1 A BILL for an Act to provide for a legislative management study of the state's developmental
2 disability services; ~~and to provide an appropriation.~~

3 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:**

4 **SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT STUDY - DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES**

5 **SERVICES.** During the 2021-22 interim, the legislative management shall study state and
6 federal laws and regulations relating to the care and treatment of individuals with developmental
7 disabilities.

8 1. The study must include a review of the following:

9 a. The state's existing programs to identify potential pathways for individuals who
10 have a developmental disability but do not meet the eligibility criteria for existing
11 programs;

12 b. Gap identification with programmatic recommendations identifying potential
13 strategies to address the gaps, and potential federal and state funding sources
14 including the federal Medicaid 1915(i) waiver;

15 c. Efforts and services offered by other states, including the planning and
16 implementation process for any new programs; and

17 d. The impact of implementation and expanding of programs to address service
18 gaps, including the number of individuals impacted, cost, and timeline for
19 implementation.

20 2. The legislative management shall report its findings and recommendations, together
21 with any legislation necessary to implement those recommendations, to the
22 sixty-eighth legislative assembly.

23 ~~**SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general
24 fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$150,000, or so much of the~~
