## 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 54-27.2-01, 54-27.2-03, and 54-44.1-12 of the

2 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the balance of the budget stabilization fund, transfers

3 and expenditures from the budget stabilization fund, and the allotment of funds; and to declare

4 an emergency.

## 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 54-27.2-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7 amended and reenacted as follows:

## 8 54-27.2-01. Budget stabilization fund.

9 The budget stabilization fund is a special fund in the state treasury. The state investment 10 board shall supervise investment of the budget stabilization fund in accordance with chapter 11 21-10. Any interest or other budget stabilization fund earnings must be deposited incredited to 12 the fund. Any amounts provided by law for deposit in the fund and any interest or earnings of 13 the fund which would bring the balance in the fund at the end of any fiscal year to an amount 14 greater than nine and one-halffifteen percent of the current biennial state general fund budget, 15 as finally approved by the most recently adjourned special or regular session of the legislative 16 assembly, may not be deposited or retained in or credited to the fund but must be deposited 17 instead in the state general fund. 18 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-27.2-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is

19 amended and reenacted as follows:

20 **54-27.2-03.** Transfers and expenditures from budget stabilization fund.

21 If the director of the office of management and budget projects that general fund revenues-

22 for the biennium will be at least two and one-half percent less than estimated by the most-

- 23 recently adjourned special or regular session of the legislative assembly, and if the governor-
- 24 orders a transfer, which must be reported to the budget section of the legislative management,-

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1	the state treasurer shall transfer the appropriate funds from the budget stabilization fund to the

10		<u>a.</u>	After general fund allotments totaling at least three percent have been made			
11			during the biennium under section 54-44.1-12, the governor may order a transfer			
12			up to an amount equal to three percent of general fund appropriations.			
13		<u>b.</u>	If the maximum transfer from the budget stabilization fund is made to the general			
14			fund under subdivision a and an additional general fund allotment of at least one			
15			percent is made under section 54-44.1-12, the governor may order a transfer up			
16			to an amount equal to two percent of general fund appropriations.			
17		<u>C.</u>	If the maximum transfer from the budget stabilization fund is made to the general			
18			fund under subdivision b and an additional general fund allotment of at least one			
19			percent is made under section 54-44.1-12, the governor may order a transfer up			
20			to an amount equal to three percent of general fund appropriations.			
21		<u>d.</u>	If the maximum transfer from the budget stabilization fund is made to the general			
22			fund under subdivision c and an additional general fund allotment of at least one			
23			percent is made under section 54-44.1-12, the governor may transfer any			
24			remaining funds in the budget stabilization fund to the general fund.			
25		<u>e.</u>	The amount of a transfer made under any subdivision of this subsection may not			
26			exceed the difference between the general fund revenue projections for the			
27			biennium of the most recently adjourned special or regular session of the			
28			legislative assembly and the revised general fund revenue projections for the			
29			biennium, less the amounts of any allotments ordered under section 54-44.1-12			
30			during the biennium, as determined by the director of the office of management			
31			and budget. For purposes of this subsection, "general fund revenue projections			

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1			for the biennium" includes the general fund balance at the beginning of the	
2			biennium.	
3		<u>f.</u>	For purposes of this subsection, the calculation of total percentage general fund	
4			allotments made under section 54-44.1-12 must be based on total general fund	
5			allotments after any allotment exemption granted by the director of the budget	
6			compared to total general fund appropriations.	
7	<u>2.</u>	<u>Any</u>	v amounts transferred from the budget stabilization fund upon order of the governor	
8		to tl	he state general fund may be expended within the limits of legislative guidelines	
9		and	I general fund appropriations of the most recently adjourned special or regular	
10		ses	sion of the legislative assembly. For purposes of this section, "general fund-	
11		reve	enues for the biennium" and "general fund revenue projections for the biennium"	
12		incl	ude the general fund balance at the beginning of the bienniumappropriations"

17	SEC	стю	N 3. AMENDMENT. Section 54-44.1-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is

19	54-4	44.1- <sup>,</sup>	12. Control over rate of expenditures.	
20	1.	The	e director of the budget shall exercise continual control over the execution of the	
21		bud	lget affecting the departments and agencies of state government, with the	
22		exc	eption of the legislative and judicial branches. Execution means the analysis and	
23		арр	proval of all commitments for conformity with the program provided in the budget,	
24		frec	quent comparison of actual revenues and budget estimates, and on the basis of	
25		thes	se analyses and comparisons control the rate of expenditures through a system of	
26		allo	tments. The allotment must be made by specific fund and all departments and	
27		age	encies that receive moneys from that fund must be allotted on a uniform percentage	
28		bas	is, except that appropriations to the department of public instruction for state-	
29		sch	ool aid, transportation aid, and special education aid may only be allotted to the	
30		exte	ent that the allotment can be offset by transfers from the foundation aid stabilization

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1		<del>a.</del>	The first two and one-half percent allotment from the general fund must be offset
2			with a transfer from the foundation aid stabilization fund.
3		<del>b.</del>	Any general fund allotment in excess of two and one-half percent that is
4			necessary, after all moneys available in the budget stabilization fund have been
5			transferred to the general fund under section 54-27.2-03, may be offset with a
6			transfer from the foundation aid stabilization fund
7		<u>a.</u>	The following appropriations may be allotted only to the extent that the allotment
8			can be offset by transfers from the foundation aid stabilization fund:
9			(1) General fund appropriations to the department of public instruction for state
10			school aid, transportation aid, and special education aid; and
11			(2) General fund appropriations to the department of career and technical
12			education for grants to school districts.
13		<u>b.</u>	After allotments of two and one-half percent have been ordered during a
14			biennium, the director of the budget may exempt the following appropriations
15			from up to one percent of an allotment each biennium:
16			(1) General fund appropriations to the department of corrections and
17			rehabilitation; and
18			(2) General fund appropriations to the department of human services for direct
19			<u>care programs</u> .
20	2.	Bef	ore an allotment is made which will reduce the amount of funds which can be
21		dist	oursed pursuant to an appropriation or before an allotment disallowing a specific
22		exp	enditure is made, the director shall find one or more of the following circumstances
23		to e	xist:
24		a.	The moneys and estimated revenues in a specific fund from which the
25			appropriation is made are insufficient to meet all legislative appropriations from
26			the fund.
27		b.	The payment or the obligation incurred is not authorized by law.
28		C.	The expenditure or obligation is contrary to legislative intent as recorded in any
29			reliable legislative records, including:
30			(1) Statements of legislative intent expressed in enacted appropriation
31			measures or other measures enacted by the legislative assembly; and

1		(2) Statements of purpose of amendment explaining amendments to enacted
2		appropriation measures, as recorded in the journals of the legislative
3		assembly.
4	d.	Circumstances or availability of facts not previously known or foreseen by the
5		legislative assembly which make possible the accomplishment of the purpose of
6		the appropriation at a lesser amount than that appropriated.
7	SECTION	I 4. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
