- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 39-06.1-06 and section
- 2 39-21-41.4 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the amount of statutory fees and the
- 3 use of safety belts; to repeal section 39-21-41.5 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
- 4 secondary enforcement of safety belt requirements; and to provide a penalty.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 2 of section 39-06.1-06 of the North Dakota
 Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 2. For a moving violation as defined in section 39-06.1-09, a fee of twenty dollars, except for:
- a. A violation of section 39-10-26, 39-10-26.2, 39-10-41, or 39-10-42, or 39-21-41.4,
 a fee of fifty dollars.
- b. A violation of section 39-10-05 involving failure to yield to a pedestrian or
 subsection 1 of section 39-10-28, a fee of fifty dollars.
- 14 c. A violation of section 39-21-41.2, a fee of twenty-five dollars.
- d. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-12-02, section 39-08-23, or section
 39-08-25, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- e. A violation of subdivision d of subsection 1 of section 39-12-04, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- f. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-04-37 by an individual by becoming a resident of this state, a fee of one hundred dollars.
- g. A violation of subsection 2 of section 39-10-21.1, a fee of two hundred fifty dollars.
- h. A violation of section 39-10-59, a fee of five hundred dollars.
- i. A violation of section 39-09-01, a fee of thirty dollars.

1	j. A violation of section 39-09-01.1, a fee of thirty dollars.
2	k. A violation of section 39-10-46 or 39-10-46.1, a fee of one hundred dollars.
3	I. A violation of subsection 1 of section 39-08-20, one hundred fifty dollars for a first
4	violation and three hundred dollars for a second or subsequent violation in three
5	years.
6	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 39-21-41.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is
7	amended and reenacted as follows:
8	39-21-41.4. Use of safety belts required in certain motor vehicles - Enforcement -
9	Evidence.
10	Subject to the limitations of this section and section 39-21-41.5, a
11	1. A driver may not operate upon a highway a motor vehicle designed for carrying fewer
12	than eleven passengers, which was originally manufactured with safety belts unless
13	each front seat occupant is wearing a properly adjusted and fastened safety belt.
14	2This section does not apply to-a:
15	a. A child in a child restraint or safety belt in accordance with section 39-21-41.2; to-
16	drivers
17	b. <u>Drivers</u> of implements of husbandry; to operators
18	<u>c. Operators</u> of farm vehicles as defined in subsection 5 of section 39-04-19; to
19	rural mail
20	<u>d. Rural-mail</u> carriers while on duty delivering mail; to an
21	e. An occupant with a medical or physically disabling condition that prevents
22	appropriate restraint in a safety belt, if a qualified physician, physician assistant,
23	or advanced practice registered nurse states in a signed writing the nature of the
24	condition and the reason restraint is inappropriate; or when
25	f. When all front seat safety belts are in use by other occupants; or
26	g. An operator of a motor vehicle traveling at a speed not exceeding twenty-four
27	miles per hour.
28	3A physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse who, in good
29	faith, provides a statement that restraint would be inappropriate is not subject to civil
30	liability.

Sixty-sixth Legislative Assembly 4. A violation for not wearing a safety belt under this section is not, in itself, evidence of 2 negligence. The fact of a violation of this section is not admissible in any proceeding 3 other than one charging the violation.

SECTION 3. REPEAL. Section 39-21-41.5 of the North Dakota Century Code is repealed.
