## **ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2186**

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15.1-06 of the North Dakota
- 2 Century Code, relating to the creation of an innovative education program; and to amend and
- 3 reenact section 15.1-06-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to statutory waivers.

## 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-06-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-06-08.1. Statutes Waiver.
- The superintendent of public instruction may not waive any statute, in whole or in part,
  except as provided for in this section.
- 10 2. A school or school district may apply to the superintendent of public instruction for a waiver of section 15.1-21-03, provided if the waiver:
- 12 a. Encourages innovation; and

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- b. Has the potential to result in improved educational opportunities or enhanced
  academic opportunities for the students.
- The initial waiver must be for a specific period of time but may not exceed one year.
- The school district may apply for extensions of the waiver. The first extension may not exceed a period of one year. Additional extensions may not exceed periods of two years.
  - 4.3. If the superintendent of public instruction, after receipt and consideration of an application for a waiver under this section, approves the waiver, the superintendent shall file a report with the legislative council. The report must provide a detailed account of the reasons for which the waiver was granted and the specific time period for the waiver. If the superintendent of public instruction denies an application for a waiver under this section, the superintendent shall file a notice of denial with the

1		legislative council. If requested, the superintendent shall appear and respond to
2		questions regarding the approval or denial of any application for a waiver under this
3		section.
4	<del>5.</del> 4.	The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules governing the submission
5		and evaluation of applications and the monitoring of any school or school district that
6		receives a waiver under this section.
7	SEC	TION 2. A new section to chapter 15.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
8	and ena	cted as follows:
9	<u>Inno</u>	vative education program - Participation - Reports to legislative management.
10	<u>1.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction shall adopt rules to administer this section and
11		develop criteria for the submission, approval, and evaluation of the proposals and
12		plans under this section.
13	<u>2.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction may accept a proposal from any public or
14		nonpublic school, upon approval by the local school board or governing board, for
15		participation in an innovative education program. The proposal must specify the
16		innovations to be pursued at the school or school district level and the manner in
17		which the proposal will:
18		a. Improve the delivery of education;
19		b. Improve the administration of education;
20		c. Provide increased educational opportunities for students; or
21		d. Improve the academic success of students.
22	<u>3.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction may approve the proposal, reject the
23		proposal, or work with the submitting school to modify the proposal.
24	<u>4.</u>	During the school's initial year of participation in the innovative education program, the
25		school shall develop a comprehensive implementation plan and work with the
26		superintendent of public instruction to ensure the long-term viability of the proposal.
27	<u>5.</u>	The superintendent of public instruction may approve the comprehensive
28		implementation plan developed under subsection 4 for a period of up to five years. If,
29		due to a change in circumstances, there is a determination by either the school or the
30		superintendent of public instruction that modifications to the comprehensive

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- 1 implementation plan are necessary, the school and the superintendent of public 2 instruction shall work with each other to achieve the necessary modifications.
- 3 <u>6.</u> Beginning in the initial year of the implementation of the program, the superintendent of public instruction may provide the school with a waiver of any state statute or rule or 5 provide authorization necessary for implementation of the plan.
  - The superintendent of public instruction may revoke any waiver or authorization <u>7.</u> granted under this section if the superintendent of public instruction determines the school has failed to perform in accordance with the agreed upon terms of the program or failed to meet the requirements of this section.
  - Any school participating in the program shall provide program evaluation data to the 8. superintendent of public instruction at the time and in the manner requested by the superintendent of public instruction.
- 13 9. The superintendent of public instruction shall provide periodic reports to the legislative 14 management regarding the innovative education program.
