- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the state department
- 2 of health; to amend and reenact section 23-02.1-29 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating
- 3 to vital records fees; to provide a statement of legislative intent; to provide a report; and to
- 4 <u>declare an emergency</u>.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the state department of health for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the state department of health, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021,

- f. A search of the files or records when no copy is made.
- g. A noncertified informational copy of a death or marriage record.
 The fee for each additional copy of the same document, a death or fetal death record, requested at the same time, may not exceed twoten dollars.
- Except as otherwise provided in subsection 3, fees collected under this section by the state registrar must be deposited in the general fund of this state operating fund of the state department of health, according to procedures established by the state treasurer.
- 3. The state department of health shall charge a feequarterly pay fees in the amount of two dollars for the issuance of each certified copy of a birth record, in addition to those fees authorized by subsection 1, in the amount of two dollars for the issuance of each certified copy of a birth record. This additional fee must be paid to the state registrar prior to the issuance of each certified copy of a birth record. The state registrar shall quarterly pay the additional fees collected pursuant to this subsection into the children's trust fund created by section 50-27-01.
- 4. All fees collected in excess of the fees appropriated must be transferred to the general fund of this state at the end of each biennium.

SECTION 6. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - LIFE SAFETY PLAN REVIEW FEES. It is the intent of the sixty-sixth legislative assembly that the state department of health reduce the minimum fee charged for life safety construction or renovation plans review of small projects for facilities from \$750 to \$500.

SECTION 7. EMERGENCY. The sum of \$450,000, of which \$90,000 is from the general fund and \$360,000 is from other funds, for microbiology laboratory technology upgrades appropriated in section 1 of this Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
