- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15.1-19-17 and 15.1-19-18 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to cyberbullying of students.

## 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 4 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-19-17 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 6 **15.1-19-17. Bullying Definition.**
- 7 As used in sections 15.1-19-17 through 15.1-19-22:
- 8 1. "Bullying" means:

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- a. Conduct that occurs in a public school, on school district premises, in a district owned or leased schoolbus or school vehicle, or at any public school or school district sanctioned or sponsored activity or event and which:
  - Is so severe, pervasive, or objectively offensive that it substantially interferes with the student's educational opportunities;
  - (2) Places the student in actual and reasonable fear of harm;
  - (3) Places the student in actual and reasonable fear of damage to property of the student; or
  - (4) Substantially disrupts the orderly operation of the public school; or
- b. Conduct that is received by a student while the student is in a public school, on school district premises, in a district owned or leased schoolbus or school vehicle, or at any public school or school district sanctioned or sponsored activity or event and which:
  - (1) Is so severe, pervasive, or objectively offensive that it substantially interferes with the student's educational opportunities;
  - (2) Places the student in actual and reasonable fear of harm;

4	c. Conduct received or sent by a student through the use of an electronic device				
5	while the student is outside a public school, off school district premises, and off

10	(3) Places the student in actual and reasonable fear of damage to property of

19	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-19-18 of the North Dakota Century Code is				
20	amended and reenacted as follows:				
21	15.1-19-18. Bullying - Prohibition by policy.				
22	1. Before July 1, 2012, each Each school district shall adopt a policy providing that while				
23	at a public school, on school district premises, in a district owned or leased schoolbus				
24	or school vehicle, or at any public school or school district sanctioned or sponsored				
25	activity or event,; or outside a public school, off school district premises, and off				
26	school district owned or leased property if using an electronic device, a student may				
27	not:				
28	a. Engage in bullying; or				
29	b. Engage in reprisal or retaliation against:				
30	(1) A victim of bullying;				
31	(2) An individual who witnesses an alleged act of bullying:				

1			(3)	An individual who reports an alleged act of bullying; or		
2			(4)	An individual who provides information about an alleged act of bullying.		
3	2.	The policy required by this section must:				
4		a.	a. Include a definition of bullying that at least encompasses the conduct described

6		b.	b. Establish procedures for reporting and documenting alleged acts of bullying,			
7			reprisal, or retaliation, and include procedures for anonymous reporting of such

9		C.	Esta	ablish procedures, including timelines, for school district personnel to follow in		
10			inve	estigating reports of alleged bullying, reprisal, or retaliation;		
11		d.	Esta	ablish a schedule for the retention of any documents generated while		
12			inve	estigating reports of alleged bullying, reprisal, or retaliation;		
13		e.	Set	forth the disciplinary measures applicable to an individual who engaged in		
14			bull	ying or who engaged in reprisal or retaliation, as set forth in subsection 1;		
15		f.	Red	quire the notification of law enforcement personnel if an investigation by		
16			sch	ool district personnel results in a reasonable suspicion that a crime might		
17			hav	e occurred;		
18		g.	Esta	ablish strategies to protect a victim of bullying, reprisal, or retaliation; and		
19		h.	Esta	ablish disciplinary measures to be imposed upon an individual who makes a		
20			fals	e accusation, report, or complaint pertaining to bullying, reprisal, or retaliation.		
21	3.	In developing the bullying policy required by this section, a school district shall involve				
22		par	ents,	school district employees, volunteers, students, school district administrators,		
23		law	enfo	rcement personnel, domestic violence sexual assault organizations as defined		
24		by subsection 3 of section 14-07.1-01, and community representatives.				
25	4.	Upo	on coi	mpletion of the policy required by this section, a school district shall:		
26		a.	Ens	sure that the policy is explained to and discussed with its students;		
27		b.	File	a copy of the policy with the superintendent of public instruction; and		
28		C.	Mak	ke the policy available in student and personnel handbooks.		
29	5.	Eac	ch sch	nool district shall review and revise its policy as it determines necessary and		
30		sha	II file	a copy of the revised policy with the superintendent of public instruction.
