1 A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota-2 Century Code, relating to hunting and fishing license, permit, and application fees for 3 out-of-state national guard members; and to amend and reenact section 20.1-01-02. 4 subsection 3 of section 20.1-03-07.1, subsection 4 of section 20.1-04-12.1, and section 5 20.1-06-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to hunting and fishing license, permit, 6 and application fees for out-of-state national guard members.for an Act to amend and reenact 7 subdivision c of subsection 12 of section 20.1-02-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating 8 to hunting and fishing license for national guard members.

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 20.1-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is

11 amended and reenacted as follows: 12 20.1-01-02. Definitions. 13 In this title, unless the context otherwise requires: 14 "Afield" means being away from one's home or camp. The term does not include 15 driving or being in actual physical control of a motor vehicle in violation of section-16 39-08-01 or equivalent ordinance. 17 "Any part thereof" or "the parts thereof" includes the hide, horns, or hoofs of any 18 animal specified and the plumage, skin, and every other part of any bird specified. 19 "Aquatic nuisance species" means any nonindigenous, obligate aquatic species of 20 plant or animal which is injurious to native and desirable aquatic species or which has-21 a negative effect on aquatic habitats, environment, or the economy of the state. 22 "Associated equipment" means:

1		a. Any <u>any</u> system, part, or component of a boat as originally manufactured or any
2		similar part or component manufactured or sold for replacement, repair, or
3		improvement of suchthe system, part, or component;

5		c. Any <u>any</u> marine safety article, accessory, or equipment intended for use by a
6		person <u>an individual</u> on board a boat; but
7		d. Excluding. The term does not include radio equipment.
8	<del>5</del> .	"Big game" means deer, moose, elk, bighorn sheep, mountain goats, and antelope.
9	<del>6.</del>	"Boat" means any vessel:
10		a. Manufactured or used primarily for noncommercial use;
11	-	b. Leased, rented, or chartered to another for the latter's noncommercial use; or
12		c. Engaged in the carrying of six or fewer passengers.
13	<del>7.</del>	"Confiscate" or "confiscated" means to hold subject to the order of a court of
14		competent jurisdiction.
15	<del>8.</del>	"Consideration" means something of value given or done in exchange for something of
16		value given or done by another.
17	<del>9.</del>	"Crops" means any plant that has been harvested, collected, or stored as livestock
18		feed, fodder, or fuel.
19	<del>10.</del>	"Day leasing" means the practice of an outfitter entering a short-term lease agreement
20		that is intended to and does last less than twenty-four hours.
21	<del>11.</del>	"Department" means the game and fish department.
22	<del>12.</del>	"Depredation" means damage to or destruction of private property.
23	<del>13.</del>	"Deputy director" means the deputy director of the department.
24	<del>14.</del>	"Director" means the director of the department.
25	<del>15.</del>	"Disabled veteran" means a veteran who has a one hundred percent
26		service-connected disability as determined by the department of veterans' affairs or
27		has an extra-schedular rating to include individual unemployability that brings the
28		veteran's total disability ratio to one hundred percent as determined by the department-
29		of veterans' affairs.
30	<del>16.</del>	"Endangered species" means any species whose prospects of survival or recruitment
31		within the state are in jeopardy due to anyone or more of the following factors:

1		a. The destruction, drastic modification, or severe curtailment of its habitat.
2		b. Its overutilization for scientific, commercial, or sporting purposes.
3		c. The effect on it of disease, pollution, or predation.
4		d. Other natural or manmade factors affecting its prospects of survival or
5		recruitment within the state.
6		e. Any combination of the foregoing factors.
7		The term also includes any species classified as endangered pursuant to the
8		Endangered Species Act of 1973, Public Law 93-205.
9	<del>17.</del>	"Established road or trail" means any public highway or road, improved or otherwise,
10		dedicated for public ingress or egress, or any other road or trail normally used for
11		travel but does not include temporary trails across cultivated land used for agricultural-
12		<del>purposes.</del>
13	<del>18.</del>	"Fur-bearers" includes mink, muskrats, weasels, wolverines, otters, martens, fishers,
14		kit or swift foxes, beavers, raccoons, badgers, wolves, coyotes, bobcats, lynx,
15		mountain lions, black bears, and red or gray foxes.
16	<del>19.</del>	"Game birds" includes all varieties of geese, brant, swans, ducks, plovers, snipes,
17		woodcocks, grouse, sagehens, pheasants, Hungarian partridges, quails, partridges,
18		cranes, rails, coots, wild turkeys, mourning doves, and crows.
19	<del>20.</del> -	"Guide" means an individual who is employed by or contracts with a licensed outfitter
20		to help the outfitter furnish personal services for the conduct of outdoor recreational
21		activities directly related to the conduct of activities for which the employing outfitter is-
22		<del>licensed.</del>
23	<del>21.</del>	"Gun dogs" includes any dog used to hunt protected wildlife.
24	<del>22.</del>	"Harmful wild birds" includes blackbirds, magpies, English sparrows, and starlings.
25	<del>23.</del>	"Harmless wild birds" includes all wild birds that are not defined herein as "harmful wild
26		birds" or "game birds".
27	<del>24.</del>	"Hunt" or "hunting" means shooting, shooting at, pursuing, taking, attempting to take,
28		or killing any game animals and game birds; searching for or attempting to locate or
29		flush any game animals and game birds; luring, calling, or attempting to attract game-
30		animals and game birds; hiding for the purpose of taking or attempting to take game
31		animals and game birds; and walking, crawling, or advancing toward wildlife while

1		possessing implements or equipment useful in the taking of game animals or game
2		birds. The term does not include possessing or using photographic equipment.
3	<del>25.</del>	"Hunt through the internet" means to hunt wildlife in real time using internet services to
4		remotely control actual firearms and to remotely discharge live ammunition allowing a
5		person who is not physically present to take wildlife. The term includes using any
6		remotely controlled device to hunt the animal such as a hand-held communication
7		device, cellular telephone, or global-positioning device.
8	<del>26.</del>	"Indian land" means land within the exterior boundaries of an Indian reservation held
9		in trust by the federal government for the benefit of an Indian tribe or an Indian and
10		land within the exterior boundaries of an Indian reservation owned in fee by an Indian
11		tribe or an Indian.
12	<del>27.</del>	"Introduce" means to place, release, or allow the escape of a non-native species into a
13		free-living state.
14	<del>28.</del>	"Manufacturer" means any person engaged in:
15		a. The manufacture, construction, or assembly of boats or associated equipment.
16	-	b. The manufacture or construction of components for boats and associated
17		equipment to be sold for subsequent assembly.
18		c. The importation into the state for sale of boats, associated equipment, or
19		components thereof.
20	<del>29.</del>	"Motorboat" means any vessel propelled by machinery, whether or not the machinery
21		is the principal source of propulsion. The term does not include a vessel having a valid-
22		marine document issued by the bureau of customs of the United States government or
23		any federal agency successor thereto.
24	<del>30.</del>	"Motor-driven vehicle" means any land vehicle, with or without wheels, that is
25		propelled by any motor.
26	<del>31.</del>	"Native aquatic species" means an animal or plant species that is naturally present
27		and reproducing within this state or which naturally expands from its historic range into-
28		this state.
29	<del>32.</del>	"Non-native species" means a species that is not a native species.
30	<del>33.</del>	"Operate" means to navigate or otherwise use a motorboat or a vessel.

"Personal watercraft" means a motorboat that is powered by an inboard motor powering a water jet pump or by an inboard or outboard marine engine and which is designed to be operated by a personan individual sitting, standing, or kneeling on the craft, rather than in a conventional manner of sitting or standing inside a motorboat.
- 39.<u>40.</u> "Possession" means control, actual possession, and constructive possession of the article or thing specified.
- 40.41. "Private fish hatchery" means a body of water, whether natural or artificial, and any other facilities used, maintained, or operated by any private person, firm, corporation, or limited liability company for the propagation and production of fish for sale or planting in other waters. Except in the case of trout, walleye, northern pike, and crappie, which may be raised in a private fish hatchery without the director's approval, by rule the director may, by rule, regulate the species of fish which may be raised in a private fish hatchery. No waters stocked by any state or federal governmental agency may be considered a private fish hatchery.
- 41.42. "Public waters" means waters to which the general public has a right to access.
- 42.43. "Resident" means any personan individual who has actually lived within this state or maintained that person's individual's residence therein within this state for at least six months immediately preceding the date that residence is to be determined. A person's An individual's residence is the place where the person individual remains when not called elsewhere for special or temporary purposes. A resident can only have one residence and a residence cannot be lost until another is gained. A residence or home is a permanent building or part of a building and may include a house, condominium, apartment, room in a house, or mobile home. A rental property, vacant lot, or house, cabin, or premises used primarily for business or recreational pursuits may not be considered a residence. A "nonresident" is any person individual who has not actually lived within this state or maintained that person's individual's residence within this state for at least six months immediately preceding the date that residence is to be determined.
- 43.<u>44.</u> "Resident species" means any species nearly all of whose individuals in this state are located within this state for at least three-fourths of annual cycle of the species.
- 44.45. "Retrieve" means to have taken possession and made ready for transportation.

1 "Sell" and "sale" means any sale or offer to sell, or possession with intent to sell, use, 2 or dispose of, the article or thing specified, contrary to law. 3 <del>46.47.</del> "Shooting preserve" or "preserve" means any privately owned or leased acreage-[hectarage] on which hatchery-raised game birds are released to be hunted for a fee-4 5 over an extended season. 6 "Sinkbox" or "sunken device" means a raft or any type of low floating device having a 47.48. 7 depression that affords a hunter a means of concealing that personhunter below the 8 surface of the water. 9 "Slow or no wake speed" means the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain 48.49. 10 steerage. 11 49.50. "Small game" includes all game birds and tree squirrels. 12 <del>50.51.</del> "Species" includes any subspecies of wildlife and any other group of wildlife of the 13 same species or smaller taxa in common spatial arrangement that which interbreed 14 when mature. 15 <del>51.<u>52.</u></del> "Threatened species" means any species whichthat is likely to become an endangered 16 species within the foreseeable future and includes any species classified as 17 threatened pursuant to the Endangered Species Act of 1973, Public Law 93-205. 18 <del>52.53.</del> "Transport" means to cause or attempt to cause a species to be carried or moved into-19 or within the state and includes accepting or receiving the species for transportation or-20 shipment. The term does not include the unintentional transport of a species while on-21 a specific water of the state or to a connected water of the state where the species-22 being transported is already present. 23 "Undocumented vessel" means a vessel whichthat does not have a valid marine-<del>53.<u>54.</u></del> 24 document as a vessel of the United States. 25 <del>54.55.</del> "Vessel" means any watercraft, other than a seaplane on the water, used or capable of 26 being used as a means of transportation on water. 27 <del>55.56.</del> "Waterfowl" includes all varieties of geese, brant, swans, ducks, rails, and coots. 28 <del>56.57.</del> -"Waters" when not qualified means waters not open to the general public. 29 57.58. "Waters of the state" means all waters of this state, including boundary waters. This 30 title extends to and is in force and effect over, upon, and in all such waters.

1	58. <u>59.</u> "Wildlife" means any member of the animal kingdom including any mammal, fish, bird		
2	(including any migratory, nonmigratory, or endangered bird for which protection is also		
3	afforded by treaty or other international agreement), amphibian, reptile, mollusk,		
4	crustacean, or other invertebrate, and includes any part, product, egg, or offspring		
5	thereof, or the dead body or parts thereof. Wildlife does not include domestic animals		
6	as defined by section 36-01-00.1 or birds or animals held in private ownership.		
7	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 3 of section 20.1-03-07.1 of the North Dakota		
8	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
9	3. Upon payment of the fee for a statewide nonresident waterfowl hunting license, a		
10	nonresident may hunt waterfowl in any zone. FortyExcept for an out-of-state guard		
11	member, forty dollars of the fee for a statewide nonresident waterfowl license must be		
12	used for the private land open to sportsmen program.		
13	SECTION 3. A new section to chapter 20.1-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is created		
14	and enacted as follows:		
15	Fees for out-of-state guard members.		
16	Notwithstanding sections 20.1-03-12, 20.1-03-12.2, 20.1-03-12.3, and 20.1-03-36.1, a		
17	license, permit, and application fee for an out-of-state guard member is equal to the fee for a		
18	resident.		
19	SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Subsection 4 of section 20.1-04-12.1 of the North Dakota		
20	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
21	— 4. The fees for the permits are:		
22	a. For a resident professional gun dog trainer for training exercises or hosting field		
23	trials, ten dollars.		
24	b. For a nonresident professional gun dog trainer for training exercises or hosting		
25	field trials, one hundred dollars.		
26	c. For a permit to a nonresident amateur who brings more than four gun dogs into		
27	this state, twenty-five dollars.		
28	d. For a professional gun dog trainer who is an out-of-state guard member for		
29	training exercises or hosting field trials, ten dollars.		
30	e. For an amateur who is an out-of-state guard member, who brings more than four		
31	dogs into this state, ten dollars.		

privilege for residents of North Dakota. For an individual holding an annual class A nonresident license who is an out-of-state guard member, the fee is fifty dollars, except the fee is seventy-five dollars if white suckers are sold.
