- A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 12-60-24 and sections 43-18-12.1, 43-18.1-04.1, and 43-18.2-07.1, relating to criminal history record checks
- 3 for plumbers, water conditioning contractors and installers, and sewer and water installers; and
- 4 to amend and reenact section 43-18-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 5 temporary licenses for plumbers pending criminal history record checks.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new subdivision to subsection 2 of section 12-60-24 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 9 The state board of plumbing for applicants; apprentices; licensees; or
- investigations under chapters 43-18, 43-18.1, and 43-18.2, except that criminal
- 11 <u>history checks need not be made unless required by the board.</u>
- 12 **SECTION 2.** Section 43-18-12.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:
- 14 43-18-12.1. Criminal history record checks.
- The board may require any applicant, apprentice, or licensee under this chapter to submit to
 a statewide and nationwide criminal history record check. The nationwide criminal history record
 check must be conducted in the manner provided by section 12-60-24. All costs associated with
 obtaining a background check are the responsibility of the applicant, apprentice, or licensee.
- SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-18-15 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
 - 43-18-15. Temporary license When issued.
 - 1. The board, upon the payment of the regular examination license fee, may issue a temporary permit to engage in the business of master plumber or journeyman plumber, or both, to any personapplicant who furnishes satisfactory evidence of the

1 person's applicant's qualifications. Such permits are revocable permits and are 2 effective to December thirty-first of the year in which they are issued. No personAn 3 applicant may not be issued sucha temporary permitspermit for longer than four years. 4 2. The board, upon the payment of the regular license fee, may issue a temporary permit 5 allowing an applicant to engage in the business of master plumber or journeyman 6 plumber, or both, pending completion of a criminal history record check, to any 7 applicant who otherwise furnishes satisfactory evidence of the applicant's 8 qualifications. An applicant may not be issued a temporary permit for longer than sixty 9 days, at which time the temporary permit expires automatically unless the board 10 grants the applicant a regular license. 11 SECTION 4. Section 43-18.1-04.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 12 enacted as follows: 13 43-18.1-04.1. Criminal history record checks. 14 The board may require any applicant, apprentice, or licensee under this chapter to submit to 15 a statewide and nationwide criminal history record check. The nationwide criminal history record 16 check must be conducted in the manner provided by section 12-60-24. All costs associated with 17 obtaining a background check are the responsibility of the applicant, apprentice, or licensee. 18 SECTION 5. Section 43-18.2-07.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and 19 enacted as follows: 20 43-18.2-07.1. Criminal history record checks. 21 The board may require any applicant, apprentice, or licensee under this chapter to submit to 22 a statewide and nationwide criminal history record check. The nationwide criminal history record 23 check must be conducted in the manner provided by section 12-60-24. All costs associated with 24 obtaining a background check are the responsibility of the applicant, apprentice, or licensee.
