## SECOND ENGROSSMENT with Senate Amendments REENGROSSED HOUSE BILL NO. 1475

- 1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 4.1-01.1 of the North
- 2 Dakota Century Code, relating to an agriculture diversification and development fund,
- 3 agriculture diversification and development committee, and agriculture diversification and
- 4 development fund grants program; to provide an appropriation; to provide a continuing
- 5 appropriation; and to provide for a transfer.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

- SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 4.1-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is created
   and enacted as follows:
  - Agriculture diversification and development fund Continuing appropriation.
- 1. There is created in the state treasury the agriculture diversification and development

  loan fund. The fund consists of all moneys transferred to the fund by the legislative

  assembly, interest upon moneys in the fund, and payments of interest and principal on

  loans made from the fund. Moneys in the fund are appropriated to the Bank of North

  Dakota on a continuing basis for loan disbursements, grants, and administrative costs

  pursuant to this section. No more than twenty-five percent of the fund may be utilized

  for grants in a biennium.
  - 2. Loans, interest rate buydowns, or grants may be issued from the fund to support new or expanding value-added agriculture businesses that demonstrate financial feasibility, enhance profitability for farmers and ranchers, create jobs, and grow the state's economy. Value-added agriculture businesses include food production or processing facilities; feed or pet food processing facilities; commodity processing facilities; agriculture product manufacturers; and animal agriculture production facilities, including swine, poultry, dairy, and feed lot production facilities.

0		the audit must be paid from the fund.

4		include priority for businesses with a majority of the ownership comprised of North				
5		Dakota residents. The agriculture diversification and development committee shall				
6		review grant applications and make funding determinations.

11	<u>1.</u>	To the extent the agricultural products utilization commission determines the materials				
12		or data provided under section 1 of this Act consist of trade secrets or commercial,				
13		financial, or proprietary information of individuals or entities applying for grants with the				
14		commission, materials and data submitted to, made by, or received by the				
15		commission, are not public records subject to section 44-04-18 and section 6 article XI				
16		of the Constitution of North Dakota, and are subject to section 44-04-18.4.				
17	<u>2.</u>	A person may file a request with the commission to have material designated as				
18		confidential under subsection 1. The request must contain any information required by				
19		the commission and must include at least the following:				
20		a. A general description of the nature of the information sought to be protected;				
21		b. An explanation of why the information derives independent economic value,				
22		actual or potential, from not being generally known to other persons;				
23		c. An explanation of why the information is not readily ascertainable by proper				
24		means of other persons;				
25		d. A general description of any person that may obtain economic value from				
26		disclosure or use of the information, and how the person may obtain this value;				
27		<u>and</u>				
28		e. A description of the efforts used to maintain the secrecy of the information.				
29	<u>3.</u>	A request under subsection 2 is confidential. The commission shall examine the				
30		request and determine whether the information is relevant to the matter at hand and is				
31		a trade secret under the definition in section 47-25.1-01 or 44-04-18.4. If the				

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1		commission determines the information is not relevant or not a trade secret, the
2		commission shall notify the requester and the requester may ask for the return of the
3		information and the request within ten days of the notice. If no return is sought, the
4		information and request are public records.
5	<u>4.</u>	The names or identities of independent technical reviewers on a project or program
6		are confidential, may not be disclosed by the commission, and are not public records
7		subject to section 44-04-18 or section 6 of article XI of the Constitution of North
8		<u>Dakota.</u>
9	SEC	CTION 4. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER TO AGRICULTURE DIVERSIFICATION
10	AND DE	EVELOPMENT FUND. There is appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in
11	the state	e treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$20,000,000, or so much of the sum
12	as may	be necessary, to the agriculture diversification and development fund for the biennium
13	beginnir	ng July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2023.
