## 6 <u>Corridors of commerce program - Corridors of commerce fund.</u>

- 7 <u>1.</u> <u>The department shall administer a corridors of commerce program for constructing,</u>
- 8 reconstructing, improving, and maintaining highways that improve freight
- 9 <u>transportation and facilitate commerce.</u>
- 10 <u>2.</u> <u>The corridors of commerce fund is a special fund in the state treasury administered by</u>
- 11 the department. The fund consists of all money deposited in the fund. Pursuant to
- 12 legislative appropriations, the department shall use moneys in the fund for eligible
- 13 highway projects in accordance with provisions of this section.
- 14 <u>3.</u> <u>To be eligible for funding under this section:</u>
- 15a.Any construction work associated with the project must begin within three years16after the department selects the project for funding, unless the department grants17an exemption; and
- 18 b. The highway project must meet at least one of the following criteria:
  - (1) The project is a segment of highway with the following characteristics:
    - (a) The existing segment is not a divided highway;
- 21(b)At least one end of the segment connects to an expressway or22freeway; and
  - (c) The segment will connect to a proposed or existing interchange;
  - (2) The project will ease the movement of freight traffic;
