10		<u>a.</u>	<u>"Ph</u>	armacy benefits manager" has the same meaning as in section 19-03.6-01.		
11		<u>b.</u>	<u>"Pla</u>	in sponsor" has the same meaning as in section 19-03.6-01.		
12		<u>C.</u>	<u>"Sp</u>	ecialty drug" means a prescription drug that:		
13			<u>(1)</u>	Is not available for order or purchase by a retail community pharmacy and		
14				long-term care pharmacy, regardless of whether the drug is meant to be		
15				self-administered; and		
16			<u>(2)</u>	Requires special storage and has distribution or inventory limitations not		
17				available at a retail community pharmacy or long-term care pharmacy.

19	<u>2.</u>	<u>If re</u>	If requested by a plan sponsor contracted payer, a pharmacy benefits manager or			
20		third-party payer that has an ownership interest, either directly or through an affiliate or				
21		subsidiary, in a pharmacy shall disclose to the plan sponsor contracted payer any				
22		difference between the amount paid to a pharmacy and the amount charged to the				
23		plan sponsor contracted payer.				

A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 19-02.1 of the North Dakota

1	<u>3.</u>	A pharmacy benefits manager or a pharmacy benefits manager's affiliates or			
2		subsidiaries may not own or have an ownership interest in a patient assistance			
3		program and a mail order specialty pharmacy, unless the pharmacy benefits manager,			
4		affiliate, or subsidiary agrees to not participate in a transaction that benefits the			
5		pharmacy benefits manager, affiliate, or subsidiary instead of another person owed a			
6		fiduciary duty.			
7	<u>4.</u>	A pharmacy benefits manager or third-party payer may not require pharmacy			
8		accreditation standards or recertification requirements to participate in a network			
9		which are inconsistent with, more stringent than, or in addition to the federal and state			
0		requirements for licensure as a pharmacy in this state.			
11	<u>5.</u>	A licensed pharmacy or pharmacist may dispense any and all drugs allowed under			
2		that license.			
3	<u>6.</u>	A pharmacy benefits manager or other third-party payer that violates this section is			
4		guilty of a class B misdemeanor for each violation occurrence.			
5	SECTION 2. APPLICATION. This Act applies to contracts and agreements in effect on and				
6	after the effective date of this Act.
