- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the public service
- 2 commission; to amend and reenact sections 49-01-05 and 57-43.2-19 of the North Dakota
- 3 Century Code, relating to the salary of the commissioners and the transfer, deposit, and
- 4 distribution of funds in the highway tax distribution fund; to provide for a study; to provide for a
- 5 report; and to provide for a transfer.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7 **SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION.** The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 8 as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state 9 treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and 10 other income, to the public service commission for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 11 public service commission, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, 12 as follows:

16	SECTION 3. TRANSFER AND RE	PAYMENT - BEGINNIN	IG FARMER REVO	OLVING LOAN	
17	FUND. The Bank of North Dakota shall transfer from the beginning farmer revolving loan fund to				
18	the public service commission the sum of \$900,000, or so much of the sum as may be				
19	necessary, included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act to pay for costs				
20	associated with a rail rate complaint case. Transfers must be made during the biennium				
21	beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2021, upon order of the commission. If any				
22	amounts are spent pursuant to this section, the public service commission shall reimburse the				
23	beginning farmer revolving loan fund using amounts available from damages or proceeds				
24	received, net of legal fees, from a succ	essful outcome of a rail	complaint case.		
25	SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - 0	GRAIN INSOLVENCY L	ITIGATION. There	e is

1	SECTION 5. AMENDMENT. Section 49-01-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is
2	amended and reenacted as follows:
3	49-01-05. Salary of commissioners.
4	The annual salary of a commissioner is one hundred fiveten thousand foureight hundred
5	ninety-onetwenty-nine dollars through June 30, 20162020, and one hundred eightthirteen
6	thousand six hundred fifty-six dollars thereafter. All fees received or charged by any
7	commissioner for any act or service rendered in any official capacity must be accounted for and
8	paid over by the commissioner monthly to the state treasurer and must be credited to the
9	general fund of the state.
10	SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 57-43.2-19 of the North Dakota Century Code is
11	amended and reenacted as follows:
12	57-43.2-19. Transfer, deposit, and distribution of funds. (Effective July 1, 2015,
13	through June 30, 2019) 2021)
14	All taxes, license fees, penalties, and interest collected under this chapter must be
15	transferred to the state treasurer who shall deposit moneys in a highway tax distribution fund,
16	except all special fuels excise taxes collected on sales of diesel fuel to a railroad under section
17	57-43.2-03 of up to two hundred eighty-fiveninety-four thousand five hundred nine dollars per
18	year must be transferred to the state treasurer who shall deposit the moneys in the rail safety
19	fund. The highway tax distribution fund must be distributed in the manner as prescribed by
20	section 54-27-19.
21	Transfer, deposit, and distribution of funds. (Effective after June 30, 2019) 2021) All
22	taxes, license fees, penalties, and interest collected under this chapter must be transferred to
23	the state treasurer who shall deposit moneys in the highway tax distribution fund. The highway
24	tax distribution fund must be distributed in the manner as prescribed by section 54-27-19.
25	SECTION 7. RAILROAD INSPECTION STUDY. During the 2019-20 interim, the public
26	service commission shall study technology available to create efficiencies to reduce costs for
27	railroad equipment and track inspections. The commission shall report its findings and any
28	related budget recommendations to the appropriations committees of the sixty-seventh
29	legislative assembly.
