HB 1412 creates a tax exemption from the coal conversion facilities privilege tax.

Section 1 of HB 1412 exempts a portion of the coal conversion tax that is paid by coal facilities in the state. Electrical generating coal conversion facilities are exempted from the electrical generation tax component, and are exempted from 60% of the installed capacity component of the coal conversion tax. Non-electrical generating coal conversion facilities are also exempted from 60% of their coal conversion tax.

HB 1412, if enacted, is expected to reduce state general fund revenues by an estimated \$35.5 million in the 2021-23 biennium. (This estimate assumes the intent was to keep the lignite research tax whole, which will require a small amendment to Section 1 of the bill.)
