1 A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-10-38.4, 15-10-59, 15-62.5-01, and

2 15-62.5-03, subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 15-62.5-04, and sections 15-63-01,

3 15-63-02, 15-63-03, 15-63-04, 15-63-05, 15.1-21-02.6, and 15.1-21-02.8 of the North Dakota

4 Century Code, relating to dual-credit tuition scholarships, the North Dakota scholars program,

5 Indian scholarships, and academic and career and technical education scholarships; and to

6 repeal section 15-63-07 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the use of Indian

7 scholarship refunds.

## 8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 15-10-38.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is

10 amended and reenacted as follows:

15-10-38.4. Dual-credit courses - Tuition scholarship program - Administered by the
 board.

- The state board of higher education shall administer a dual-credit tuition scholarship
   program to offer a tuition scholarship to students. The board shall adopt procedures to
   administer the program.
- An eligible student may apply to the board to receive a scholarship toward the cost of
  tuition and fees at the <u>accredited</u> in-state public, private, or tribal institution of higher
  education at which the student is enrolled. To be eligible to receive a scholarship, an
  individual must:
- a. Be enrolled and have completed at least one semester, quarter, or term at a
  public, private, or tribal institution of higher education <u>with a physical presence</u> in
  the state;
- b. Have:

2		subsection 1, they must be ranked by the numeric sum of their four scale scores on		
3		the ACT or equivalent scores on. If a nationally recognized standardized test approved		
4		by the state board of higher education does not calculate scale scores, the equivalent		
5		will be zero.		
6	3.	If two or more applicants have the same composite scores and the same numeric sum-		
7		of the four scale scoresas determined in subsections 1 and 2, they must be ranked by		
8		the numeric sum of their English and mathematics scores. If a nationally recognized		
9		standardized test approved by the state board of higher education does not calculate		
10		equivalent English and mathematics scores, the equivalent will be zero.		
11	4.	The state board of higher education may establish additional criteria to rank applicants		
12		who have the same numeric sum of their English and mathematics scores as

Eligibility of candidates - Determination. 29 The initial and continuing scholarship Scholarship eligibility of state residents who are 30 enrolled members of federally recognized Indian tribes must be determined by the state board 31 for IndianNative American scholarships after the candidate has gained admission to any-

- 2 and has had this fact certified to the boardannually for applicants. Factors to be considered in

3 the award of these scholarships are the candidate's financial need and probable and continuing4 success as a student.

8 Upon the <u>grantingaward</u> of a scholarship <del>and acceptance thereof</del>, the recipient is eligible for

9 a credit in fees in<u>at</u> the enrolling institution of higher learning or state<u>accredited</u> career and

- 10 technical education program to apply toward the cost of registration, health, activities, board,-
- 11 books, and other necessary items of with a physical presence in this state. The scholarship may

12 be applied to tuition, fees, room and board, books and supplies, and other educational

13 <u>expenses</u> not to exceed six hundred sixty-seven dollars per quarter for three quarters, or

14 <u>clock-hour term</u> or one thousand dollars per semester for two semesters, Awards may not

15 <u>exceed two thousand dollars</u> in any academic year. The board for IndianNative American

16 scholarships may reduce the amount of any scholarship to accord with individual financial need

17 or funds available. After the enrolling institution or program has deducted the amount due such

18 institution, the remaining balance must be given to the recipient for necessary expenses during-

19 the quarter or semester. The board for Native American scholarships may set a priority

20 <u>application date.</u> At the beginning of each quarter, <u>clock-hour term</u>, or semester of a regular

21 academic year, the board for Indian scholarships shall certify to the director of the office of-

22 management and budget the name of each recipient and the amount payable, and the director-

23 of the office of management and budget shall issue a warrant to the state treasurer who shall-

24 pay the amount of the scholarship to the institution of higher learning or state career and

25 technical education program in which the recipient is enrolled. Renewal of the scholarship-

26 award is subject to the maintenance of a minimum grade average of "C" in the courses taken,

27 the North Dakota university system shall verify enrollment and other eligibility criteria set forth

28 by the state board for Native American scholarships for awarded applicants before issuing

29 payment to the enrolling institution. After the enrolling institution has deducted the amount due

30 to the institution, the remaining balance must be distributed to the awarded applicant for

31 <u>necessary expenses during the quarter, clock-hour term, or semester</u>.

# SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 15.1-21-02.6 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as 6 being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction a North Dakota 7 scholarship, a North Dakota academic scholarship, or a North Dakota career and 8 technical education scholarship in the amount of seven hundred fifty dollars for 9 each semester during which the student is enrolled full time at an accredited 10 institution of higher education with a physical presence in this state, maintains a 11 cumulative grade point average of 2.75, and maintains progress toward program 12 completion.
- 13 b. The state board of higher education shall provide to any student certified as 14 being eligible by the superintendent of public instruction a North Dakota 15 scholarship, a North Dakota academic scholarship, or a North Dakota career and 16 technical education scholarship in the amount of five hundred dollars for each 17 quarter or clock-hour term during which the student is enrolled full time at an 18 accredited institution of higher education with a physical presence in this state or 19 an accredited private career school with a physical presence in this state, 20 maintains a cumulative grade point average of 2.75, and maintains progress 21 toward program completion.
- 22 2. The state board shall monitor each scholarship recipient to ensure that the student
   23 meets the academic and other requirements of this section. Upon determining a
   24 recipient student has failed to meet the requirements of this section, the board shall
   25 provide notification to the student within ten business days.
- 26 3. A student is not entitled to receive more than six thousand dollars under this section.
- 27 4. The state board of higher education shall forward the scholarship directly to the28 institution in which the student is enrolled.
