ENGROSSED SENATE BILL NO. 2020

A BILL for an Act to provide an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the department of
water resources; to provide an appropriation to the parks and recreation department; to amend

3 and reenact section sections 61-02-01.3, 61-02-79, and 61-03-21.4 of the North Dakota Century

4 Code and section 4 of chapter 20 of the 2021 Session Laws, relating to a Bank of North Dakota

5 line of credit, water project economic analyses requirements, and state water commission

6 discretionary funding; to provide for a transfer; to provide for a report; to provide legislative

7 intent; to provide an exemption; and to declare an emergency.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

9 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. The funds provided in this section, or so much of the funds 10 as may be necessary, are appropriated from special funds derived from federal funds and other 11 income, to the department of water resources for the purpose of defraying the expenses of the 12 department of water resources, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and 13 ending June 30, 2025, as follows:

8 The 2023-25 one-time funding amounts are not a part of the entity's base budget for the 9 2025-27 biennium. The department of water resources shall report to the appropriations 10 committees of the sixty-ninth legislative assembly on the use of this one-time funding for the

11 period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025.

SECTION 3. ADDITIONAL INCOME - APPROPRIATION. In addition to the amounts included in the estimated income line item in section 1 of this Act, any additional amounts in the resources trust fund that become available are appropriated to the department of water resources for the purpose of defraying the expenses of that agency, excluding operatingexpenses and salaries and wagesproviding water supply grants and rural water supply grants, for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025. Any additional amounts must be allocated equally between water supply grants and rural water

19 supply grants.

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20 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - WATER PROJECTS STABILIZATION FUND - LOAN

21 **REPAYMENT - ONE-TIME FUNDING ITEM.** There is appropriated out of any moneys in the

22 water projects stabilization fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of

23 \$30,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to the department of water

24 resources for the purpose of repayment of loans issued by the Bank of North Dakota to the

25 western area water supply authority for the period beginning with the effective date of this Act,

- 26 and ending June 30, 2025. This funding is considered a one-time funding item.
 - SECTION 4. TRANSFER WATER PROJECT STABILIZATION FUND TO WATER
- 28 **INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING LOAN FUND.** The office of management and budget shall
- transfer \$30,000,000 from the water project stabilization fund to the water infrastructure
- revolving loan fund established under section 6-09-49.2, during the period beginning with the
- 31 effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025.

1	SECTION 5. TRANSFER - BANK OF NORTH DAKOTA PROFITS - WATER
2	INFRASTRUCTURE REVOLVING LOAN FUND. The Bank of North Dakota shall transfer
3	\$100,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, from its current earnings and
4	accumulated profits to the water infrastructure revolving loan fund during the biennium
5	beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2025. The moneys must be transferred as
6	requested by the director of the department of water resources, after consultation with the Bank
7	of North Dakota, to provide local cost-share loans for projects approved by the state water
8	commission pursuant to section 6-09-49.2.
9	SECTION 6. APPROPRIATION - PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT -
10	SOVEREIGN LANDS RECREATION USE GRANTS - ONE-TIME FUNDING. There is
11	appropriated from special funds derived from a grant from the state water commission, not
12	otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$3,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to
13	the parks and recreation department for the purpose of providing grants for developing
14	recreation opportunities on sovereign lands in the state, for the period beginning with the
15	effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025. An eligible grant recipient must identify \$1
16	of matching funds for each \$1 awarded pursuant to this section. This funding is considered to
17	be a one-time funding item.
18	SECTION 7. SOVEREIGN LANDS RECREATION USE GRANT. The water supply - grants
19	line item in section 1 of this Act includes \$3,000,000 from the resources trust fund which the
20	state water commission shall provide as a grant to the parks and recreation department for
21	developing recreation opportunities on sovereign lands in the state, for the period beginning
22	with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025.
23	SECTION 8. DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES DISCRETIONARY FUNDING. The
24	discretionary funding appropriated to the department of water resources in section 1 of this Act
25	may be used as necessary, except for salaries and wages, for the period beginning with the
26	effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025.
27	
28	REPORT TO LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT. Of the \$1,000,000 in the basinwide plan-
29	implementation line item in section 1 of this Act, up to \$1,000,000 may be used to provide
30	grants for the pilot project authorized in this section for the period beginning with the effective-
31	date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025. These funds are not subject to state water

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1	commission cost-share policies. Water resource districts and joint water resource districts in a		
2	basin may develop a basinwide water plan identifying water conveyance, flood control, and		
3	other water projects to be undertaken in the basin, and may jointly apply to the state water		
4	commission for a grant of up to \$1,000,000 for implementation of the plan. The state water		
5	commission may select a basinwide plan submitted under this section for funding and enter into-		
6	one cooperative agreement with the water resource districts and joint water resource districts		
7	that submitted the plan. The cooperative agreement must include the amount of funding the		
8	state water commission will provide, a prohibition on using funds granted for implementation of		
9	the plan for planning or any purpose other than implementation of the basinwide plan, and the		
10	obligations of the state water commission and each water resource district and joint water		
11	resource district in implementing the basinwide plan. The agreement also must provide for		
12	monitoring and oversight of the basinwide plan's implementation. The department of water-		
13	resources shall report to the legislative management on the results of this pilot project no later		
14	than August 1, 2024.		
15	SECTION 9. ESTIMATED INCOME - WATER PROJECTS STABILIZATION FUND. The		
16	total special funds line item in section 1 of this Act includes <u>\$120,000,000</u> <u>\$123,380,315</u> from the		
17	water projects stabilization fund for water supply grants for the period beginning with the		
18	effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025.		
19	SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 61-02-01.3 of the North Dakota Century Code is		
20	amended and reenacted as follows:		
21	61-02-01.3. Comprehensive water development plan.		
22	1. Biennially, the commission shall develop and maintain a comprehensive water		
23	development plan organized on a river basin perspective, including an inventory of		
24	future water projects for budgeting and planning purposes.		
25	2. As part of the commission's planning process, to facilitate local project sponsor		
26	participation and project prioritization and to assist in education regarding life cycle		
27	analyses for municipal water supply projects, and economic analyses for flood control		
28	and water conveyance projects only for those expected to cost more than one-		
29			
29	million <u>five hundred thousand</u> dollars, the commission shall develop a policy that		
29 30	millionfive hundred thousand dollars, the commission shall develop a policy that outlinespolicies and procedures for commissioner-hosted meetings within the upper		

1	Mouse River, Devils Lake, Little Missouri River, upper Heart River, and upper
2	Cannonball River drainage basins.
3	SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 61-02-79 of the North Dakota Century Code is
4	amended and reenacted as follows:
5	61-02-79. Bank of North Dakota - Line of credit.
6	The Bank of North Dakota shall extend a line of credit not to exceed fiftyone hundred million
7	dollars at a rate of one and one-half percent over the three month London interbank offered
8	rate, but may not exceed three percent to the state water commissionthe prevailing interest rate
9	charged to North Dakota government entities. The state water commissiondepartment of water
10	resources shall repay the line of credit from funds available in the resources trust fund, water-
11	development trust fund, or other funds, as appropriated by the legislative assembly. The state-
12	water commissiondepartment of water resources may access the line of credit, as necessary, to
13	provide funding as authorized by the legislative assembly<u>up to fifty million dollars</u> for the
14	northwest area water supply project and up to fifty million dollars for the southwest pipeline
15	project during the biennium beginning July 1, 2021 2023, and ending June 30, 2023 2025.
16	SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 61-03-21.4 of the North Dakota Century Code is
17	amended and reenacted as follows:
18	61-03-21.4. Economic analysis process required for certain projects.
19	The department of water resources shall develop an economic analysis process for water
20	conveyance projects and flood-related projects expected to cost more than one million five
21	hundred thousand dollars, and a life cycle analysis process for municipal water supply projects.
22	When the state water commission is considering whether to fund a water conveyance project,
23	flood-related project, or water supply project, the department of water resources shall review the
24	economic analysis or life cycle analysis, and inform the state water commission of the findings
25	from the analysis and review.
26	SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 4 of chapter 20 of the 2021 Session Laws is
27	amended and reenacted as follows:
28	SECTION 4. APPROPRIATION - RESOURCES TRUST FUND - STATE
29	WATER COMMISSION DISCRETIONARY FUNDING. There is appropriated out of
30	any moneys in the resources trust fund in the state treasury, not otherwise
31	appropriated, the sum of \$6,000,000, or so much of the sum as may be necessary, to

1	the state water commission for the purpose of providing discretionary funds for water
2	project grantsdepartment of water resources to be used as necessary except for
3	salaries and wages, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, and ending June 30,
4	2023. This funding is considered to be a one-time funding item.
5	SECTION 14. STATE WATER COMMISSION - RED RIVER WATER SUPPLY PROJECT
6	FUNDING - LEGISLATIVE INTENT. Excluding the funding provided for Red River water supply
7	projects prior to the 2023-25 biennium, the state water commission may not approve state
8	funding for the Red River water supply project in excess of a total of \$953,000,000 without
9	legislative approval. It is the intent of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly that of the
10	\$953,000,000, \$175,000,000 <u>\$180,000,000</u> is provided from the resources trust fund for the
11	period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025.
12	SECTION 15. STATE WATER COMMISSION - MOUSE RIVER FLOOD CONTROL
13	PROJECT FUNDING - LEGISLATIVE INTENT. Excluding the funding provided for Mouse River
14	flood control projects prior to the 2023-25 biennium, the state water commission may not
15	approve state funding for the Mouse River flood control project in excess of a total of
16	\$380,500,000 without legislative approval. It is the intent of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly
17	that of the \$380,500,000, \$76,100,000 is provided from the resources trust fund for the period
18	beginning with the effective date of this Act, and ending June 30, 2025.
19	SECTION 16. SOUTHWEST PIPELINE PROJECT FUNDING - LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It
20	is the intent of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly that the sixty-ninth legislative assembly
21	appropriate \$40,000,000 from the resources trust fund for the southwest pipeline project water
22	treatment plant for the biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027.
23	SECTION 17. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - STATE WATER COMMISSION - CITY OF
24	BISMARCK WATER TREATMENT PLANT. Excluding the funding provided for the city of
25	Bismarck water treatment plant prior to the 2023-25 biennium, it is the intent of the sixty-eighth
26	legislative assembly that up to \$50,000,000 of funding appropriated in the water supply - grants
27	line item in section 1 of this Act be made available during the 2023-25 biennium for the city of
28	Bismarck water treatment plant.
29	SECTION 18. LEGISLATIVE INTENT - CITY OF MEDORA WATER SUPPLY PROJECT. It
30	is the intent of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly that the city of Medora request funding from
31	the state water commission for water storage, water main replacement, and water supply

1	expansion projects after all agreements for the construction of the Theodore Roosevelt			
2	presidential library have been finalized between the library, the library foundation, the city of			
3	Medora, and Billings County.			
4	SECTION 19. MISSOURI RIVER EDUCATE, ADVOCATE, AND ENGAGE PROGRAM -			
5	LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the sixty-eighth legislative assembly that:			
6	1. Support be provided for the Missouri River educate, advocate, and engage effort			
7	conducted by the Missouri River joint water resource board;			
8	2. The effort is needed to secure the state's rights to Missouri River water; and			
9	3. The state water commission and the department of water resources work in			
10	cooperation with the Missouri River joint water resource board to provide financial and			
11	technical assistance as the commission deems appropriate.			
12	SECTION 20. DEPARTMENT OF WATER RESOURCES - GARRISON DIVERSION			
13	CONSERVANCY DISTRICT - LEGISLATIVE INTENT - REPORT. It is the intent of the			
14	sixty-eighth legislative assembly that the department of water resources, in coordination with			
15	the Garrison Diversion Conservancy District, research and identify options for the use of the			
16	Missouri River intake constructed near Washburn. The department of water resources shall			
17	report its findings and recommendations to the legislative management by October 1, 2024.			
18	SECTION 21. EXEMPTION - LINE ITEM TRANSFERS. The office of management and			
19	budget shall transfer up to \$13,292,362 between the operating expenses and capital assets line			
20	items in section 1 of this Act, during the period beginning with the effective date of this Act, and			
21	ending June 30, 2025, as requested by the director of the department of water resources. The			
22	director of the department of water resources shall notify the legislative council of any transfers			
23	made pursuant to this section.			
24	SECTION 22. EXEMPTION - GRANTS - APPLICATION - WATER-RELATED PROJECTS -			
25	CARRYOVER AUTHORITY. Section 54-44.1-11 does not apply to \$405,000,000 \$367,000,000			
26	for grants or water-related projects included in the capital assets, water supply - grants, rural			
27	water supply - grants, flood control projects, and general water - grants line items in section 1 of			
28	chapter 20 of the 2021 Session Laws, sections 5 and 6 of chapter 20 of the 2021 Session Laws,			
29	section 9 of chapter 80 of the 2021 Session Laws, and subdivision 3 of section 1 of chapter 550			
30	of the 2021 Special Session Session Laws. Any unexpended obligated and unobligated funds			
31	from these appropriations may be continued into the 2023-25 biennium. Any funds continued			

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- 1 may be expended only for the purpose for which it was originally appropriated. The department
- 2 of water resources may seek emergency commission and budget section approval under
- 3 section 54-16-04.2 to increase carryover spending authority of funds appropriated in the
- 4 2021-23 biennium into the 2023-25 biennium.
- 5 **SECTION 23. EMERGENCY.** This Act is declared to be an emergency measure.
