1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact atwo new sections to chapter 37-18 of the North

- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to the conferment of a veterans commemorative memorial coin;
- 3 to provide ana continuing appropriation to the department of veterans' affairs; and to provide for
- 4 retroactive application.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

6 SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 37-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
7 and enacted as follows:

9	<u>1.</u>	<u>The</u>	department of veterans' affairs shall create and confer a commemorative
10		mer	norial coin upon a family member of a deceased North Dakota veteran during
11		<u>milit</u>	ary funeral honors for that veteran if the deceased veteran:
12		<u>a.</u>	Served on active duty, in the national guard, or in the selected reserve and
13			departed the armed forces or national guard under conditions other than
14			dishonorable;
15		<u>b.</u>	Completed at least one term of enlistment or period of initial obligated service in
16			the selected reserve and departed under conditions other than dishonorable or
17			was discharged from the selected reserve due to a disability incurred or
18			aggravated in the line of duty;
19		<u>C.</u>	Died while serving on active duty, in the national guard, or in the selected
20			reserve; or
21		<u>d.</u>	Was a member of the commissioned officer corps of the public health service, the
22			national oceanic and atmospheric administration, or a civilian or contractual
23			group of individuals given active duty service determinations and considered a
24			veteran under Public Law No. 95-202.

1	<u>2.</u>	A family member of a deceased North Dakota veteran may purchase a			
2		commemorative memorial coin from the department of veterans' affairs at a cost			
3		determined by the department.			
4	<u>3.</u>	As used in this section "family member" means a spouse, parent, child, or other			
5	1	individual related by blood.

7	fund in t	he state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$8,500, or so much of the sum			
8	as may l	be necessary, and from the funds derived from private donations, the sum of \$25,500,-			
9	or so m i	ich of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of veterans' affairs for the			
10	purpose	of providing funding for at least four thousand commemorative memorial coins for the			
11	biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. Of the funds appropriated, the				
12	department of veterans' affairs shall use up to \$4,000 for the design of the coin.				
13	SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 37-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is created				
14	and enacted as follows:				
15	Commemorative memorial coin fund - Continuing appropriation.				
16	1.	There is created in the state treasury a commemorative memorial coin fund, which			
17		consists of:			
18		a. Any moneys appropriated or transferred to the department of veterans' affairs for			
19		the purposes set forth in section 1 of this Act; and			
20		b. Any gifts, grants, and donations received by the department for the purposes set			
21		forth in section 1 of this Act.			
22	2.	All moneys in the commemorative memorial coin fund are appropriated to the			
23		department of veterans' affairs on a continuing basis for the purposes set forth in			
24		section 1 of this Act.			
25	SEC	TION 3. RETROACTIVE APPLICATION. Subsection 2 of Section 1 of this Act applies			
26	to all fan	to all family members of a deceased veteran, regardless of the date of death of the veteran.
