1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 23-01-02 and 23-01-03 of the North Dakota

2 Century Code, relating to the membership and duties of the health council.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 23-01-02 of the North Dakota Century Code is
amended and reenacted as follows:

6 23-01-02. Health council - Members, terms of office, vacancies, compensation, 7 officers, meetings.

8	<u>1.</u>	The health council shall assure the coordination of the health division with all other
9		health activities of the state. The health council consists of nineeleventwelve members
10		appointed by the governor including four persons from the health care field, and five-
11		persons representing consumer interests. The governor may select members to the
12		council from recommendations submitted by trade, professional, and consumer
13		organizations. On the expiration of the term of any member, the governor, in the
14		manner provided by this section, shall appoint for a term of three years, persons to
15		take the place of members whose terms on the council are about to expire. The
16		officers of the council must be elected annually. Any state agency may serve in an-
17		advisory capacity to the health council at the discretion of the council. The council-
18		shall meet at least twice each year and at other times as the council or its chairman
19		may direct. The health council shall have as standing committees any committees the
20		council may find necessary. The chairman of the council shall select the members of
21		these committees. The members of the council are entitled to receive compensation at
22		the rate set for a member of the legislative assembly under subsection 1 of section
23		54-03-20 and their necessary mileage and travel expenses as provided in sections
24		44-08-04 and 54-06-09 while attending council meetings or in the performance of any

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1		spe	ecial duties as the council may direct. The per diem and expenses must be audited
2		and	I paid in the manner in which the expenses of state officers are audited and paid.
3		The	e compensation provided for in this section may not be paid to any member of the
4		COU	incil who received salary or other compensation as a regular employee of the state,
5		or a	any of its political subdivisions, or any institution or industry operated by the state:
6		<u>a.</u>	One member representing tribal health, appointed by the director of the Indian
7			affairs commission for a term of at least one year.
8		<u>b.</u>	One member representing the university of North Dakota school of medicine and
9			health sciences, appointed by the dean of the school for a term of at least one
10			<u>year.</u>
11		<u>C.</u>	One member representing the university of North Dakota, appointed by the
12			president of the university for a term of at least one year.
13		<u>d.</u>	One member representing North Dakota state university, appointed by the
14			president of the university for a term of at least one year.
15		<u>e.</u>	One publiclocal health officer from a public health unit, appointed by the state
16			health officer for a term of at least one year.
17		<u>f.</u>	SixSeven members appointed by the state health officer as provided under this
18			subdivision for terms of three years. The state health officer shall identify
19			statewide entities representing each of the following interests and shall request
20			each entity submit the name of one individual to represent the entity.
21			(1) An entity representing pharmacies pharmacists.
22			(2) An entity representing physicians.
23			(3) An entity representing hospitals.
24			(4) An entity representing public health unit administrators.
25			(5) An entity representing nurses.
26			(6) An entity representing long-term care facilities.
27			(7) An entity representing dietitians.
28	<u>2.</u>	Eac	ch member of the health council shall serve until the member's successor is
29		<u>app</u>	pointed. If a member ceases to represent the entity the member is appointed to
30		<u>rep</u>	resent, the member is no longer qualified to serve and must be replaced.

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1	<u>3.</u>	The council shall elect from its membership a presiding officer. The state health officer			
2		shall serve as executive secretary of the health council. The executive secretary does			
3		not have voting privileges. The council shall meet no fewer than two times per year			
4		and shall meet at the call of the presiding officer and at the request of the state health			
5		officer.			
6	<u>4.</u>	At the request of the health council, a state agency may serve in an advisory capacity			
7		to the council.			
8	<u>5.</u>	The health council may appoint standing committees as determined necessary. The			
9		presiding officer shall select the members of any standing committee.			
10	<u>6.</u>	A member of the health council is entitled to receive per diem at the rate set for a			
11		member of the legislative assembly under subsection 1 of section 54-03-20 and			
12		necessary mileage and travel expenses as provided under sections 44-08-04 and			
13		54-06-09 while attending council meetings or in the performance of any special duties			
14		as the council may direct. To the extent a member of the council receives salary or			
15		other compensation from the state or a political subdivision, that member is not eligible			
16		to receive per diem or reimbursement under this subsection.			
17	SEC	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 23-01-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is			
18	amende	ed and reenacted as follows:			
19	19 23-01-03. Powers and duties of the health council.				
20	The	The health council shall:			
21	1.	Fix, subject to the provisions of section 23-01-02, the time and place of the meetings			
22		of the council.			
23	2.	Make regulations for the government of the council and its officers and meetings.			
24	3.	EstablishCollaborate and advise in the establishment of standards, rules, and			
25		regulations, which are found necessary for the maintenance of public health, including			
26		sanitation and disease control.			
27	4.	Provide for Collaborate and support the development, establishment, and enforcement			
28		of basic standards for hospitals and related medical institutions which render medical			
29		and nursing care, and for the construction and maintenance of suchthe institutions,			
30		such standards to cover matters pertaining to sanitation, building construction, fire			
31		protection measures, nursing procedures, and preservation of medical records. No-			

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1		regulation <u>A rule</u> may <u>not</u> be adopted with respect to building construction of existing			
2		medical hospitals or related medical institutions unless the regulationrule relates to			
3		safety factors or the hospital or related medical institution changes the scope of			
4		service in such a way that a different license is required from the department pursuant			
5		to rules adopted under chapter 23-16.			
6	5.	Hold hearings on all matters brought before it <u>the council</u> by applicants and licensees			
7		of medical hospitals with reference to the denial, suspension, or revocation of licenses			
8		and make appropriate determination as specified hereinregarding these matters.			
9	9 The council may direct the state health officer to do or cause to be done any or all of the things				
10	which may be required in the proper performance of the various duties placed upon the				
11	1 department of health and human services				
12	<u>6.</u>	Inform and advise the governor, department of health and human services, legislative			
13		assembly, and North Dakotans on public health issues that are important to the needs			
14		of North Dakotans, and in the event of a public health emergency.			
15	<u>7.</u>	Monitor progress on the state public health strategic plan and advocate for evidence-			
16		based practices and policies necessary to improve the health of North Dakotans.			
17	<u>8.</u>	In consultation with the state health officer and other agencies, associations, and			
18		institutions represented on the health council, study and make recommendations			
19		regarding the strategic plan and programs of the health division of the department of			
20		health and human services. The recommendation may address public health			
21		education and training, factors influencing the practice environment for health care			
22		professionals, access to health care, and patient safety.			
23	<u>9.</u>	As the health council determines appropriate, consult with an individual or entity in			
24		performing the council's duties under this section.
