1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the legislative branch

2 of state government; to provide for applications, transfers, and cancellation of unexpended

3 appropriations; to amend and reenact sections 54-03-20 and 54-35-10 of the North Dakota

4 <u>Century Code, relating to legislative compensation; to provide for a report; to provide an</u>

5 <u>effective date;</u> and to declare an emergency.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from the insurance
regulatory trust fund and the capitol building fund, not otherwise appropriated, to the legislative
branch of state government for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the legislative branch
of state government, for the fiscal period beginning with the effective date of this Act and ending
June 30, 2021, as follows:

The 2019-21 biennium one-time funding amounts are not part of the entity's base budget for the 2021-23 biennium. The legislative council shall report to the appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

7 SECTION 4. ESTIMATED INCOME - CAPITOL BUILDING FUND. The estimated income
 8 line item in subdivision 1 of section 1 of this Act includes \$140,000 from the capitol building fund
 9 for digital signage replacement and voting system upgrades for the biennium beginning July 1,
 10 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

11 **SECTION 5. TRANSFERS.** Notwithstanding section 54-16-05, the director of the office of 12 management and budget shall transfer appropriation authority between line items of the 13 legislative management and legislative council as may be requested by the chairman of the 14 legislative management or the director of the legislative council upon the finding by the 15 chairman or the director that the nature of studies and duties assigned to the legislative 16 management or legislative council requires the transfers in properly carrying on the legislative 17 management's and legislative council's functions and duties. The director of the office of 18 management and budget shall similarly make transfers of appropriation authority between the 19 line items for the sixty-sixth and sixty-seventh legislative assemblies, upon request by the 20 chairman of the legislative management or the director of the legislative council upon the finding 21 by the chairman or director that the transfers are required for the legislative assembly to carry 22 on its functions and duties.

23 SECTION 6. APPLICATION, TRANSFER AUTHORITY, AND CANCELLATION OF

24 **UNEXPENDED APPROPRIATIONS.** Sections 54-16-04 and 54-44.1-11 do not apply to 25 chapter 26 of the 2017 Session Laws. The director of the office of management and budget 26 shall make transfers of appropriation authority between the line items and the agencies of the 27 legislative branch within section 1 of that chapter as requested by the chairman of the legislative 28 management or the director of the legislative council. The office of management and budget 29 shall cancel unexpended appropriations for the legislative assembly and legislative council 30 enacted prior to the 2017-19 biennium as directed by the chairman of the legislative 31 management or the director of the legislative council.

7		lodging and whose place of residence in the legislative district that the member

11		legislative assembly when it is in session and may receive reimbursement for
12		lodging at the place of meeting of the legislative assembly as provided in section
13		44-08-04 for each calendar day for which round trip travel reimbursement is not
14		claimed, provided that the total reimbursement may not exceed the maximum
15		monthly reimbursement allowed under subdivision a of subsection 2.
16	4.	The amount to which each legislator is entitled must be paid following the
17		organizational session in December and each month upon submission of a voucher
18		and appropriate documentation during a regular or special session, consistent with
19		section 26 of article XI of the constitution of North Dakota.
20	5.	If during a special session, the legislative assembly adjourns for more than three days,
21		a member of the legislative assembly is entitled to receive compensation during those
22		days only while in attendance at a standing committee if the legislator is a member of
23		that committee, a majority or minority leader, or a legislator who is not on that
24		committee but who has the approval of a majority or minority leader to attend.
25	6.	A day, or portion of a day, spent in traveling to or returning from an organizational,
26		special, or regular session or a legislative committee meeting must be included as a
27		calendar day during a legislative session or as a day of a legislative committee
28		meeting for the purposes of this section.
29	7.	a. In addition, each member is entitled to receive during the term for which the
30		member was elected, as compensation for the execution of public duties during

1		the biennium, the sum of four <u>five</u> hundred ninety-five five dollars a month, paid
2		monthly.
3		b. If a member dies or resigns from office during the member's term, the member
4		may be paid only the allowances provided for in this section for the period for
5		which the member was actually a member.
6		c. The majority and minority leaders of the house and senate and the chairman of
7		the legislative management, if the chairman is not a majority or minority leader,
8		are each entitled to receive as compensation, in addition to any other
9		compensation or expense reimbursement provided by law, the sum of three
10		hundred fifty-fivesixty-two dollars per month during the biennium for their
11		execution of public duties.

14		section and compensation and expense allowances must be excluded from gross

31		lodging, which may not exceed per calendar month the amount established under

2		lodging in state and which may not exceed the rate provided in section 44-08-04
3		for each calendar day during the period of any organizational, special, or regular

29		execution of public duties.

1		section and compensation and expense allowances must be excluded from gross
2		income for income tax purposes to the extent permitted for federal income tax
3		purposes under section 127 of the Economic Recovery Tax Act of 1981 [Pub. L. 97-34;
4		95 Stat. 202; 26 U.S.C. 162(i)].
5	9.	Before each regular legislative session, the legislative management shall make
6		recommendations and submit any necessary legislation to adjust legislative
7		compensation amounts.
8	SEC	CTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
9	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:
10	54-3	35-10. Compensation of members and leadership.
11	1.	The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
12		the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
13		attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
14		of one hundred seventy-seveneighty-one dollars per day and must also be paid for
15		expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official
16		duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.
17	2.	In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
18		legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
19		spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
20		and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
21		receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
22		management or of the committee which the person chairs.
23	SEC	CTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is
24	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:
25	54-3	35-10. Compensation of members and leadership.
26	1.	The members of the legislative management and the members of any committee of
27		the legislative management are entitled to be compensated for the time spent in
28		attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees at the rate
29		of one hundred eighty-oneeighty-five dollars per day and must also be paid for
30		expenses incurred in attending said meetings and in the performance of their official
31		duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers.

1	2.	In addition to the compensation provided in subsection 1, the chairman of the
2		legislative management is entitled to receive an additional five dollars for each day
3		spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative management and of its committees,
4		and the chairman of each of the legislative management's committees is entitled to
5		receive five dollars for each day spent in attendance at sessions of the legislative
6		management or of the committee which the person chairs.
7	SEC	CTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE. Sections 7 and 9 of this Act become effective on July 1,
8	2019, a	nd sections 8 and 10 of this Act become effective on July 1, 2020.
9	SEC	CTION 12. EMERGENCY. This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
