- 1 A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
- 2 career and technical education; to provide an exemption; and to provide for a report.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds as may be necessary, are appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, and from special funds derived from federal funds and other income, to the department of career and technical education for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the department of career and technical education, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025, as follows:

15	SECTION 3. ESTIMATED INCOME - FEDERAL CORONAVIRUS CAPITAL PROJECTS					
16	FUND - STATEWIDE AREA CAREER CENTER INITIATIVE GRANT PROGRAM -					
17	LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT REPORT. The estimated income line item in section 1 of this					
18	Act includes the sum of \$26,500,000 from the federal coronavirus capital projects fund for the					
19	purpose of defraying inflationary costs of existing projects approved under the statewide area					
20	career center initiative grant program during the 2021-23 biennium. The department of career					
21	and technical education must distribute the funding to existing career academy projects			/ projects		
22	proportionally based on funding allocations provided to each project during the 2021-23					
23	biennium. If funding approved in this section is provided for a career academy project and the			project and the		
24	funding becomes uncommitted during the 2023-25 biennium, the department of career and			of career and		
25	technical education may redistribute the funding for existing projects under the program during					
26	the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The department of career and					
27	technical education shall report to the legislative management during the 2023-24 interim and to					
28	the appropriations committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly regarding the amount of					
29	inflationary funding provided for each project and the construction status of each project.					
30	SECTION 4. EXEMPTION - STATEWIDE AREA CAREER CENTER INITIATIVE GRANT					
31	PROGRAM. The amount of \$20,000	0,000 appropriated fr	om federal funds deriv	ed from the state		

- 1 fiscal recovery fund for the statewide area career center initiative grant program in section 1 of
- 2 chapter 548 of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws is not subject to section 54-44.1-11 and
- 3 is available for the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30,
- 4 2025.

5 SECTION 5. EXEMPTION - STATEWIDE AREA CAREER CENTER INITIATIVE GRANT

- 6 PROGRAM - UNCOMMITTED FUNDS. Notwithstanding section 1 of chapter 548 of the
- 7 2021 Special Session Session Laws, if funding approved for a career academy project under
- 8 the statewide area career center initiative grant program becomes uncommitted after
- 9 December 31, 2022, the department of career and technical education may redistribute the
- 10 funding for existing projects under the program during the biennium beginning July 1, 2023, and
- 11 ending June 30, 2025.

12 SECTION 6. WORKFORCE TRAINING GRANTS - SALARIES AND WAGES EXPENSES.

- 13 The workforce training line item in section 1 of this Act includes the sum of \$500,000 from the
- 14 general fund which the department of career and technical education shall distribute to each
- 15 eligible organization in the state dedicated to expanding workforce opportunities, training, and
- 16 education for the purpose of defraying salaries and wages expenses of the organization's
- 17 employees. The department of career and technical education shall distribute the funding

18 identified in this section as follows:

19	1.	An organization in the northwest region of the state	\$230,000
20	2.	An organization in the northeast region of the state	\$40,000
21	3.	An organization in the southwest region of the state	\$120,000
22	4.	An organization in the southeast region of the state	\$110,000
