Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. forever changed America through his leadership in the non-violent civil rights movement of the 1950s and 60s. Slowly unconstitutional laws creating inequity, violating unalienable rights and denying life, liberty and the happiness of African American citizens toppled. We often speak of Dr. King's accomplishments, see the countless streets, buildings and monuments named in his honor, but where did this greatness come from?

I believe it was his courage. The courage to speak out against the oppressive status quo, to question what had always been in pursuit of a better what will be, and the courage to do this in the face of violence, incarceration and his untimely death.

As we honor Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. today I encourage us all to find our courage to work together past the rhetoric, partisanship, fear and anger plaguing America, so that we can be leaders for greatness in North Dakota.

## REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE POLLERT

MR. SPEAKER: Today is Martin Luther King Jr. Day and I think it is important for us to take a moment to remember the life of this great American hero.

Martin Luther King Jr. lived an incredible life. Throughout his career, he sought equality and human rights for African Americans by leading the Civil Rights movement. He was a driving force behind landmark events like the Montgomery Bus Boycott and the March on Washington in 1963. In a time when violence was frequent and hate was rampant, King used nonviolent protest and powerful words to truly impact our country and our world for the better. Martin Luther King Jr. awakened our nation's conscience to the inequality faced by African Americans and influenced lawmakers to implement legislation such as the Civil Rights Act and the Voting Rights Act. In 1964, King was honored with the Nobel Peace Prize.

In 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed the bill which made Martin Luther King Jr. Day a national holiday. At the bill signing, he quoted Doctor King, and that quote is worth repeating today: "Their destiny is tied up with our destiny, and their freedom is inextricably bound to our freedom; we cannot walk alone."

Our country is a better country because of the work of Doctor King. It is more decent, more fair, and more democratic because of the peaceful protest of Doctor Martin Luther King, Jr. Thank you.
