1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service

2 commission; to amend and reenact sections 49-01-05 and 57-43.2-19 of the North Dakota

3 Century Code, relating to the salary of the commissioners and the transfer, deposit, and

4 distribution of funds in the highway tax distribution fund; to provide for a study; to provide for a-

5 **report**reports; and to provide for a transfer.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds
as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state
treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and
other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the
public service commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021,
as follows:

15 SECTION 2. ONE-TIME FUNDING - EFFECT ON BASE BUDGET - REPORT TO SIXTY-

SEVENTH LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY. The following amounts reflect the one-time funding
items approved by the sixty-fifth legislative assembly for the 2017-19 biennium and the 2019-21

24 The 2019-21 biennium one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget

25 for the 2021-23 biennium. The public service commission shall report to the appropriations

committees of the sixty-seventh legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the

biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021.

28 SECTION 3. TRANSFER AND REPAYMENT - BEGINNING FARMER REVOLVING LOAN

FUND. The Bank of North Dakota shall transfer from the beginning farmer revolving loan fund to

30 the public service commission the sum of \$900,000, or so much of the sum as may be

31 necessary, included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act to pay for costs

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1 associated with a rail rate complaint case. Transfers must be made during the biennium

2 beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, upon order of the commission. If any

3 amounts are spent pursuant to this section, the public service commission shall reimburse the

4 beginning farmer revolving loan fund using amounts available from damages or proceeds

5 received, net of legal fees, from a successful outcome of a rail complaint case.

6 SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is

7 amended and reenacted as follows:

8 **49-01-05. Salary of commissioners.**

9 The annual salary of a commissioner is one hundred fiveten thousand foureight hundred

10 <u>ninety-onetwenty-nine</u> dollars through June 30, 20162020, and one hundred

11 eight<u>fourteenthirteen</u> thousand six<u>one</u> hundred-fifty-six<u>fifty-four</u> dollars thereafter. All fees

12 received or charged by any commissioner for any act or service rendered in any official capacity

13 must be accounted for and paid over by the commissioner monthly to the state treasurer and

14 must be credited to the general fund of the state.

SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 57-43.2-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

57-43.2-19. Transfer, deposit, and distribution of funds. (Effective July 1, 2015,
through June 30, 2019)2021)

All taxes, license fees, penalties, and interest collected under this chapter must be transferred to the state treasurer who shall deposit moneys in a highway tax distribution fund, except all special fuels excise taxes collected on sales of diesel fuel to a railroad under section 57-43.2-03 of up to two hundred eighty-fiveninety-four thousand six hundred fifty-fivefive hundred nine dollars per year must be transferred to the state treasurer who shall deposit the moneys in the rail safety fund. The highway tax distribution fund must be distributed in the manner as prescribed by section 54-27-19.

 taxes, license fees, penalties, and interest collected under this chapter must be transferred to
 the state treasurer who shall deposit moneys in the highway tax distribution fund. The highway
 tax distribution fund must be distributed in the manner as prescribed by section 54-27-19.
 SECTION 6. RAILROAD INSPECTION STUDY. During the 2019-20 interim, the public

31 service commission shall study technology available to create efficiencies to reduce costs for

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- 1 railroad equipment and track inspections. The commission shall report its findings and any
- 2 related budget recommendations to the appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh
- 3 legislative assembly.
