- A BILL for an Act to create and enact twoa new sections to chapter 4.1-01.1 and a new section to chapter 21-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to an agriculture innovation fund and a transfer of legacy fund earnings; and to provide an appropriation; to provide a
- 4 continuing appropriation; and to provide for a transfer.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 4.1-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Agriculture innovation fund - Continuing appropriation.

- 1. There is created in the state treasury the agriculture innovation fund. The fund consists of all legacy fund earnings deposited in the fund under section 3 of this. Actmoneys transferred to the fund by the legislative assembly, interest upon moneys in the fund, and payments of interest and principal on loans made from the fund. Moneys in the fund may be spent by are appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota for loans as provided in this section and by the agriculture commissioner, pursuant to legislative appropriations, to provide grants to value-added agriculture businesses based on recommendations from the agricultural products utilization commission on a continuing basis for loan disbursements and administrative costs pursuant to this section.
- 2. The agricultural products utilization commission shall meet at least quarterly to make recommendations for grantsLoans may be issued from the fund to support new or expanding value-added agriculture businesses which demonstrate financial feasibility, enhance profitability for farmers and ranchers, create jobs, and grow the state's economy. Grant funding may be used to purchase equipment, to support workforce training and development, and to construct infrastructure. Grants received under this

section may not exceed thirty-five percent of the total cost of the project. The agricultural products utilization commission shall develop guidelines for the grants, included eligibility criteria and reporting requirements. The guidelines must include priority for businesses with a majority of the ownership comprised of North Dakota residents. The agricultural products utilization commission may designate moneys in the fund for loans under this section Value-added agriculture businesses include food production or processing facilities; feed or pet food processing facilities; commodity processing facilities; agriculture product manufacturers; and animal agriculture production facilities, including swine, poultry, and feed lot production facilities.

3. Moneys in the fund designated for loans are appropriated to the Bank of North Dakota on a continuing basis for the purpose of loan disbursements and administrative costs. The Bank shall develop policies for the loans in consultation with the agricultural products utilization commission. The Bank shall review loan applications. To be eligible for a loan under this section, an entity shall agree to provide the Bank with information as requested. The Bank may develop policies for loan participation with local financial institutions. The Bank shall deposit in the fund all principal and interest paid on the loans made from the fund. The Bank may use a portion of the interest paid on the outstanding loans as a servicing fee to pay for administrative costs, which may not exceed one-half of one percent of the amount of the interest payment. The Bank shall contract with a certified public accounting firm to audit the fund if the fund has any outstanding loans. The cost of the audit must be paid from the fund.

SECTION 2. A new section to chapter 4.1-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

Agriculture innovation fund - Access to records.

1. To the extent the agricultural products utilization commission determines the materials or data provided under section 1 of this Act consist of trade secrets or commercial, financial, or proprietary information of individuals or entities applying for loans or grants with the commission, materials and data submitted to, made by, or received by the commission, are not public records subject to section 44-04-18 and section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North Dakota, and are subject to section 44-04-18.4.

ı	<u> </u>	A person may file a request with the commission to have material designated as
2		confidential under subsection 1. The request must contain any information required by
3		the commission and must include at least the following:
4		a. A general description of the nature of the information sought to be protected.
5		b. An explanation of why the information derives independent economic value,
6		actual or potential, from not being generally known to other persons.
7		c. An explanation of why the information is not readily ascertainable by proper
8		means of other persons.
9		d. A general description of any person that may obtain economic value from
10		disclosure or use of the information, and how the person may obtain this value.
11		e. A description of the efforts used to maintain the secrecy of the information.
12	<u> 3.</u>	Any request under subsection 2 is confidential. The commission shall examine the
13		request and determine whether the information is relevant to the matter at hand and is
14		a trade secret under the definition in section 47-25.1-01 or 44-04-18.4. If the
15		commission determines the information is either not relevant or not a trade secret, the
16		commission shall notify the requester and the requester may ask for the return of the
17		information and the request within ten days of the notice. If no return is sought, the
18		information and request are public record.
19	<u>4.</u>	The names or identities of independent technical reviewers on a project or program
20		are confidential, may not be disclosed by the commission, and are not public records
21		subject to section 44-04-18 or section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North
22		Dakota.
23	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 21-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created	
24	and enacted as follows:	
25	<u>Lega</u>	ncy fund earnings transfer - State treasurer.
26	—— <u>From</u>	any legacy fund earnings transferred to the general fund at the end of each biennium
27	in accordance with section 26 of article X of the Constitution of North Dakota, twenty percent	
28	must be transferred immediately by the state treasurer to the agriculture innovation fund under	
29	section 1	of this Act until the amount transferred to the agriculture innovation fund totals one
30	hundred :	fifty million dollars. After the transfers to the agriculture innovation fund under this
31	section to	stal one hundred fifty million dollars, the state treasurer shall transfer immediately any

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There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$5,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, which the office of management and budget shall transfer to the agriculture innovation fund during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.
