ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2015

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of 2 corrections and rehabilitation; to provide appropriations to the department of human services for 3 behavioral health services; to create and enact a new section to chapter 12-44.1 and two new 4 sections to chapter 54-23.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to management of 5 inmate population, a community behavioral health plan as a term of parole or an alternative to 6 incarceration, and prioritization of admission of inmates; to provide for a legislative management 7 study studies; to provide for a legislative management justice reinvestment oversight committee; 8 and to provide for a report to the budget section reports.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of corrections and rehabilitation for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of corrections and rehabilitation, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows:

1	SEC	CTION 4. APPROPRIATION - DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. There is			
2	appropriated from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, the sum of				
3	\$7,000,	000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of human services			
4	for the p	purpose of implementing the community behavioral health program, for the biennium			
5	beginniı	ng July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019. The department is authorized six full-time			
6	equivale	ent positions to implement the community behavioral health program.			
7	SEC	CTION 5. APPROPRIATION - REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT -			
8	DEPAR	TMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES.			
9	1.	There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not			
10		otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$500,000, or so much of the sum as may be			
11		necessary, to the department of human services for the purposes of contracting with a			
12		public or private entity to create, initiate, and facilitate the implementation of a strategic			
13		plan to increase the availability of all types of behavioral health services in all regions			
14		of the state, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.			
15	2.	During the 2017-18 interim, the department of human services and the contracting			
16		entity shall make annual reports to the legislative management on the status of the			
17		creation and implementation of this strategic plan, including recommendations			
18		regarding legislation needed for full implementation.			
19	SECTION 6. ESTIMATED INCOME - STRATEGIC INVESTMENT AND IMPROVEMENTS				
20	FUND.	The estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$935,907 of one-time			
21	funding	from the strategic investment and improvements fund for an electronic medical records			
22	system.				
23	SEC	CTION 7. MISSOURI RIVER CORRECTIONAL CENTER - HOUSING UNIT			
24	PURCH	ASE. The appropriation in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$844,000 for the			
25	purchas	e of a thirty-six bed housing unit at the Missouri River correctional center.			
26	SEC	CTION 8. A new section to chapter 12-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created			
27	and ena	acted as follows:			
28	<u>Mai</u>	nagement of inmate population.			
29	<u>1.</u>	The governing body of a correctional facility, in cooperation with law enforcement,			
30		state's attorneys, and the judiciary in the judicial district in which the correctional			

1		facility is located, shall develop an inmate population plan to prioritize admissions and	
2		inmate retention based on the correctional facility's authorized budget.	
3	<u>2.</u>	The inmate population plan must take into consideration:	
4		a. The governing body's authorized budget;	
5		<u>b.</u> <u>The inmate's offense:</u>	
6		c. Whether the inmate has been charged, adjudicated, or sentenced;	
7		d. Whether the inmate presents a risk of flight or is a danger to others or self;	
8		e. The inmate's medical needs and mental and behavioral health needs; and	
9		f. Whether the inmate is subject to mandatory incarceration.	
10	<u>3.</u>	The inmate population plan must include alternatives to physical custody of individuals	
11		under charge or conviction of an offense, including. Potential alternatives to physical	
12		custody include:	
13		a. Placement in a community setting:	
14		<u>b.</u> <u>Work release;</u>	
15		<u>c.</u> <u>Home detention;</u>	
16		d. Electronic home detention;	
17		e. Global positioning system monitoring:	
18		f. Medical, psychiatric, and drug and alcohol treatment;	
19		g. Employment;	
20		h. Pretrial risk assessment; and	
21		i. Pretrial supervision.	
22	<u>4.</u>	This section does not apply when there are exigent circumstances that affect a	
23		correctional facility's operations and inmate population, including acts of God and	
24		mass arrests.	
25	<u>5.</u>	The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall provide technical assistance	
26		relating to the implementation of this section to the governing body of a correctional	
27		facility upon request from the governing body.	
28	SECTION 9. A new section to chapter 54-23.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
29	29 and enacted as follows:		

1	Community behavioral health program - Reports to legislative management and			
2	governor.			
3	<u>1.</u>	The department of corrections and rehabilitation shall establish and implement a		
4		<u>com</u>	<u>ımuni</u>	ty behavioral health program to provide comprehensive community-based
5		<u>ser</u>	ices /	for individuals who have serious behavioral health conditions, as a term and
6		<u>con</u>	dition	of parole under chapter 12-59, and as a sentencing alternative under section
7		<u>12.1</u>	1-32-0	<u>12.</u>
8	<u>2.</u>	<u>In d</u>	evelo	ping the program under this section, the department of corrections and
9		<u>reha</u>	abilita	tion shall collaborate with the department of human services to:
10		<u>a.</u>	<u>Esta</u>	blish a referral and evaluation process for access to the program.
11		<u>b.</u>	<u>Esta</u>	blish eligibility criteria that includes consideration of recidivism risk and
12			<u>beha</u>	avioral health condition severity.
13		<u>C.</u>	<u>Esta</u>	blish discharge criteria and processes, with a goal of establishing a
14			<u>sear</u>	mless transition to postprogram services to decrease recidivism.
15		<u>d.</u>	<u>Dev</u>	elop program oversight, auditing, and evaluation processes that must
16			<u>inclu</u>	<u>ide:</u>
17			(1)	Oversight of case management services through the department of human
18				services;
19			<u>(2)</u>	Outcome and provider reporting metrics; and
20			<u>(3)</u>	Annual reports to the legislative management and the governor on the
21				status of the program.
22		<u>e.</u>	<u>Esta</u>	blish a system through which:
23			(1)	The department of human services:
24				(a) Contracts with and pays behavioral health service providers; and
25				(b) Supervises, supports, and monitors referral caseloads and the
26				provision of services by contract behavioral health service providers.
27			<u>(2)</u>	Contract behavioral health service providers accept all eligible referrals,
28				provide individualized care delivered through integrated multidisciplinary
29				care teams, and continue services on an ongoing basis until discharge
30				criteria are met.

1	(3) Contract behavioral health service providers receive payments on a				
2	per-month per-referral basis. The payment schedule must be based on a				
3	pay-for-performance model that includes consideration of identified				
4	outcomes and the level of services required.				
5	(4) Contract behavioral health service providers bill third-parties for services				
6	and direct payment to the general fund.				
7	3. The department of human services may adopt rules as necessary to implement this				
8	program.				
9	SECTION 10. A new section to chapter 54-23.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
10	Created and enacted as follows:				
11	Prioritization of admission of inmates - Report to legislative management.				
12	The department of corrections and rehabilitation may refuse to admit inmates sentenced to				
13	the physical custody of the department when the admission of inmates will exceed the				
14	maximum operational capacity of the penitentiary and its affiliated facilities and result in the				
15	department exceeding its authorized legislative appropriation for contracting for housing				
16	inmates in other correctional facilities. For purposes of this section, maximum operational				
17	capacity of the department means the total number of inmates that may be imprisoned at the				
18	same time in the penitentiary and its affiliated facilities. The department shall develop a prison				
19	population management plan to prioritize admissions based on sentences and the availability of				
20	space in the penitentiary and its affiliated facilities. The department shall report annually to the				
21	legislative management on the prison population management plan and inmate admissions and				
22	the number of inmates the department has not admitted after sentencing.				
23	SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM				
24	BEHAVIORAL HEALTH NEEDS. During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall				
25	consider continuing its study of alternatives to incarceration, with a focus on the behavioral				
26	health needs of individuals in the criminal justice system. The study must include receipt of				
27	reports on the status, effectiveness, and sustainability of the community behavioral health				
28	program for individuals in the criminal justice system which must include caseload data, any				
29	recognized savings to the department of corrections and rehabilitation, an overview of the				
30	training requirements for contract behavioral health service providers, and recommendations.				

1	The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together with any				
2	legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth legislative assembly.				
3	SECTION 12. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - TOMPKINS REHABILITATION				
4	CENTER. During the 2017-18 interim, the legislative management shall consider studying the				
5	operation, management, conditions, caseload, and physical plant of the Tompkins rehabilitation				
6	center at the state hospital. The study must include the potential transition of the Tompkins				
7	rehabilitation center, including the transfer of the building, employees, and supervision and				
8	management of all operations and caseload of the Tompkins rehabilitation center, from the				
9	department of human services and the state hospital to the department of corrections and				
10	rehabilitation. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations,				
11	together with any legislation required to implement the recommendations, to the sixty-sixth				
12	legislative assembly.				
13	SECTION 13. DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS AND REHABILITATION - YOUTH				
14	CORRECTIONAL CENTER STUDY - BUDGET SECTION REPORT. During the 2017-18				
15	interim, the department of corrections and rehabilitation, in consultation with the department of				
16	human services, the protection and advocacy project, and the supreme court, shall study the				
17	potential for increased community-based treatment services for youth offenders, youth				
18	correctional center staffing requirements, and the efficiency and adequacy of the youth				
19	correctional center facilities. The study must consider the potential to raze and replace the				
20	current facilities at the youth correctional center. The department of corrections and				
21	rehabilitation shall report the results of the study to the budget section of the legislative				
22	management by December 31, 2018.				
23	SECTION 14. JUSTICE REINVESTMENT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE - REPORT TO THE				
24	LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT.				
25	1. During the 2017-18 interim, the justice reinvestment oversight committee is created				
26	and composed of eight members as follows:				
27	a. The governor's general counsel;				
28	b. The director of the department of human services;				
29	c. The director of the behavioral health division of the department of human				
30	services;				
31	d. The director of the department of corrections and rehabilitation;				

1		e. The chief justice of the supreme court, or a designee of the chief justice;
2		f. The attorney general, or a designee of the attorney general;
3		g. One member of the house of representatives, appointed by the majority leader of
4		the house of representatives; and
5		h. One member of the senate, appointed by the majority leader of the senate.
6	2.	The committee shall study the implementation of justice reinvestment policies in the
7		state and periodically report to the legislative management. The governor's office shall
8		provide staff services to the committee.
9	3.	Before July 1, 2018, the committee shall report its findings and recommendations,
10		together with any legislation required to implement those recommendations, to the
11		legislative management.
