- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact chapter 20.1-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to authorization for issuance of special allocation hunting licenses; to amend and
- 3 reenact sections 20.1-02-04, 20.1-04-07, 20.1-08-04.1, 20.1-08-04.2, and 20.1-08-04.6 of the
- 4 North Dakota Century Code, relating to authorization for issuance of special allocation hunting
- 5 licenses; and to repeal sections 20.1-08-04.8, 20.1-08-04.12, and 20.1-08-04.13 of the North
- 6 Dakota Century Code, relating to authorization for issuance of special allocation hunting
- 7 licenses; and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 9 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-02-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is
- 10 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 11 **20.1-02-04**. Duties of director.
- 12 The director shall:
- 13 1. Maintain an office in Bismarck.
- 14 2. Adopt rules necessary to the conduct of the department.
- 15 3. Keep an accurate record of all the transactions and expenditures of the department
- and submit a biennial report to the governor and the secretary of state in accordance
 with section 54-06-04.
- 18 4. Enforce state laws involving wildlife.
- Collect and distribute statistics and information germane to this title and publish
 information and reports, including a monthly bulletin, for the education of the public in
 conservation matters.
- Examine all waters of the state and, wherever suitable waters are found, arrange toplant, stock, or deposit available fish, spawn, or fry.

1	7.	Cooperate with the United States fish and wildlife service, or any other appropriate
2		federal agency, and make applications for fish, spawn, and fry, to apportion and
3		deposit in waters of the state.
4	8.	Cooperate with and assist clubs and individuals in stocking the waters of this state
5		with fish.
6	9.	Remove or take from any public waters containing a surplus of fish any reasonable
7		quantity of fish for stocking other public waters, hatching or propagating purposes, or
8		exchange with other states and countries.
9	10.	Control, construct, mark, designate, manage, and have charge of all state fish
10		hatcheries, state game farms, game refuges, and game reserves owned, leased, or
11		controlled for the propagation and protection of game birds, game animals, and fish.
12	11.	Supervise the breeding, propagation, capture, distribution, and preservation of game
13		birds, game animals, and fish as the director deems advisable.
14	12.	Adopt rules necessary for carrying out section 20.1-10-01 and these rules have the
15		force of law after one publication in the daily newspapers of this state.
16	13.	Provide the necessary blank forms for making applications for licenses of all kinds and
17		distribute them among those authorized to sell licenses.
18	14.	Keep a record of all permits issued for the purpose of propagation and domestication
19		of game birds or protected animals.
20	15.	Issue four any deer licenses and six any white-tailed deer licenses annually to the
21		injured military wildlife project of North Dakota for distribution. A license issued under-
22		this subsection is valid during the period of the deer bow season.
23	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-04-07 of the North Dakota Century Code is	
24	amende	d and reenacted as follows:

28	1.	By proclamation the The governor by proclamation may provide for a permit season to
29		take wild turkeys in the manner, number, places, and times deemed in the state's best
30		interests ; however: .

a.	By proclamation the governor may make available to the national wild turkey
	federation one license per year to hunt wild turkeys in the spring in the manner,
	places, and times as the governor prescribes. The national wild turkey federation
	shall hold a raffle or may auction to the highest bidder, whether resident or
	nonresident, a license to hunt wild turkeys. If an individual receives a wild turkey
	license through the raffle or the auction, the individual is not eligible to apply for a
	wild turkey license through the game and fish department that year. No more-
	than ten percent of the gross proceeds of the raffle may be used to promote the
	raffle. Ten percent of the net proceeds of the raffle or auction may be retained by
	the local, state, or national wild turkey federation entity conducting the raffle or
	auction. All remaining net proceeds must be deposited in the national wild turkey
	federation superfund and used for wild turkey management and related projects-
	in this state. The national wild turkey federation shall submit reports concerning-
	the raffle or auction as the director requires.
b.	By proclamation the The governor also by proclamation may allow individuals
	who are first-time youth spring wild turkey hunters to receive one spring wild
	turkey license valid for the regular spring wild turkey season. To be eligible to
	receive a spring wild turkey license, an individual must be fifteen years of age or
	younger on the opening day of the spring wild turkey season and have never
	received a spring wild turkey license.
C.	By proclamation the governor may make available to the outdoor adventure
	foundation up to two licenses to hunt a turkey in the spring season. The
	foundation shall make one license available to each qualified youth to hunt as
	provided in the governor's proclamation. A qualified youth receiving a license-
	under this section must comply with hunter education requirements and if under-
	the age of eighteen must be accompanied by an adult twenty-one years of age or
	b.

- 27 older. As used in this section, "qualified youth" means an individual who has-
- 28 cancer or a life-threatening illness, is of legal age to hunt a turkey, is under-
- 29 twenty-five years of age, is a resident, and is sponsored by the foundation. The-
- 30 foundation must provide the department supporting documentation-

1		demonstrating compliance with this section. The director may adopt rules to
2		implement this section.
3	2.	The governor by proclamation shall make available to residents and nonresidents any
4		permitslicenses remaining after the resident fall drawing.

8	The	director shall authorize issuance of the following annual special allocation hunting
9	licenses	· ·
10	<u>1.</u>	Four any deer licenses and six any white-tailed deer licenses per year to the injured
11		military wildlife project of North Dakota for distribution. A license issued under this
12		subsection is valid during the period of the deer bow season.
13	<u>2.</u>	One license per year to the national wild turkey federation to hunt wild turkeys in the
14		spring in the manner, places, and times as the governor provides by proclamation. The
15		national wild turkey federation shall hold a raffle for, or may auction to the highest
16		bidder, whether resident or nonresident, the license to hunt wild turkeys. If an
17		individual receives a wild turkey license through the raffle or auction, the individual is
18		not eligible to receive a wild turkey license through the game and fish department that
19		year. No more than ten percent of the gross proceeds of the raffle may be used to
20		promote the raffle. Ten percent of the net proceeds of the raffle may be retained by the
21		local, state, or national wild turkey federation entity conducting the raffle. All remaining
22		net proceeds must be deposited in the national wild turkey federation superfund and
23		used for wild turkey management and related projects in this state. The national wild
24		turkey federation shall submit reports concerning the raffle as the director requires.
25	<u>3.</u>	Up to two licenses per year to the outdoor adventure foundation to hunt a turkey in the
26		spring season. The foundation shall make authorized licenses available to sponsored
27		qualified youths to hunt as the governor provides by proclamation. A qualified youth
28		receiving a license under this section must comply with hunter education requirements
29		and if under the age of eighteen must be accompanied by an adult twenty-one years
30		of age or older. As used in this section, "qualified youth" means an individual who has
31		cancer or a life-threatening illness, is of legal age to hunt a turkey, is under twenty-five

1	years of age, is a resident, and is sponsored by the foundation. The foundation must
2	provide the department supporting documentation demonstrating compliance with this
3	section.

4 4. One license per year to the midwest chapter of the wild sheep foundation to hunt 5 bighorn sheep in the manner, places, and times as the governor provides by 6 proclamation. The midwest chapter of the wild sheep foundation shall hold a raffle or 7 auction under rules adopted by the director with residents and nonresidents eligible to 8 participate. An individual who has been convicted of illegally taking a moose, elk, or 9 bighorn sheep is not eligible to apply for or receive a license under this subsection. 10 Ten percent of gross raffle proceeds may be retained by the midwest chapter of the 11 wild sheep foundation and ninety percent of gross raffle proceeds must be remitted to 12 the department. All auction proceeds must be remitted to the department. An individual 13 who receives a license through the raffle or auction may not transfer the license. 14 One license per year to the North American wildlife enforcement memorial museum 5. 15 and educational center and the rocky mountain elk foundation to hunt moose in a 16 manner, places, and times as the governor provides by proclamation. The North 17 American wildlife enforcement memorial museum and educational center and the 18 rocky mountain elk foundation shall hold a raffle under rules adopted by the director 19 with residents and nonresidents eligible to participate. The individual who receives the 20 license from the raffle may not transfer the license. No more than ten percent of the 21 gross proceeds of the raffle may be used to promote the raffle. Fifty percent of all net 22 proceeds must be used for elk management or other wildlife and in 23 conservation-related projects in this state as described under rocky mountain elk 24 foundation policies and objectives. All remaining net proceeds must be used for 25 construction and maintenance of the North American wildlife enforcement memorial 26 museum and educational center located at the international peace garden. The North 27 American wildlife enforcement memorial museum and educational center and the 28 rocky mountain elk foundation shall submit reports concerning the raffle as the director 29 requires. An individual who has been convicted of illegally taking a moose, elk, or 30 bighorn sheep is not eligible to apply for or receive a license under this subsection.

1	<u>6.</u>	One license per year to the rocky mountain elk foundation and the North American
2		wildlife enforcement memorial museum and educational center to hunt elk in a
3		manner, places, and times as the governor provides by proclamation. The rocky
4		mountain elk foundation and the North American wildlife enforcement memorial
5		museum and educational center shall hold a raffle under rules adopted by the director
6		with residents and nonresidents eligible to participate. No more than ten percent of the
7		gross proceeds of the raffle may be used to promote the raffle and fifty percent of all
8		net proceeds must be used for elk management or other wildlife and
9		conservation-related projects in North Dakota as described under rocky mountain elk
10		foundation policies and objectives. All remaining net proceeds must be used for
11		construction and maintenance of the North American wildlife enforcement memorial
12		museum and educational center located at the international peace garden. The rocky
13		mountain elk foundation and the North American wildlife enforcement memorial
14		museum and educational center shall submit reports concerning the raffle as the
15		director requires. An individual who has been convicted of illegally taking a moose, elk,
16		or bighorn sheep is not eligible to apply for or receive a license under this subsection.
17	<u>7.</u>	One license per year to the mule deer foundation to hunt mule deer in the manner,
18		places, and times as the governor provides by proclamation. The mule deer
19		foundation shall hold a raffle or auction under rules adopted by the director with
20		residents and nonresidents eligible to participate. If an individual receives a mule deer
21		license through the raffle or auction, the individual is not eligible to receive a mule deer
22		license through the game and fish department that year. No more than ten percent of
23		the gross proceeds of the raffle may be used to promote the raffle and all net proceeds
24		of the raffle or auction must be used for mule deer management and related projects
25		in North Dakota. The mule deer foundation shall submit reports concerning the raffle
26		or auction as the director requires.
27	<u>8.</u>	One license per year to the North Dakota hunter educators association to hunt
28		antelope in the manner, places, and times as the governor prescribes by proclamation.
29		The North Dakota hunter educators association shall hold a raffle under rules adopted
30		by the director. Only residents are eligible to participate. No more than ten percent of
31		the gross proceeds of the raffle may be used to promote the raffle and all net proceeds

1		of the raffle must be used for sponsoring mentored hunts for youth who may otherwise
2		not have the means to go afield to hunt, establishing a statewide network of shooting
3		locations for youth to become familiar with archery equipment and firearms under the
4		supervision of a certified volunteer hunter education instructor, and purchasing
5		advertising in news media during hunting season concerning firearms safety and
6		hunting ethics and the promotion of safe and responsible hunting. If an individual
7		receives an antelope license through the raffle, the individual is not eligible to apply for
8		an antelope license through the game and fish department that year. The North
9		Dakota hunter educators association shall submit reports concerning the raffle as the
10		director requires.
11	<u>9.</u>	One any elk license, one any moose license, up to seven white-tailed deer licenses,
12		and up to two antelope licenses to the outdoor adventure foundation to hunt the
13		species indicated on the license in the manner, places, and times as the governor
14		prescribes by proclamation. The foundation shall make one license available to each
15		qualified youth to hunt the species of big game indicated on the license as provided in
16		the governor's proclamation. A qualified youth receiving a license under this section
17		must comply with hunter education requirements and if under the age of eighteen
18		must be accompanied by an adult twenty-one years of age or older. As used in this
19		section, "qualified youth" means an individual who has been diagnosed with cancer or
20		a life-threatening illness, is of legal age to hunt the species for which the license is
21		valid, is under twenty-five years of age, is a resident, and is sponsored by the
22		foundation. The foundation must provide the department supporting documentation
23		demonstrating compliance with this section.
24	<u>20.1</u>	1-05.1-02. Discretionary special allocation hunting license authorization.
25	<u>1.</u>	Subject to the restrictions under this section and in addition to the special allocation
26		licenses authorized under section 20.1-05.1-01, if determined appropriate by the
27		director based on the sustainability of the species population, the director may
28		authorize issuance issue to eligible organizations of the following annual special
29		allocation hunting licenses:

1		<u>a.</u>	Not more than two elk licenses, but the total issued under this subdivision may
2			not exceed two percent of the general lottery allocation of elk licenses for the
3			season.
4		<u>b.</u>	Not more than two moose licenses, but the total issued under this subdivision
5			may not exceed two percent of the general lottery allocation of moose licenses
6			for the season.
7		<u>C.</u>	Not more than two antelope licenses, but the total issued under this subdivision
8			may not exceed two percent of the general lottery allocation of antelope licenses
9			for the previous season.
10		<u>d.</u>	Not more than ten white-tailed deer licenses.
11	<u>2.</u>	An	eligible organization may apply annually to be considered for issuance of aup to
12		<u>two</u>	special allocation hunting licenses under this section. Applications under
13		<u>this</u>	subsection must be filed at the times, in the manner, and containing the
14		info	rmation required by rules adopted by the director. If more applications are filed
15		<u>thai</u>	n the number of licenses under this section available for that species for a season,
16		<u>the</u>	director shall determine by lottery which organizations will receive the available
17		lice	nses.
18	<u>3.</u>	<u>An</u>	eligible organization that obtains a license under this section and conducts a raffle
19		<u>or a</u>	auction to determine the recipient of the license must conduct the raffle or auction in
20		<u>con</u>	npliance with rules adopted by the director. An eligible organization that obtains a
21		lice	nse under this section shall submit reports concerning a raffle or auction as the
22		<u>dire</u>	ector requires. An individual may apply to receive an elk or moose license through a
23		raffl	le or auction under this section as well as through the game and fish department
24		gen	eral lottery. If an individual receives an elk or moose license under this section, the
25		<u>indi</u>	vidual is not eligible to receive an elk or moose license through the game and fish
26		<u>dep</u>	partment general lottery that year and may not obtain an elk or moose license under
27		<u>sec</u>	tion 20.1-05.1-01 that year. If an individual receives an elk or moose license under
28		<u>sec</u>	tion 20.1-05.1-01, the individual is not eligible to receive an elk or moose license
29		und	ler this section that year.
30	<u>4.</u>	<u>An</u>	individual who has been convicted of illegally taking a moose, elk, or bighorn sheep
31		<u>is n</u>	ot eligible to apply for or receive a license under this section.

1 For purposes of this section, "eligible organization" means an organization that: 5. 2 Is exempt from federal income taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal <u>a.</u> 3 Revenue Code [26 U.S.C. 501(c)(3)] and provides with its application a copy of 4 the letter from the internal revenue service to that effect. 5 Is on file as a nonprofit corporation in good standing in the office of the secretary <u>b.</u> 6 of state. 7 Agrees in its application to contribute at least ten percent of the net proceeds of C. 8 any raffle of a license under this section to a conservation-related project to be 9 conducted in this state and approved by the director. 10 d.. Is not the recipient of a special allocation hunting license under section 11 20.1-05.1-01. 12 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-08-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is 13 amended and reenacted as follows: 14 20.1-08-04.1. Governor's proclamation concerning the hunting of bighorn sheep -15 Minnesota-Wisconsin chapter of the foundation for North American wild sheep raffle or 16 auction - Certain license recipients not eligible to apply again. 17 The governor may by proclamation provide for a season to hunt bighorn sheep in the 18 manner, number, places, and times as the governor prescribes. Licenses to hunt bighorn sheep 19 must be issued by lottery; however, the governor may by proclamation make available to the 20 Minnesota-Wisconsin chapter of the foundation for North American wild sheep a license to hunt 21 bighorn sheep in the manner, places, and times as the governor prescribes, except special 22 allocation licenses issued under subsection 1 of section 20.1-05.1-01. Upon payment of the 23 nonrefundable application fee required by section 20.1-03-12.2, a nonresident may participate 24 in the state lottery. One license to hunt bighorn sheep may be issued to a nonresident 25 participating in the state lottery. If a nonresident is issued a license to hunt bighorn sheep, no 26 other nonresident may be issued a license to hunt bighorn sheep through the state lottery. If all 27 of the licenses to hunt bighorn sheep made available through the state lottery are issued to 28 residents, then a nonresident is not eligible to be issued a license to hunt bighorn sheep 29 through the state lottery. The Minnesota-Wisconsin chapter of the foundation for North American 30 wild sheep shall hold either a raffle or an auction under rules adopted by the director with 31 residents and nonresidents eligible to participate. Ten percent of gross raffle proceeds may be

1 retained by the Minnesota-Wisconsin chapter of the foundation for North American wild sheep-2 and ninety percent of gross raffle proceeds must be remitted to the department. All auction-3 proceeds must be remitted to the department. Individuals who receive a license through the 4 raffle or auction may not transfer the license. Individuals may participate in the state lottery and 5 the raffle or auction; however, individuals under subsection 4 of section 20.1-05.1-01, but an_ 6 individual may not receive more than one license in any one year. An individual may only 7 receive one license to hunt bighorn sheep through the state lottery in a lifetime. An individual 8 who has been convicted of illegally taking a moose, elk, or bighorn sheep is not eligible to apply 9 for or receive a license under this section. 10 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-08-04.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is 11 amended and reenacted as follows: 12 20.1-08-04.2. Governor's proclamation concerning the hunting of moose - Raffle. 13 The governor may by proclamation provide for a season to hunt moose in a manner, 14 number, places, and times as the governor prescribes. Licenses to hunt moose must be issued 15 by lottery, except as provided under subsection 8 of section 20.1-03-11, with only residents 16 eligible to apply; however, the governor may by proclamation make available to the North-17 American wildlife enforcement memorial museum and educational center and the rocky-18 mountain elk foundation one license per year to hunt moose in a manner, places, and times as-19 the governor prescribes. In addition, the governor may by proclamation make available a-20 license under section 20.1-08-04.13. The North American wildlife enforcement memorial 21 museum and educational center and the rocky mountain elk foundation shall hold a raffle under-22 rules adopted by the director with residents and nonresidents eligible to participate. The person-23 who receives the license from the raffle may not transfer the license. No more than ten percent 24 of the gross proceeds of the raffle may be used to promote the raffle. Fifty percent of all net 25 proceeds must be used for elk management or other wildlife and in conservation-related-26 projects in this state as described under rocky mountain elk foundation policies and objectives. 27 All remaining net proceeds must be used for construction and maintenance of the North-28 American wildlife enforcement memorial museum and educational center located at the 29 international peace garden. The North American wildlife enforcement memorial museum and 30 educational center and the rocky mountain elk foundation shall submit reports concerning the 31 raffle as the director requires. A person may only receive one license to hunt moose issued by

- 1 lottery in a lifetime. An individual who has been convicted of illegally taking a moose, elk, or
- 2 bighorn sheep is not eligible to apply for or receive a license under this section.

3 SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-08-04.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is
 4 amended and reenacted as follows:

5 20.1-08-04.6. Governor's proclamation concerning the hunting of elk - Rocky-

6 mountain elk foundation raffleSpecial elk depredation management licenses.

7 The governor may by proclamation provide for a season to hunt elk in a manner, number, 8 places, and times as the governor prescribes. Licenses to hunt elk must be issued by lottery, 9 except as provided under subsection 7 of section 20.1-03-11, with only residents eligible to 10 apply; however, the governor may by proclamation make available to the rocky mountain elk 11 foundation and the North American wildlife enforcement memorial museum and educational 12 center a license to hunt elk in a manner, places, and times as the governor prescribes. In 13 addition, the governor may by proclamation make available a license under section

14 20.1-08-04.13. The rocky mountain elk foundation and the North American wildlife enforcement

15 memorial museum and educational center shall hold a raffle under rules adopted by the director-

16 with residents and nonresidents eligible to participate. No more than ten percent of the gross-

17 proceeds of the raffle may be used to promote the raffle and fifty percent of all net proceeds-

18 must be used for elk management or other wildlife and conservation-related projects in North-

19 Dakota as described under rocky mountain elk foundation policies and objectives and all-

20 remaining net proceeds must be used for construction and maintenance of the North American-

21 wildlife enforcement memorial museum and educational center located at the international-

22 peace garden. The rocky mountain elk foundation and the North American wildlife enforcement-

23 memorial museum and educational center shall submit reports concerning the raffle as the-

24 director requires.

An owner of farmed elk who is experiencing elk depredation problems may contact the director. Upon investigation, the director may issue special elk depredation management licenses. The governor by proclamation shall establish a procedure to issue elk depredation management licenses in a timely manner.

Except for landowners who receive a license under subsection 7 of section 20.1-03-11 and landowners who receive special elk depredation management licenses issued to landowners under subsection 7 of section 20.1-03-11, and persons who receive a special elk depredation

- 1 management license issued by lottery under this section, a person may only receive one license
- 2 to hunt elk issued by lottery in a lifetime. An individual who has been convicted of illegally taking
- 3 a moose, elk, or bighorn sheep is not eligible to apply for or receive a license under this section.
- 4 SECTION 7. REPEAL. Sections 20.1-08-04.8, 20.1-08-04.12, and 20.1-08-04.13 of the
- 5 North Dakota Century Code are repealed.
- 6 **SECTION 8. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
