1	A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota
2	Century Code, relating to COVID-19 vaccinations and experimentalemergency-use authorized
3	vaccines for students at institutions of higher education; and to amend and reenact subsection 1
4	of section 23-07-17.1 and section 23-12-20 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to
5	school and day care immunizations and COVID-19 vaccination and infection information.

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and enacted as follows:

COVID-19 and experimentalemergency-use authorized vaccinations - Limitations.

- 1. An institution under the control of the state board of higher education may not:
 - a. Require a student to be vaccinated against severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, identified as SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) or receive an experimentalemergency-use authorized vaccine, as a condition of enrollment or in-person attendance.
 - b. Promote student vaccination against COVID-19 or receipt of an experimentalemergency-use authorized vaccine.
- 2. As used in this section, "experimental vaccine" means a vaccine approved by the United States food and drug administration which does not meet each of the following criteria:
 - a. The pivotal clinical trial the United States food and drug administration relied on to approve the vaccine evaluated the safety of the vaccine for at least one year after the vaccine was administered against a control group that received either a placebo or another vaccine that meets the criteria under this subsection.

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- b. The department of health and human services has posted on the department's website the injuries or diseases caused by the vaccine and the rate at which the injury or disease occurs from the vaccine.
- c. The department of health and human services has determined the risk of permanent disability or death from the vaccine has been proven to be less than the risk caused by the infection the vaccine is intended to prevent.
- d. The vaccine's manufacturer has liability, including for design defect claims, for any death or injury caused by the vaccine.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 23-07-17.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

A child may not be admitted to any public, private, or parochial school, or day care center, child care facility, head start program, or nursery school operating in this state or be supervised through home-based instruction unless the child's parent or guardian presents to the institution authorities a certification from a licensed physician or authorized representative of the department of health and human services that the child has received age-appropriate immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, measles, rubella (German measles), mumps, hepatitis B, haemophilus influenza type b (Hib), varicella (chickenpox), poliomyelitis, pneumococcal disease, meningococcal disease, rotovirus, and hepatitis A. The immunizations required under this section do not include the severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, identified as SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19), vaccine. Any political subdivision, school, department, or institution of higher education shall differentiate between recommended and required vaccination on any form. An immunization listed under this subsection is not required if the immunization is provided by an experimentalemergency-use authorized vaccine. In the case of a child receiving home-based instruction, the child's parent or legal guardian shall file the certification with the public school district in which the child resides. As used in this subsection, "experimental vaccine" means a vaccine approved by the United States food and drugadministration which does not meet each of the following criteria: The pivotal clinical trial the United States food and drug administration relied on

11	SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 23-12-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is					
12	amended and reenacted as follows:

- 2. Subsection 1 does not apply to the department of corrections and rehabilitation, a correctional facility as defined under section 12-44.1-01, the state hospital, or a public health unit.
- a patron, client, or customer in this state to provide any documentation certifying COVID-19 vaccination, the presence of COVID-19 pathogens, antigens, or antibodies, or COVID-19 post-transmission recovery to gain access to, entry upon, or services from the business. This subsection does not apply to a developmental disability residential facility or a health care provider, including a long-term care provider, basic care provider, and assisted living provider. As used in this subsection, a private business does not include a nonprofit entity that does not sell a product or a service.
- 4. This section may not be construed to interfere with an individual's rights to access that individual's own personal health information or with a person's right to access personal health information of others which the person otherwise has a right to access.
- 5. Subsection 1 is not applicable to the state board of higher education, the university system, or institutions under the control of the state board of higher education to the extent the entity has adopted policies and procedures governing the type of documentation required, the circumstances under which such documentation may be shared, and exemptions from providing such documentation.
- 6. This section is not applicable during a public health disaster or emergency declared in accordance with chapter 37-17.1.
- 7. As used in this section, the term "COVID-19" means severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 identified as SARS-CoV-2 and any mutation or viral fragments of SARS-CoV-2.
