A quorum was declared by the President.

REMARKS OF SENATOR LAFFEN

MR. PRESIDENT: I'd like to go back in time to Wednesday, March 4th, 2015. On that day, the good Senator from District 5 of Minot, in that very desk in front of him, gave a "rousing" 4th order floor speech, as only he can do. He congratulated the Minot boys hockey team on winning the 2015 state high school hockey championship by defeating Grand Forks Red River 2-1. Mr. President, some of us might have considered the title game to be an upset, but the Minot goalie stood on his head and carried the Magicians to their 2nd state championship. Mr. President, you weren't here then, but those who were will remember there was just a little bit of good natured ribbing from the Minot Senator in that seat to his Grand Forks' desk mate in that seat.

Mr. President, lets fast forward to Saturday, February 27th, 2016. On this date, those same Red River Roughriders not only got back to the title game, but this time they finished the job by defeating Bismarck High. That game completed an amazing 27-0 undefeated season as the team from Grand Forks captured the 2016 State Hockey title. The entire season was one great performance after another as the Roughriders won their 17th hockey title. A one year belated congratulations to Grand Forks Red River.

Mr. President, I'd like to fast forward one more time, to last Saturday night where a different Grand Forks School, the Grand Forks Central High Knights, completed their own perfect 27-0 undefeated season by defeating Bismarck High to win this year's 2017 State High School Hockey title. Mr. President, this was Central Highs 26th state hockey title. Congratulations to the Grand Forks Central High School Knights.

"SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 43-12.1-09.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

43-12.1-09.1. Nursing licensure or registration - Criminal history record checks.

The board shall require each applicant for initial licensure and registration, including applicants for a multistate license under section 2 of this Act, to submit to a statewide and nationwide criminal history record check. The board may require any licensee or registrant who is renewing a license or registration, including renewal of a multistate license under section 2 of this Act, and any licensee or registrant who is the subject of a disciplinary investigation or proceeding to submit to a statewide and nationwide criminal history record check. The nationwide criminal history record check must be conducted in the manner provided by section 12-60-24. All costs associated with obtaining a background check are the responsibility of the applicant, licensee, or registrant. The board may grant a nonrenewable temporary permit to an applicant for initial or renewed license or registration who submits to a criminal history record check as required by this chapter if the applicant has met all other licensure or registration requirements in accordance with subsection 2 of section 43-12.1-09. The board may not share with, or disclose to, the interstate commission of nurse licensure compact administrators any contents of a nationwide criminal history record check."
