1	A BILL for an Act to <del>create and enact a new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota</del>
2	Century Code, relating to COVID-19 vaccinations and emergency-use authorized vaccines for
3	students at institutions of higher education; and to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section
4	23-07-17.1 and section 23-12-20 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to school and day
5	care immunizations and COVID-19 vaccination and infection information.

## 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NORTH DAKOTA:

7	SECTION 1. A new section to chapter 15-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is created and		
8	enacted as follows:		
9	COVID-19 and emergency-use authorized vaccinations - Limitations.		
10	1. An institution under the control of the state board of higher education may not:		
11	a. Require a student to be vaccinated against severe acute respiratory syndrome		
12	coronavirus 2, identified as SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19) or receive an		
13	emergency-use authorized vaccine, as a condition of enrollment or in-person		
14	attendance.		
15	<u>b.</u> <u>Promote student vaccination against COVID-19 or receipt of an emergency-use</u>		
16	authorized vaccine.		
17	SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 23-07-17.1 of the North Dakota		
18	Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:		
19	1. A child may not be admitted to any public, private, or parochial school, or day care		
20	center, child care facility, head start program, or nursery school operating in this state-		
21	or be supervised through home-based instruction unless the child's parent or guardiar		
22	presents to the institution authorities a certification from a licensed physician or		
23	authorized representative of the department of health and human services that the

child has received age-appropriate immunization against diphtheria, pertussis, tetanus, measles, rubella (German measles), mumps, hepatitis B, haemophilus influenza type b (Hib), varicella (chickenpox), poliomyelitis, pneumococcal disease, meningococcal disease, rotovirus, and hepatitis A. The immunizations required under this section do not include the severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2, identified as SARS-CoV-2 (COVID-19), vaccine. Any political subdivision, school, department, or institution of higher education shall differentiate between recommended and required vaccination on any form. An immunization listed under this subsection is not required if the immunization is provided by an emergency-use authorized vaccine. In the case of a child receiving home-based instruction, the child's parent or legal guardian shall file the certification with the public school district in which the child resides.

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Section 23-12-20 of the North Dakota Century Code is amended and reenacted as follows:

## 23-12-20. COVID-19 vaccination and infection information. (Repealed effective August 1, <del>2023</del>2025)

- Neither a state government entity nor any of its political subdivisions, agents, or assigns may:
  - a. Require documentation, whether physical or electronic, for the purpose of certifying or otherwise communicating the following before providing access to property, funds, or services:
    - (1) An individual's COVID-19 vaccination status;
    - (2) The presence of COVID-19 pathogens, antigens, or antibodies; or
    - (3) An individual's COVID-19 post-transmission recovery status;
  - Otherwise publish or share an individual's COVID-19 vaccination record or similar health information, except as specifically authorized by the individual or otherwise authorized by statute; or
  - c. Require a private business to obtain documentation, whether physical or electronic, for purposes of certifying or otherwise communicating the following before employment or providing access to property, funds, or services based on:

This section may not be construed to interfere with an individual's rights to access that 18 individual's own personal health information or with a person's right to access personal 19 health information of others which the person otherwise has a right to access. 20 5. Subsection 1 is not applicable to the state board of higher education, the university 21 system, or institutions under the control of the state board of higher education to the 22 extent the entity has adopted policies and procedures governing the type of 23 documentation required, the circumstances under which such documentation may be 24 shared, and exemptions from providing such documentation. 25 6. This section is not applicable during a public health disaster or emergency declared in
