- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 12.1-21-06 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to tampering with or damaging a critical infrastructure facility or a public service; and to
- 3 provide a penalty.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

5 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 12.1-21-06 of the North Dakota Century Code is

6 amended and reenacted as follows:

7 12.1-21-06. Tampering with or damaging <u>a critical infrastructure facility or</u> a public 8 service <u>- Penalty</u>.

- 9 1. A person is guilty of an offense if he causes<u>An individual may not cause</u> a substantial
 interruption or impairment of a public communication, transportation, supply of water,
 11 gas, power, or othercritical infrastructure facility or a public service by:
- 12 a. Tampering with or damaging the tangible property of another;
- b. Incapacitating an operator of such a critical infrastructure facility or a public
 service; or
- c. Negligently damaging the tangible property of another by fire, explosive, or other
 dangerous means.Damaging, destroying, vandalizing, defacing, or tampering
 with equipment in a critical infrastructure facility;
- 18d.Damaging, destroying, vandalizing, defacing, impeding, inhibiting, or tampering19with the operations of a critical infrastructure facility; or
- 20 <u>e.</u> Interfering, inhibiting, impeding, or preventing the construction or repair of a
 21 <u>critical infrastructure facility.</u>
- The offense<u>A violation of this section</u> is a class C felony if the actor engages in the
 conduct intentionally and a class A misdemeanor if the actor engages in the conduct
 knowingly or recklessly. Otherwise it is a class B misdemeanor.

11	<u>5.</u>	As used in this section, "critical infrastructure facility" includes:		
12		<u>a.</u>	A petroleum or alumina refinery;	
13		<u>b.</u>	An electrical power generating facility, substation, switching station, electrical	
14			control center, or electric power line and associated equipment infrastructure;	
15		<u>C.</u>	A chemical, polymer, or rubber manufacturing facility;	
16		<u>d.</u>	A water intake structure, water treatment facility, wastewater treatment plant,	
17			ground water monitoring well, water well, or pump station;	
18		<u>e.</u>	A natural gas compressor station;	
19		<u>f.</u>	A liquid natural gas terminal or storage facility;	
20		<u>g.</u>	A telecommunications central switching office Wireline telecommunications and	
21			internet infrastructure, including central offices, fiber optic lines, cable lines, and	
22			all additional equipment associated with the provision of broadband or	
23			telecommunication services;	
24		<u>h.</u>	Wireless telecommunications infrastructure, including a cell tower, telephone pole	
25			or line, including a fiber optic line;	
26		<u>i.</u>	A port, railroad switching yard, railroad track, trucking terminal, or other freight	
27			transportation facility:	
28		<u>j.</u>	A gas processing plant, including a plant used in the processing, treatment, or	
29			fractionation of natural gas or a natural gas liquid;	
30		<u>k.</u>	A transmission facility used by a federally licensed radio or television station;	
31		<u>l.</u>	A steel-making facility using an electric arc furnace to make steel;	

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1	<u>m.</u>	A facility identified and regulated by the United States department of homeland
2		security chemical facility anti-terrorism standards program;
3	<u>n.</u>	A dam regulated by the state or federal government;
4	<u>0.</u>	A natural gas transmission or distribution utility facility, including a pipeline
5		interconnection, a city gate or town border station, a metering station, below or
6		aboveground piping, a regulator station, and a natural gas storage facility;
7	<u>p.</u>	A crude oil or refined product storage and distribution facility, including a valve
8		site, pipeline interconnection, pump station, metering station, below or
9		aboveground pipeline or piping, and a truck loading or offloading facility;
10	<u>q.</u>	Any below or aboveground portion of an oil, gas, hazardous liquid, or chemical
11		pipeline, tank, railroad facility, or other storage facility;-and
12	<u>r.</u>	An oil and gas production site; and
13	S.	A site or location designated or approved for the construction of a facility
14		described in this subsection.
