- 1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15.1-18-10 of the North Dakota Century Code,
- 2 relating to allowing individuals who do not have a teaching license to teach noncore subjects
- 3 upon meeting certain criteria; to provide for a legislative management report; and to provide an
- 4 <u>expiration date</u>.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- 6 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 15.1-18-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is 7 amended and reenacted as follows:
- 8 15.1-18-10. Specialty areas Teacher qualification.
- 9 Notwithstanding the requirements of this chapter:
 - An individual may teach art, business education, computer education, a foreign language, music, physical education, special education, and technology education at any grade level from kindergarten through grade eight, provided the individual:
 - a. Is licensed to teach by the education standards and practices board;
- b. Is approved to teach in that area by the education standards and practices board;and
 - c. Meets all requirements set forth in rule by the superintendent of public instruction.
 - An individual may teach Native American languages provided the individual is an eminence-credentialed teacher.
 - An individual may teach in the areas of trade, industry, technical occupations, or health
 occupations, provided the individual has been issued a license to teach in such areas
 by the education standards and practices board.
 - 4. An individual may teach part-time in any subject, except elementary education, special education, mathematics, science, language arts, and social studies, if the individual has a:
