# HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3004

- 1 A concurrent resolution to amend and reenact section 2 of article V, section 3 of article IX, and
- 2 sections 12, 25, and 26 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota, relating to the state
- 3 treasurer; and to provide an effective date.

### STATEMENT OF INTENT

5 This amendment removes the state treasurer as an elected constitutional officer effective

6 January 1, 2021.

# 7 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF NORTH DAKOTA,

## 8 THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

9 That the following proposed amendments to section 2 of article V, section 3 of article IX,

10 and sections 12, 25, and 26 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota are agreed to and

11 must be submitted to the qualified electors of North Dakota at the general election to be held in

12 2018, in accordance with section 16 of article IV of the Constitution of North Dakota.

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 2 of article V of the Constitution of North Dakota is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

15 **Section 2.** The qualified electors of the state at the times and places of choosing members

16 of the legislative assembly shall choose a governor, lieutenant governor, agriculture

17 commissioner, attorney general, auditor, insurance commissioner, three public service

18 commissioners, secretary of state, superintendent of public instruction, and tax commissioner,-

19 and treasurer. The legislative assembly may by law provide for a department of labor to be

20 administered by a public official who may be either elected or appointed.

21 The powers and duties of the agriculture commissioner, attorney general, auditor, insurance

22 commissioner, public service commissioners, secretary of state, superintendent of public

instruction, <u>and</u> tax commissioner<del>, and treasurer</del> must be prescribed by law. If the legislative

assembly establishes a labor department, the powers and duties of the officer administering that

25 department must be prescribed by law.

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SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 3 of article IX of the Constitution of North Dakota is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

Section 3. The superintendent of public instruction, governor, attorney general, and secretary of state and state treasurercomprise a board of commissioners, to be denominated the "board of university and school lands". Subject to the provisions of this article and any law that may be passed by the legislative assembly, the board has control of the appraisement, sale, rental, and disposal of all school and university lands, and the proceeds from the sale of such lands shallmust be invested as provided by law.

9 SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 12 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota is
10 amended and reenacted as follows:

#### 11 Section 12.

12 1. All public moneys, from whatever source derived, shallmust be paid over monthly by 13 the public official, employee, agent, director, manager, board, bureau, or institution of 14 the state receiving the same, to the state treasurer proper official as provided by law, 15 and deposited by himthat official to the credit of the state, and shall be paid out and 16 disbursed only pursuant to appropriation first made by the legislaturelegislative 17 assembly; provided, however, that there is hereby appropriated the necessary funds 18 required in the financial transactions of the Bank of North Dakota, and required for the 19 payment of losses, duly approved, payable from the state hail insurance fund, state 20 bonding fund, and state fire and tornado fund, and required for the payment of 21 compensation to injured employees or death claims, duly approved, payable from the 22 workmen's compensation workforce safety and insurance fund, and required for 23 authorized investments made by the board of university and school lands, and 24 required for the financial operations of the state mill and elevator association, and 25 required for the payment of interest and principal of bonds and other fixed obligations 26 of the state, and required for payments required by law to be paid to beneficiaries of 27 the teachers' insurance andfund for retirement fund, and required for refunds made 28 under the provisions of the Retail Sales Tax Act, and the State Income Tax Law, and 29 the State Gasoline Tax Law, and the Estate and Succession Tax Lawsales and use 30 tax, income tax, motor vehicle and special fuels tax, and estate tax laws, and the 31 income of any state institution derived from permanent trust funds, and the funds

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1 allocated under the law to the state highway department of transportation and the 2 various counties for the construction, reconstruction, and maintenance of public roads. 3 This constitutional amendment shalldoes not be construed to apply to fees and 4 moneys received in connection with the licensing and organization of physicians and 5 surgeons, pharmacists, dentists, osteopaths, optometrists, embalmers, barbers, 6 lawyers, veterinarians, nurses, chiropractors, accountants, architects, hairdressers, 7 chiropodists, and other similarly organized, licensed trades and professions; and this-8 constitutional amendment shall not be construed to amend or repeal existing laws or 9 Acts amendatory thereof concerning such fees and moneys. 10 2. No bills, claims, accounts, or demands against the state or any county or other political 11 subdivision shallmay be audited, allowed, or paid until a full itemized statement in

writing shall beis filed with the officer or officers whose duty it may beis to audit the
same, and then only upon warrant drawn upon the treasurercustodian of such the
funds by the proper officer or officers.

15 3. This amendment shall become effective on July 1, 1939.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 25 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota is
 amended and reenacted as follows:

18 Section 25. The veterans' postwar trust fund shall beis a permanent trust fund of the state 19 of North Dakota and shall consist consists of moneys transferred or credited to the fund as 20 authorized by legislative enactment. Investment of the fund shall beis the responsibility of the 21 state treasurer who shall have full authority to invest the fund only in the same manner as the 22 state investment boardis authorized to make investments. All income received from investments 23 is tomust be utilized for programs which must be of benefit and service to veterans, who are 24 defined by legislative enactment, or their dependents, and such income is hereby appropriated 25 to the administrative committee on veterans' affairs on a continuing basis for expenditure upon 26 those programs selected at the discretion of the administrative committee on veterans' affairs. 27 SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 26 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota is

amended and reenacted as follows:

29 Section 26.

Thirty percent of total revenue derived from taxes on oil and gas production or
 extraction must be transferred by the state treasurer to a special fund in the state

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- treasury known as the legacy fund. The legislative assembly may transfer funds from
   any source into the legacy fund and such transfers become part of the principal of the
   legacy fund.
- 4 2. The principal and earnings of the legacy fund may not be expended until after-
- 5 June 30, 2017, and anAn expenditure of principal after that datefrom the legacy fund 6 requires a vote of at least two-thirds of the members elected to each house of the 7 legislative assembly. Not more than fifteen percent of the principal of the legacy fund 8 may be expended during a biennium.
- 9 3. Statutory programs, in existence as a result of legislation enacted through 2009,
- providing for impact grants, direct revenue allocations to political subdivisions, and
   deposits in the oil and gas research fund must remain in effect but the legislative
   assembly may adjust statutory allocations for those purposes.
- 13 <u>4.</u> The state investment board shall invest the principal of the North Dakota legacy fund.
   14 The state treasurerproper official as provided by law shall transfer earnings of the
   15 North Dakota legacy fund accruing after June 30, 2017, to the state general fund at the
   16 end of each biennium.

# SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE. If approved by the voters, this measure becomes effective January 1, 2021.
