## **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2021**

1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the information

2 technology department; and to provide appropriations to certain agencies for an electronic

3 payment processing system; to authorize borrowing authority; to provide for transfers; to

4 provide for a report; to create and enact sections 15-19-01.1, 15-19-01.2, and 15-19-02.1 of the

5 North Dakota Century Code, relating to the centers for distance education; to amend and

6 reenact subsection 1 of section 37-17.3-02.2, section 54-59-31, and subsection 1 of section

7 <u>54-59-34 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the statewide interoperability executive</u>

8 <u>committee, certified electronic health information systems, and the statewide longitudinal data</u>

9 system; and to provide a statement of legislative intent.

## 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the information technology department for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the information technology department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, as follows:

25	for increases in employee health insurance premiums from \$1,130 to \$1,241 per month.			
26	SECTION 3. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO			
27	SIXTY-SIXTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding

14	committees of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the			

15 biennium beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019.

16 SECTION 4. TRANSFERS. Notwithstanding section 54-16-04, the director of the office of 17 management and budget shall make transfers of funds between line items in section 1 of this 18 Act for the information technology department as may be requested by the chief information 19 officer as determined necessary for the development and implementation of information 20 technology projects. 21 SECTION 5. Section 15-19-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted 22 as follows: 23 15-19-01.1. Distance education courses - Course lists to school districts -24 Notification. 25 The center for distance education shall provide, by December thirty-first of each year, a 26 complete list of courses offered by the center to all school districts. Each school district shall 27 notify its students and their parents or guardians of the complete list of courses offered and the 28 school district's policies for course selection and related fees.

SECTION 6. Section 15-19-01.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted
as follows:
