceeding to have violated any laws or rules to pay to the board a
14		sum not to exceed the costs of the investigation and fees of the attorneys
15		representing the board in the matter. The costs to be assessed must be fixed by
16		the administrative law judge and may not be increased by the board.

19		the district court of Burleigh County. This right of enforcement is in addition to any
20		other rights the board may have as to any person directed to pay costs. In any
21		action for recovery of costs, proof of the board's decision is conclusive proof of
22		the validity of the order of payment and the terms for payment.

27		immune from any liability for reporting made in good faith. A licensee is deemed to
28		consent to the treating physician or professional of the approved treatment and
29		monitoring program reporting to the board on the progress of the licensee at such
30		intervals the board deems necessary and the person making the report is not liable if
31		the report is made in good faith. The approved treatment program may release

1		<u>trea</u>	tment information to the board necessary for the board to evaluate the licensee's

17	reasonable time from receipt of knowledge may be considered grounds for disciplinary action		
18	against the licensee failing to report.		
19	SECTION 18. Section 43-41-22 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted		
20	as follows:		
21	<u>43-41-22. Temporary suspension - Appeal.</u>		
22	1. If, based on verified evidence, the board determines by a clear and convincing		
23	standard the evidence presented to the board indicates the continued practice by the		
24	licensee would create a significant risk of serious and ongoing harm to the public while		
25	a disciplinary proceeding is pending, and immediate suspension of the licensee's		
26	license is required to reasonably protect the public from that risk of harm, the board		
27	may order a temporary suspension ex parte. For purposes of this section, "verified		
28	evidence" means testimony taken under oath and based on personal knowledge. The		
29	board shall give prompt written notice of the suspension to the licensee, which must		
30	include a copy of the order and complaint, the date set for a full hearing, and a specific		
31	description of the nature of the evidence, including a list of all known witnesses and a		

1		description of any documents relied upon by the board in ordering the temporary
2		suspension which, upon request, must be made available to the social worker.
3	<u>2.</u>	An ex parte temporary suspension remains in effect until a final order is issued after a
4		full hearing or appeal under this section or until the suspension is otherwise terminated
5		by the board.
6	<u>3.</u>	The board shall conduct a hearing on the merits of the allegations to determine what
7		disciplinary action, if any, must be taken against the licensee who is the subject of the
8		ex parte suspension. That hearing must be held not later than thirty days from the
9		issuance of the ex parte temporary suspension order. The licensee is entitled to a
10		continuance of the thirty-day period upon request for a period determined by the
11		hearing officer.
12	<u>4.</u>	The licensee may appeal the ex parte temporary suspension order before the full
13		hearing. For purposes of appeal, the district court shall decide whether the board
14		acted reasonably or arbitrarily. The court shall give priority to the appeal for prompt
15		disposition.
