- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-12 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to higher education tuition and fees waivers for law enforcement officers.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 54-12 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

4 5 and enacted as follows: 6 Law enforcement officer tuition and fees waiver. 7 AnTo the extent the annual cap under this section has not been met, an individual who 1. 8 is employed as a full-time law enforcement officer in this state, who has a minimum of 9 two years of employment, and who is licensed under chapter 12-63 is entitled to a 10 waiver of twenty-five percent of resident tuition and fees of any institution of higher 11 education under the control of the state board of higher education if the law 12 enforcement officer: 13 Maintains satisfactory performance with the officer's law enforcement agency; а. 14 b. Obtains authorization to participate in the waiver program and a certificate of 15 verification from the law enforcement officer's superior officer which attests to the 16 officer's satisfactory performance; 17 Meets all admission requirements of the institution; and C. Pursues studies leading to a degree from an associate degree program or a 18 <u>d.</u> 19 baccalaureate degree program. 20 2. The law enforcement officer may receive the tuition and fees waiver for up to five 21 years from the date the law enforcement officer first receives a waiver under this 22 section. 23 The institution of higher education shall waive twenty-five percent of the officer's tuition 3. 24 and fees after subtracting awarded federal financial aid grants and state scholarships

1		and grants for an eligible law enforcement officer during the time the officer is enrolled.
2		To remain eligible for the waiver, the officer shall comply with all requirements of the
3		institution for continued attendance and award of an associate degree or a
4		baccalaureate degree.
5	<u>4.</u>	The law enforcement officer shall include the certificate of verification when applying
6	I	for enrollment to the institution of higher education.
7	<u>5.</u>	The total amount of waivers granted each year by institutions under the control of the
8		state board of higher education may not exceed one million dollars.
9	6.	The attorney general shall adopt the rules necessary to implement this section.
