1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-10 and a new section to

2 chapter 54-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the duty of the state auditor to

3 report consecutive audit findings and the reduction of agency appropriations by the office of

4 management and budget;-and to amend and reenact section 54-35-02.2 of the North Dakota

5 Century Code, relating to the powers and duties of the legislative audit and fiscal review

6 committee; and to provide for a report.

## 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

8 **SECTION 1.** A new section to chapter 54-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created

9 and enacted as follows:

## 10 Consecutive audit findings - Report.

11 The state auditor shall notify the legislative audit and fiscal review committee of any

12 significant audit findings that have been reported in two or more consecutive audits.

13 SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 54-35-02.2 of the North Dakota Century Code is

14 amended and reenacted as follows:

15 54-35-02.2. Powers and duties of the legislative audit and fiscal review committee.

- 161.The legislative audit and fiscal review committee shall study and review audit reports17as selected by the committee from those submitted by the state auditor, confer with18the auditor and deputy auditors in regard to such reports, and when necessary, confer19with representatives of the department, agency, or institution audited in order to obtain
- 20 full and complete information in regard to any and all fiscal transactions and
- 21 governmental operations of any department, agency, or institution of the state. Each
- department, agency, or institution shall furnish to the committee such aid, information,
- and assistance in regard to fiscal transactions and governmental operations as it may
