4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 5 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-18-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:
- 7 15.1-18-10. Specialty areas Teacher qualification.
- 8 Notwithstanding the requirements of this chapter:
 - An individual may teach art, business education, computer education, a foreign language, music, physical education, special education, and technology education at any grade level from kindergarten through grade eight, provided the individual:
 - a. Is licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board;
 - Is approved to teach in that area by the education standards and practices board;
 and
 - c. Meets all requirements set forth in rule by the superintendent of public instruction.
- An individual may teach Native American languages provided the individual is an
 eminence-credentialed teacher.
- 3. An individual may teach in the areas of trade, industry, technical occupations, or health occupations, provided the individual has been issued a license to teach in such areas by the education standards and practices board.
- 4. An individual may teach part-time in any subject, except elementary education,
 mathematics, science, language arts, and social studies, if the individual has a permit
 issued by the board, has a high school diploma, and:

1 Possesses at least two thousand hours of relevant work experience in the 2 preceding five years in the subject area to be taught; 3 <u>b.</u> Possesses a certificate, license, or degree in the subject area to be taught; or 4 Achieves a passing score on the Praxis content test. C. 5 The board of a school district may authorize an individual to teach part-time under <u>5.</u> 6 subsection 4 for one year, up to a maximum of three years, if: 7 The administrator of a school within the district submits a written request to the 8 education standards and practices board which indicates the administrator is 9 unable to locate a qualified applicant and requests the education standards and 10 practices board issue a permit; 11 The individual successfully completes a background check conducted by the <u>b.</u> 12 education standards and practices board; and 13 The education standards and practices board issues a permit to the individual. <u>C.</u>
